### Upstate road work underway

K & S Markers, Inc. recently started work on various routes throughout the Interstates in the Counties of Laurens, Spartanburg, Greenville, Greenville Tolls, Anderson Cherokee, Oconee, Chester, Fairfield, Richland, York, Lexington, and Newberry. The work will consist of replacing the raised pavement markers in middle of roadways. Very little traffic backups are expected but the public should still use caution and be aware when driving throughout roadways. Crews will work seven days a week and lasting up to six weeks, weather permitting.

### Halkett named Coach of the Year, seven Spartans earn All-Conference Honors

USC Upstate men's soccer head coach Scott Halkett has been named the Big South Men's Soccer Coach of the Year, announced last week by the league. Additionally, seven Spartans earned All-Conference recognition.

This is Coach Halkett's first Big South Coach of the Year honor, and it comes after the Spartans finished the regular season tied for second with a 6-3-1 record and a 6-1-1 slate in Big South play. Those six wins are the most conference wins in Upstate's Division I history, and the second-most overall wins in the DI era.

The All-Conference team is voted on by the league's head coaches and features three forwards, four midfielders, four defenders, one goalkeeper and one at-large spot on each team, plus five honorable mention honorees regardless of position. Senior forward Pol Monells and sophomore midfielder Pascal Corvino each earned a spot on the First-Team All-Conference. Freshman forward Jeremy Montero and sophomore defender Hayden Anderson were each named to the Second-Team All-Conference, while Montero also landed a spot on the All-Freshman Team. Paul Bobai earned Honorable Mention All-Conference recognition, and defender Elias Ehlin joined Montero on the All-Freshman Team.

Additionally, Mario Arrocha earned a spot on the Big South All-Academic Team, which consists of one student-athlete from each institution that meets the criteria and is nominated and selected by the Big South's sports information directors.

## Spartanburg Community College awarded NSF grant for new data analytics technician program

The National Science Foundation has awarded Spartanburg Community College \$592,598 through an Advanced Technological Education Grant to create a data analytics technician program. The new program addresses the Upstate's critical need for data analytics technicians by collaborating with industry leaders to design a curriculum preparing students with the knowledge, skills, and abilities needed to be successful in this rapidly growing field.

Because data analytics technicians often work remotely, SCC's curriculum will be designed to maximize remote and flexible learning opportunities. The program also focuses on recruiting and supporting women who may benefit from remote job opportunities since women are underrepresented in STEM careers.

Marcia Schenck, SCC department chair, computer, and engineering technology program, and Renee Cramer, SCC department chair, business technology program, will lead the project as the principal investigator and co-principal investigator accordingly.

"We are thrilled that this grant will provide new opportunities for students to enter high demand, high-paying science, technology, engineering and math careers," explained Schenck. "Through the grant, we will also offer multiple student support services, such as career coaching and laptops on loan, that will offset common barriers that community college students encounter."

According to Cramer, "Businesses recognize the value of having employees who can not only retrieve

data but can also interpret and organize it quickly into meaningful information within an operational context. This provides companies with a competitive advantage. Local employers are excited about this new program, and that equates to even more opportunities for our students."

The ATE program focuses on educating technicians for high-technology fields that drive our nation's economy. The program also supports partnerships between academic institutions and industry to promote improvement in the education of science and engineering.

The National Science Foundation is an independent federal agency that supports fundamental research and education across all fields of science and engineering.

## City council approves loan financing agreement for Southside grocery store

After 18 months with no nearby grocery store option, an end to the Southside food desert is now visible after Spartanburg City Council voted unanimously to approve a measure granting \$300,000 to the City of Spartanburg Development Corporation to be loaned to the grocery operation. The City will additionally back a \$600,000 loan by the Mary Black Foundation.

Though the store's brand name has yet to be announced, City Manager Chris Story laid out some features future grocery shoppers can expect, including an in-store hot and cold prepared food deli, a branded in-store coffee shop, branded in-store made-to-order pizza, and the potential inclusion of pharmacy services if a pharmacy operator can be identified. Story also added that the store's operator is a well-experienced grocery industry profes-

sional and that store ownership will meet regularly with a Community Advisory Committee composed of Southside residents.

The City Manager explained to Council that while a worst case scenario would leave the City on the hook for all \$900,000, he considers that outcome extremely unlikely, adding that the City and its partners expect strong performance for the store which would allow the project to transition to conventional financing in five years.

