City of Spartanburg COVID-19 response

In accordance with the South Carolina Governor's Executive Order on March 31, and in concurrence with City Council's affirmation of that order and the City of Spartanburg's intent to enforce it made on April 2:

- All City of Spartanburg residents are asked to stay at home unless traveling for essentials or engaging in individual recreation.

- When leaving the home, all city residents should maintain a safe social distance of at least six feet at all times between themselves and others.

- City Police are empowered to disperse public gatherings of more than three people. Please dial (864) 594-7208 or send an email to socialdistancing@cityofspartanburg.org to report any gatherings on public property to the Spartanburg Police Department.

Evangel Road westbound closure at I-85 Business northbound ramp

Evangel Road at the I-85 Northbound on ramp will be closed permanently on April 13th. Detour signage will be in place at the time of the closure. This is part of an SCDOT safety project for the Falling Creek Road and Evangel Road intersection.

Evangel Road will ultimately become a cul-de sac at this location.

SC Forestry Commission issues statewide burning ban

Columbia - The South Carolina Forestry Commission declared a State Forester's Burning Ban for all counties, effective on April 7.

A State Forester's Burning Ban prohibits outdoor burning anywhere outside of city/town limits in South Carolina, including:

- * yard debris burns;
- * forestry, wildlife or agricultural burns (also known as prescribed, or controlled, burns); and
- * campfires and other types of recreational open burning.

After consultation with officials with the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control, State Forester Scott Phillips ordered the statewide burning ban in the interest of public safety amid the current public health threat posed by COVID-19 virus.

Not only can smoke exacerbate the symptoms of those who have contracted the virus, but it also can trigger underlying respiratory issues in otherwise unaffected individuals, which could result in symptoms similar to those the COVID-19 virus is known to cause.

The ban will stay in effect until further notice, which will come in the form of an official announcement from the Forestry Commission.

Non-essential businesses in South Carolina temporarily closed

Columbia - In response to the announced temporary closure of non-essential businesses in the state, S.C. Commerce has expanded its online resources to assist companies in navigating the impacts of coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

Gov. Henry McMaster issued Executive Order 2020-17, directing the temporary closure of non-essential businesses, including venues, facilities, services and activities for public use, throughout the state to combat the spread of COVID-19.

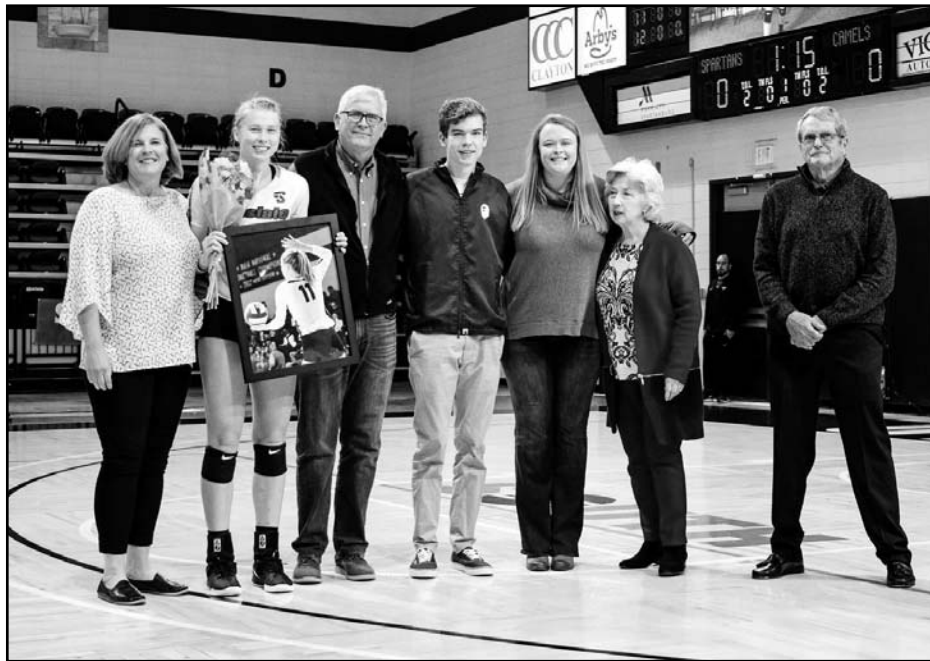

USDA extends ReConnect application deadline to April 15

Washington - U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Deputy Under Secretary for Rural Development Bette Brand recently announced that USDA has extended the deadline for ReConnect Pilot Program applications to April 15.

