Wofford Alumni Association to honor three during Homecoming Weekend, Oct. 21 - 22

The Wofford College Alumni Association will honor two alumni and a community leader during the college's annual Homecoming Weekend, Oct. 21-22. The annual awards ceremony will be held at 10 a.m. Saturday, Oct. 22, in the Papadopoulos Room of the Papadopoulos Building on campus. It is free and open to the public.

Lt. Col. Arthur T. "Ted" Ballard will receive the Distinguished Citizen Award, while Ellis DeWayne Colvin, class of 1983, will be honored with the Distinguished Service Award, and John Pendleton Moore, class of 2004, will receive the Young Alumnus Award.

The awards event is sponsored by the Wofford College Alumni Association Board.

Lt. Col. Arthur T. "Ted" Ballard Jr., retired from the U.S. Air Force, flew 67 successful combat missions during the Vietnam War before being shot down over North Vietnam. He was captured and was in POW camps, including the infamous "Hanoi Hilton," from September 1966 until his release in March 1973. He is a graduate of Spartanburg High School, received an associate's degree from Spartanburg Methodist College (then Spartanburg Junior College) and studied engineering at Clemson University before joining the Air Force. He earned his master's degree and served on the faculty of the U.S. Air Force War College before retiring in August 1975, when he and his wife, Ruth, returned to Spartanburg. He was the senior instructor for the Air Force Junior ROTC program at Gaffney (S.C.) High School, where he taught for 22 years before retiring in 1997. Ballard continues to write and speak with groups about his experiences as a U.S. Air Force pilot and prisoner of war

in Vietnam. In 2015, after the death of his wife, Ballard established the Dr. Kevin Dale Ballard '80 Endowed Scholarship Fund at Wofford in memory of his son and wife. Kevin Ballard had a distinguished career as director of analysis and toxicology for National Medical Services in Pennsylvania before his death in 2009. The scholarship will be awarded for the first time to a deserving student in the fall of 2017, with preference going to top students who plan to pursue a career in science, technology or medicine.

Ellis D. Colvin '83, a native of Dillon, is the construction program manager with the Office of Director of National Intelligence, and, in conjunction with the U.S. Department of State in Washington, D.C., is responsible for the security, design and construction, information system and technology development, and the program of security protection for the U.S. embassies and consulates abroad. He was the most recent chief of global affairs and partner engagements at the National Geospatial Intelligence Agency in Springfield, Va. He is a retired lieutenant colonel with 33 years of both federal and active-duty military service. Colvin received his juris doctorate degree in 2013 from the Charleston School of Law. He was the 2008 National Security Fellow of The Maxwell School of Citizenship and Public Affairs at Syracuse University; and he was the recipient of three master's degrees from the Eisenhower School of Industry Studies, Hawaii Pacific University and Central Michigan University. He received a bachelor of art degrees in government and sociology from Wofford. Colvin and his wife, Dr. Cynthia Colvin, 1995 graduate of Converse College, live in Bethesda,

Md. They have two children, daughter Caroline, a junior at Syracuse University, and a son, Ellis, a sophomore at Georgetown Preparatory High School.

John Pendleton Moore, founder and president of Moore Capital, LLC in Spartanburg, a family investment office that manages the real estate and private holdings of the Moore family, is a 2004 graduate of Wofford College. While at Wofford, Moore co-founded the real estate development and management firm JWA Properties, LLC, which was sold in 2008, leading to the founding of Moore Capital, LLC. At 28 years old he was appointed in by S.C. Gov. Nikki Haley as one of the youngest magistrate judges in the history Spartanburg County. Moore has been active in the non-profit community since graduating from Wofford. He and his sister, Anne Brady Moore Carlson, established the Moore Family Endowed Scholarship Fund at Wofford in 2004. Awards from the fund are made to women who need financial assistance in meeting their educational expenses, with preference given to those studying government. Moore and his sister also created the Betty Ann Moore Colon Cancer Screening Fund, the first privately funded colon cancer screening program in South Carolina, in 2005. The fund provides free colonoscopies to citizens in Spartanburg County who otherwise couldn't afford preventive cancer screening. Moore serves on the board of trustees of Spartanburg Methodist College, as the treasurer of the Cancer Division of Spartanburg Regional Foundation and on the South Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities board of trustees. He and his wife, Lindsay, live at Lake Bowen in Inman.