The City Council also voted 4-3 to keep the section of W Main Street in front of Morgan Square (between Church and Magnolia Streets) closed until August, allowing expanded downtown dining and activity to continue in the space through the summer. Mayor Junie White and Council members Rob Rain and Jamie Fulmer voted against.

While the street remains closed, City staff is expecting to gather survey

data from downtown businesses and residents as well as those who visit downtown regularly to gauge overall perception of the closure during the spring and summer months as the pandemic wanes.

City Council also voted unanimously to approve a development agreement for a new mixed-use gathering place along the Mary Black Foundation Rail Trail near its intersection with Marion Ave. Fretwell Partners, a group of local business people who have acquired several properties between the rail trail and Union Street around Fretwell Street, is planning to redevelop the former industrial area.

Fretwell envisions a multiphase project which would be centered around an outdoor gathering space. The \$2.4 million first phase includes a stage for live music and one of three planned new buildings, which would be a new home for Little River Roasting Company, a successful local coffee business.

## Welcome spring with fresh artichokes

Artichokes are strange and lovely. It's a thistle, a flower and its pale green blossoms are one of the first signs of spring. Artichokes are in season, so it's time to go to the market and get some thorny deliciousness for yourself.

Artichokes may be a food you already think you know, stripped down to its heart and frozen and packaged in a box, a jar or a can. The wonderful thing about artichokes is that they are delicious in all their forms. But if you've never had the chance to buy them in their full, sculptural beauty, fresh off the plant, mature or tender and young, then you are missing something special.

The artichoke is a member of the cardoon family, which is native to the Mediterranean, and cultivation began there as early as the ninth century. The plant likes mild, dry climates, and in the United States it seems to like California's central valley almost exclusively. Being what it is, which is a leafy flower, it is a great source of fiber. It's also high in vitamin C and magnesium.

If you live in California, you've probably had the opportunity to savor a fresh artichoke. However, the artichoke might be a little exotic to the rest of us. The big round globe, with all its layers, might seem a little intimidating. What to do with it? What is edible, and what is not?

Use fresh artichokes within a few days of purchasing. You may want to trim off the prickly points of the leaves before preparing them. Surprisingly, most of the artichoke flower is edible. The only exceptions are the more fibrous end of the stem (although the upper part of the stem is very good) and the fuzzy center, or beard of the flower, called the "choke." This part of the large, mature artichoke is not edible.

There are many tasty and attractive ways to prepare fresh artichokes. Large heads are delicious stuffed and roasted. Or artichokes can be steamed and the leaves removed and served for dipping into any sauce your imagination can dream up. Once the "choke" is removed, the hollowed-out core can be used as a serving dish for salads or soups. Small, young artichokes don't need to have the fibrous center choke removed, and it can be cooked and eaten whole.

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# Around the Upstate

## 2022 Bassmaster Classic will be held at Lake Hartwell

Birmingham, Ala. - The world's most prestigious professional bass tournament will be returning next year to the site of some of the best moments in the sport's famed history.

B.A.S.S. officials, along with Visit Anderson and VisitGreenvilleSC recently announced that the 2022 Academy Sports + Outdoors Bassmaster Classic presented by Huk will be held for the fourth time at scenic Lake Hartwell, March 4 - 6, with takeoffs from Green Pond Landing & Event Center. Daily weigh-ins will be held at the Bon Secours Wellness Arena and the annual Bassmaster Classic Outdoors Expo will take place at the Greenville Convention Center, both of which are in nearby Greenville.

B.A.S.S. CEO Bruce Akin said the organization is excited to once again visit a venue that has become the gold standard for professional bass fishing events.

"Everything about Lake Hartwell and the city of Greenville make them the perfect setting for the Super Bowl of Professional Bass Fishing," Akin said. "The Bassmaster Classic is not only a

chance for the best anglers in the world to showcase their abilities, it's an annual celebration of the sport itself.

"Lake Hartwell provides the perfect site for amazing competition, and the city of Greenville provides the hotels, restaurants and other facilities you need for an event the size of the Classic."

Hartwell is a 56,000-acre man-made reservoir situated between Georgia and South Carolina and encompassing portions of the Savannah, Tugaloo and Seneca rivers. It features a vast array of habitat and a good population of both largemouth and spotted bass that are likely to be in the prespawn phase when the Classic competitors arrive.