"In light of the COVID-19 National Emergency, USDA is extending the application deadline for round two of ReConnect Pilot Program funding to give rural businesses, cooperatives, and communities extra time to apply for this critical assistance that will help bring high-speed broadband connectivity to rural communities," Brand said. "Under the leadership of President Trump and Agriculture Secretary Perdue, USDA has made deploying this critical infrastructure in rural America a top priority, because when rural America thrives, all of America thrives."

The mother-daughter connection

For most athletes the day of their Hall of Fame induction ceremony is one that is filled with happiness, joy, and all around tranquility; with the exception of a little stress over the acceptance speech, of course. Former USC Upstate (Spartanburg) volleyball player and current Hall of Famer Angie Gambrell-Russell found the day of the induction ceremony a bit more stressful than usual as her youngest daughter Emily was playing in a volleyball tournament across town the same day as her induction ceremony.

"The day of the induction ceremony was insane," Gambrell-Russell said. "Emily had a volleyball tournament across town and we spent most of the time at the volleyball tournament. I remember we rushed over to campus and changed in the car prior to the ceremony. It was a full circle moment for me to watch my daughter play the sport we love and then get inducted the Hall of Fame."

For the Russell family volleyball was more than just a game. It was a way of life. Both Gambrell-Russell and her former husband Patrick played volleyball, and they passed their love of the game down to their children. Emily noted, "Growing up, my mother was a middle school coach, and I remember running around the gym during practice." Gambrell-Russell added, "I was the first coach both Emily and her sister Katy had, I never stopped coaching them. In fact, I told both of them that if either of them topped my 31 kills in a match, I would take them on any trip that they wanted."

However, volleyball was not the first sport either fell in love with. Gambrell-Russell initially came to USC Upstate to play basketball. Legendary coach Dr. Joe Bowman persuaded Gambrell-Russell away from basketball and suggested that she give volleyball a try. "Coach Bowman taught me how to play and love the sport of volleyball, for that I thank him," Gambrell-Russell said. As for Emily, it was the feel of a soccer ball beneath her feet. Emily played compet-

itive soccer for eight years, and competed on an all-boys soccer team into her middle school years.

After playing both soccer and volleyball her freshman year of high school, Emily decided to concentrate on just volleyball for the remainder of high school. "I truly loved the sport of volleyball and I enjoyed hearing the crowd after a big kill or block," Emily said. While in high school, she was a member of four conference championship teams, two at Rock Hill High School and two at A.C. Reynolds High School. Emily reset the school record for kills in a season at A.C. Reynolds with 354 kills her junior year and 394 kills in her senior season. She was a two-time All-Mountain Conference selection and a two time All-Western North Carolina honoree.

When it came time to start choosing colleges, however, Emily did not want to go to USC Upstate. "I wanted to pave my own path and not have to live up to the expectations my mother set while playing at USC Spartanburg."

While at USC Spartanburg, Gambrell-Russell was a part of 134 victories and three-straight NAIA District Six Championship teams from 1987-89. Despite playing almost 30 years ago, she still owns the all-time single game school record with 31 kills against High Point as a senior in 1989. On the defensive side, she still owns the program's all-time records with 516 total blocks and 266 solo blocks in her four-year career. Gambrell-Russell is second all-time with 250 assisted blocks as well. She is fourth all-time with 1,639 points, fifth with 1,148 kills and seventh with 1,095 digs.

As Gambrell-Russell reminisced on her days at USC Spartanburg, she most fondly remembered her days on the practice court and competing alongside her teammates. Gambrell-Russell also mentioned the fun trip they had to Hawaii for Nationals during her senior season.

Ultimately, Emily choose to attend Towson out of high school. While at Towson Emily appeared in

eight matches before earning a redshirt season. Following her freshman year at Towson, she reopened her recruiting process and ended up checking off all the boxes at USC Upstate. "It was great having her comeback and play at USC Upstate," Gambrell-Russell said. "I was able to come and watch her games in person more."

While at USC Upstate, Emily made the most of her opportunities in both her junior and senior seasons. In 2018, Emily was named an honorable mention All-Big South performer. One year later, she led the conference in hitting percentage (.258), 6th in kills per set (2.47) and 9th in total points (831.0). On the defensive side, she ranks fourth in Division I school history in block solos (52), 6th in block assists (190), 4th in total blocks (242) and 2nd in blocks per set (0.93). Russell's 11 total blocks against Georgia Southern in 2018 set a new school record in the Division I era.