The fishery has hosted three previous Classics that each provided action-packed finishes.

In 2008, Texas pro Alton Jones Sr. went into the final day with little more than a pound lead, but managed to hold off the rest of the field and claim his only Classic trophy. In 2015, when temperatures dipped as low as a frigid 9 degrees, hometown favorite Casey Ashley of South Carolina came from

behind on the final day to win his only title. Then in 2018, young Alabama pro Jordan Lee jumped from sixth place on the final day to win his second-straight Classic.

The fans turned out in droves for all three visits, creating an electric atmosphere for the weigh-ins and packing the Expo all three days.

"The Upstate of South Carolina is thrilled to welcome the Bassmaster Classic back to Lake Hartwell for the fourth time since initially hosting back in 2008," said David Montgomery, Vice President of Sales for VisitGreenvilleSC. "Not only has the Classic set attendance records each year it has returned, but it has proven to be one of our

largest economic impact events for the Greenville region."

In 2018, a then-record crowd of 143,323 fans attended all of the Classic-related events. That Classic won a Sports Destination Management Innovation in Sports Tourism award for its ability to have two destinations working together for such a large economic impact.

"We are very excited for the opportunity to host the Bassmaster Classic once again on Lake Hartwell," said Neil Paul, Executive Director of Visit Anderson. "The leadership of Anderson County has made a significant commitment to Green Pond Landing and the marketing efforts of Lake Hartwell, and we

expect another record-breaking event with our teammates from Greenville.

"Hosting our fourth Bassmaster Classic on Lake Hartwell is significant to our community because no other fishery will have hosted more Bassmaster Classic events. Having hosted this great event in the past, we can speak firsthand to the significant economic impact it will have on the Upstate of South Carolina and the impact of residual tourism that will be felt in Anderson County for years to come."

Since the 2018 Classic, Hartwell has hosted several other high-level B.A.S.S. events, including a 2019 Bassmaster Elite Series tournament that was won by South Carolina pro Brandon Cobb. Just last year, another South Carolina pro, Patrick Walters, won the Basspro.com Bassmaster Eastern Open on Lake Hartwell.

Most recently, Hartwell hosted a Bassmaster College Series tournament that was won by Carson Newman University anglers Ben Cully and Hayden Gaddis with a two-day total of 35 pounds, 10 ounces. In two

days, a giant field of 261 teams caught just over 4,536 pounds of bass.

The 2022 Classic will feature 55 qualifiers who will earn their berths through the Elite Series, the Opens, the TNT Fireworks B.A.S.S. Nation circuit, the Carhart Bassmaster College Series presented by Bass Pro Shops and the Bassmaster Team Championship plus the defending Bassmaster Classic champion and winner of the final Elite Series event of the 2021 season. They will compete in the no-entry fee event for their share of a whopping \$1 million purse, with the champion earning \$300,000.

"Since its inception, the Classic has been a tournament that changes lives," said B.A.S.S. Chairman Chase Anderson. "The payday is great, sure. But the opportunity to refer to yourself as 'Bassmaster Classic champion' for the rest of your life — there's no greater clout in our sport."

The Bassmaster Classic is being hosted locally by Visit Anderson and VisitGreenvilleSC.

## SBA awards \$1.8 million grant to the South Carolina Small Business Development Centers

Columbia - The U.S. Small Business Administration renewed its \$1.8 million annual grant to the South Carolina Small Business Development Center Network in March. As a responsible steward of this funding, the SC SBDC will leverage it to sustain the network's infrastructure of 20 Area Centers located throughout the state's 46 counties and the 50 consultants and staff working to advance South Carolina's economic development by helping entrepreneurs grow successful businesses. The award also helps underwrite the cost of office space, equipment, supplies, telecommunications equipment and other operating expenses.

"We are very grateful to our SBDC partners for equipping South Carolina entrepreneurs with the tools they need to start, grow, expand, and recover," said Gregg White, District Director for the South Carolina District Office. "This past year, the SC SBDC network assisted over 22,000 clients in the state! They helped start 143 new businesses, and

created and retained almost 4,000 jobs in South Carolina. They are a vital asset to the economic growth in our state, and to our district office."