Both were able to look back and remember all the great memories they had at USC Upstate. For Emily she is looking forward to graduating and starting a career in the marketing field. Gambrell-Russell finished by saying, "The sport of volleyball has given both of us so many great memories over the years. I'm not sure what I will do without volleyball next year. It's been a long journey, but it's been great getting to watch my daughter grow as a person and a player over the years."

Handling the stress of the current health crisis

The coronavirus disease (COVID-19) has created high levels of stress and fear for many of us. The anxiety that a disease such as this can bring on can seem overwhelming to many people but learning to cope with and manage that stress is important for every one of us.

While we all have different reactions to stressful situations, there are ways for most people to reduce the negative effects that the stress of a crisis can have for us and those around us.

As you might expect, fear and anxiety over this disease is highest for those most at risk. This can include older people and those with chronic diseases and other underlying health issues putting them at higher risk. But stress can also be high for those whose work requires them to deal directly with the disease and those suffering from it. This includes not only doctors and other health care providers, but first responders as well.

The effects of stress that an infectious disease outbreak can bring on include not merely worrying about your own health and the health of those close to you, but also the changes it may bring to your life. You may find you're experiencing changes in eating or sleeping patterns. Everyday issues or simply concentrating may be more difficult to handle. Excessive stress can lead to a worsening of chronic health issues and may lead some to increased use of alcohol, tobacco or other drugs. Those with pre-existing mental health conditions may find themselves facing new or worsening symptoms.

It's important to pay attention to high stress levels in your life and to try to reduce their effects as best you can. One starting point is to simply take breaks from all the news stories and social media reporting of the pandemic. Constantly reading or hearing about the issue only amplifies the stress you're already feeling.

It's also important to stay physically and mentally healthy. Eat regular, well-balanced, healthy meals. Get plenty of exercise (maybe your gym is closed, but the great outdoors offers plenty of opportunities for walks), stay well rested and avoid drugs and alcohol. Make time to relax, maybe reading books or watching favorite TV shows. Stay in contact with others using the phone or texting if self-isolating is being practiced.

If you find your stress is overwhelming, call your health provider. Stay in control and you'll get through this.

Around the Upstate

IRS - Criminal Investigation warns of possible COVID-19/Economic Impact payment scams

Charleston – The Treasury Department and the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will begin distributing COVID-19 Economic Impact Payments in the next few weeks. IRS – Criminal Investigation and the United States Attorney’s Office in the District of South Carolina warned South Carolina taxpayers today to be alert about possible scams relating to these payments as well as other malicious attempts to defraud people relating to the COVID-19 pandemic.

For most Americans, the Economic Impact Payment will be distributed automatically and will result in a direct deposit into the bank account designated by their 2018 or 2019 federal tax return. For eligible recipients who have traditionally received tax refunds via paper check, they will receive their economic impact payment in this manner as well. The IRS will calculate and automatically send the Economic Impact Payment with no action required by most eligible recipients.

The IRS will not contact you to ask you to pay a fee or confirm personal information prior to receiving the Economic Impact Payment. If you receive a phone call, text, or email asking for payment or confirmation of personal or financial information, it is a scam. Do not give out your bank account, debit account or PayPal account information, even if the caller claims it is necessary to get your check or that by doing so you can receive your payment faster.

Additionally, don’t click on links in texts or emails relating to Economic Impact Payments, as this could allow scammers to place tracing devices on your electronic devices and gain access to your personal information for later use. Don’t engage with scammers or thieves, simply hang up or delete texts/emails. It will take a few weeks before the Treasury sends the Economic Impact Payments. If you receive a “check” for an odd amount, for instance \$1,322.48, or a check that requires you to verify the check online or by calling a number, it is a fraud. Matthew D. Line, Special Agent in Charge of the IRS-CI Charlotte Field Office, made the following statement today in an effort to prevent taxpayers in need from being victimized by criminals using the recently approved payments as an opportunity to commit a crime, “I urge the public not to fall victim to fraudsters attempting to steal Economic Impact

Payments being sent out. The IRS will not call, text, email or otherwise contact you to ask for your personal information. This money is meant to help mitigate the enormous financial impact COVID-19 has had on the American public and businesses. Don’t fall victim to scammers.”

In addition to the warnings issued by IRS-Criminal Investigation, the Department of Justice (DOJ) is also actively formulating an investigative and legal response to fraud relating to COVID-19. United States Attorney’s Offices have developed task forces and appointed Coronavirus Fraud Coordinators to: serve as the legal counsel for the federal judicial district on matters relating to the Coronavirus, direct the prosecution of Coronavirus-related crimes, and to conduct outreach and awareness activities.

District of South Carolina U.S. Attorney Peter M. McCoy, Jr. noted that his office and the Department of Justice would make this fraud a priority. “In these extraordinary times, criminals are taking advantage of the most vulnerable Americans through various COVID-19 phony schemes,” said McCoy. “The District of South Carolina, and the Department of Justice, will stay vigilant and will prosecute those who engage in COVID-19 fraud and other related scams.” Some examples of these schemes include:

- Individuals and businesses selling fake cures for COVID-19 online and engaging in other forms of fraud.
- Phishing emails from entities posing as the

World Health Organization or the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

- Malicious websites and apps that appear to share Coronavirus-related information to gain and lock access to your devices until payment is received.
- Seeking donations fraudulently for illegitimate or non-existent charitable organizations.

In these uncertain and trying times, we need to stay strong and stand together united in purpose. Don’t become a victim by allowing criminals to exploit your emotions. Stay vigilant and tell your family, friends and neighbors about these scams.

The power of collaboration: South Carolina’s Humimic Medical arming healthcare workers for the COVID-19 war

Greenville – As a growing number of healthcare workers join the front lines to battle the global COVID-19 pandemic, or coronavirus, here in America there is critical need for basic personal protective equipment (PPE) to protect them – PPE which is now in short supply in many areas across America.

And South Carolina entrepreneurs and industry leaders are stepping up in unprecedented ways to protect these first responders and to defeat the global pandemic.

With help from Deborah Herbert, President of Multiplastics in Mt. Pleasant, the company had plans and suppliers in place in less than 48 hours to deliver 80,000+ face shields over the next few weeks.

“As we sat around the table during a team meeting last week, we found ourselves asking each other how we can help,” said Edwards. “We knew we had to make something happen fast to make a dif-

ference, because healthcare workers don’t need something 3-4 weeks from now, they need it now.”

The Humimic team picked up drafting pencils and phones to devise a plan they could execute quickly, and had designs and suppliers lined up within one day and working prototypes ready to scale up 24 hours later.

The speed and agility demonstrated by Humimic Medical is not only a testament to the company’s ability to pivot and respond to market needs,

but also showcases the rich, collaborative ecosystem that has emerged within South Carolina.

Edwards was able to leverage relationships with physicians in a nearby health system to validate the design, tap vendor and supplier relationships through South Carolina’s Department of Commerce, and gain key insights and connections through groups like SCBIO, the South Carolina Biotechnology Industry Organization, which serves as the life science community’s

catalyst for building, advancing and growing the industry.

Added SCBIO President and CEO Sam Konduros, whose team was able to rapidly connect Humimic with key contacts to deliver the new face shields where they are needed most, “We continue to live our mission of being the life sciences industry con-

vener, and that’s more important than ever right now.”

“SCBIO has been a tremendous asset in this process” said Edwards. “Their team has walked right alongside of ours to ensure we maximize this opportunity to serve our front-line healthcare workers.”

He also hinted that

Humimic Medical isn’t stopping with face shields either, as they work to develop other key supplies in short supply including a novel nasal swab and innovative re-usable face masks.

“The need is great, and we’re committed to making a difference during this time of need,” he added.

People in South Carolina warned to be on their guard as telephone scammers set out to cash in on Coronavirus

People in South Carolina are being warned to be extra vigilant as scam callers are likely to ramp up their activity over the next few weeks to take advantage of increasing amounts of people being at home due to the current Coronavirus outbreak.

CPR Call Blocker, makers of the US's best-selling call blocking device, is predicting that scammers and fraudsters will be ready to strike and take advantage of the situation as more states go into lockdown, forcing people to stay at home, and is warning people in South Carolina to be on their guard for a rise in bogus calls.

In a bid to beat the scammers who are likely to take advantage of this extraordinary situation, CPR Call Blocker has compiled the top five active scams that people in South Carolina should watch out for over the next few weeks as the Coronavirus situation unfolds:

1. Fake test kits scam – someone may call claiming to offer free Corona-

virus testing kits and will ask you for your personal information and health insurance details. A common version of this scam targets diabetic individuals that are higher risk, where a scam caller will offer both a free Coronavirus test kit and a free diabetic monitor.

2. FDIC scam – scammers posing as employees from the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation will ask you for sensitive information, such as your social security number and bank account information, over the phone as a precondition to receive federal money. Remember the FDIC would never make unsolicited phone calls asking for personal information and money, and especially would not put pressure on you or threaten you.

3. Charity scam – you may get a call from someone claiming to be from a charitable organisation which is collecting donations for individuals, groups or areas affected by Coronavirus. The caller will ask you to send cash

donations in the mail, by wire transfer or by gift card.

4. Healthcare provider scam – scam-callers pretending to work for a healthcare provider will tell you that a relative or friend has been treated for Coronavirus, and then demand immediate payment for treatment before threatening legal action if you don't pay. Healthcare providers would not contact you this way.

5. Student loan scams – you receive a call to tell you that new measures due to the Coronavirus outbreak will have an effect on your student loan, and that you need to ring a different phone number to find out how the new measures will impact your future payment obligations. If you ring this number, a scammer may ask you for personal information like your social security number and credit card details.

While the list is not exhaustive, CPR Call Blocker hopes to make people in South Carolina aware that scammers are

becoming more inventive and if something sounds too good to be true or out of the ordinary, then it could well be a scam.

Chelsea Davies from CPR Call Blocker said: "As more and more restrictions are put into place in the US, we predict that scammers are going to take advantage of more people being at home and, with many of those people also being distracted or stressed about the Coronavirus situation, this could be a recipe for disaster. When we're feeling vulnerable or distracted, it can be too easy to say "yes" to something without checking first whether it's genuine.

"We're warning people in South Carolina to bear this in mind and we would always strongly recommend never giving your bank details or paying for something over the phone that you're unsure of. Especially if the call you receive is the first time you have heard of any payment that needs to be made."

If you want to stop receiving scam and nuisance calls, follow this

three-step guide to stopping unwanted calls:

1. Register with the National Do Not Call Registry – visit DoNotCall.gov.

2. Don't consent to being contacted – get your phone number taken off directories and look out for tick boxed on all marketing correspondence to see if ticking or unticking them will prevent your details being passed on to third parties.

3. Consider getting a call blocker.

If you think you may be receiving scam calls, here are a few ways to protect yourself:

1. Don't reveal personal details. Never give out personal or financial information such as your bank account details or PIN – even if the caller claims to be from your bank.

2. Hang up. If you feel harassed or intimidated, end the call. You have the right not to feel pressured.

3. Ring the organization. If you're unsure whether the caller is genuine, you can always ring the com-

pany they claim to be from. Make sure you find the number yourself and don't use one provided by the caller.

4. Don't be rushed. Scammers will try to rush you into providing personal details. They may say they have a time-limited offer or claim your bank account is at risk if you don't give them the information they need right away.

Ms Davies continued: "If you suspect you may have compromised your bank account, contact your bank or card provider as soon as possible. It is also advisable to check your bank and card statements regularly for unauthorised charges as a matter of course."

"Sometimes joint pain can occur in flares that your body can predict: a change of weather in a usually dry climate, a change of temperature or staying in contact with water for too long," says Dr. Ken Redcross, author of "Bond: The 4 Cornerstones of a Lasting and Caring Relationship with Your Doctor" and founder of Redcross Concierge. "Particularly as we age, pain tends to sneak in, so managing it is a useful skill to acquire. However, it's not just about taking a pill to numb the pain and hoping for as few side effects as possible."



If a chill in the air or damp, humid temps bring you discomfort, Dr. Redcross recommends the following simple measures, which may help you find relief:

- Keep Moving:

Inclement weather can keep us sedentary. When you reduce your movement or don't get out as much, pain can increase. Don't let potential aches and pains stop you from regular activity. The sooner you start moving, the better you will feel.

- Know Your Limits: Don't increase the intensity of physical activity too quickly, especially if you have existing cardiovascular, joint or muscle problems that could be aggravated as a result. Work with a licensed trainer at

first, who can assess your strength, flexibility, balance and endurance, and create a custom workout program accordingly.

- Relieve Pain Naturally: The next time you experience pain, avoid popping a conventional pain reliever.

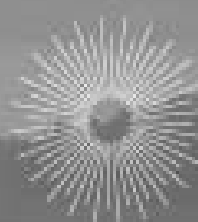