Making the college application process less stressful

If you're parenting a high school junior or senior, then the stress of applying for a college is probably starting to escalate. While that first college class is still a ways off, there are lots of reasons for feeling anxious now.

There are tests to take, applications to complete and essays to write. And on top of all that is making a college decision that truly can be life shaping. No wonder everyone is stressed.

One way to reduce this stress is simply to understand all the issues, decisions and steps necessary for college admission. An important starting point is sitting down for a family discussion about paying for college. Family contributions, scholarships and loans can all be discussed, but the bottom line for many families may be that certain schools will simply be too expensive. Now is the time to make that decision.

Next, understand the full college application process. A good starting place for understanding the process is the College Board site at <https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/get-in>. Your high school counselor can also be a good source with information about deadlines, programs of study and college costs. The counselor can also help narrow down college possibilities based on your son or daughter's interests, grades and overall school performance.

Most colleges still require ACT or SAT testing. For high school seniors, now is the time to do that testing, but high school juniors can also benefit from taking one of those national tests for the practice it provides. Studies have shown that because these tests can produce fairly high anxiety levels, students who take the tests more than once almost always improve on the second go around if only because they are less anxious and now better understand the testing procedures.

This is also a good time to pick up one or more college guides, either at your local bookstore or library (or sometimes from your school's counselor). These guides will provide descriptions of the various colleges and universities, and also outline the requirements and costs for each of the schools. Virtually every school now has a fairly comprehensive website which will provide a great deal of information for prospective students and their parents.

Understanding the costs and process involved in applying for college can make it all much less stressful for both parent and child. The key is to act early and not delay until the last minute.

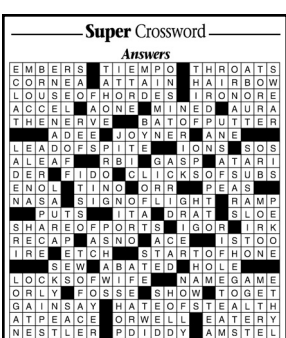

Furman University Provost announces \$225,000 grant for MERCURY program

Greenville - Dr. George Shields, Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost at Furman University, announced recently that the National Science Foundation (NSF) has awarded a \$225,000 grant to the Molecular Education and Research Consortium in Undergraduate Computational Chemistry (MERCURY), a collaboration of undergraduate research teams at 25 primarily undergraduate institutions nationwide. Shields, who joined

Furman in July of this year, is founder and director of the MERCURY consortium. He said the group's annual Conference in Undergraduate Computational Chemistry will move to Furman starting in July 2017.

The three-year grant, which will run through Aug. 31, 2019, is awarded through the NSF's Major Research Instrumentation Program (MRI). The MERCURY researchers share computational resources and use the con-

sortium as a venue to collaborate and increase the visibility of their work.

"We are excited the NSF has chosen to support the important research work of the MERCURY program and we are equally excited that the annual conference will be coming to Furman," Shields said. "The university will make an excellent host since it has one of the strongest programs in the physical sciences of any liberal arts school in the country."

Since its founding in

2001, MERCURY investigators have worked with nearly 600 students on research projects and published more than 230 papers. Seventy-five percent of the students have been female and minority students, and about half of the program's graduates have gone on to receive advanced degrees in STEM fields. MERCURY students have also won more than 50 national awards, including a Rhodes Scholarship, 10 Fulbright fellowships and

eight Goldwater scholarships.

The annual national conference has been taking place on college campuses around the country since 2002.

"The conference allows undergraduates to present their work and to learn from experts in the field," Shields said. "It is equally valuable as a networking event for faculty working with undergraduates."

On the News

Recent domestic terror attacks making headlines remind us that nobody should be complacent to the threat of terrorism or



extremism.

“Terrorism has occurred throughout history, but today it affects the entire world,” says Abayomi Nurain Mumuni, a global terror expert and author of “Global Terrorism and its Effects on Humanity,” an overview of the origins

and types of terrorism. He notes that terrorism and extremism can develop anywhere, and that identifying terrorists in your own community can be difficult as they tend to do their best to blend in with their neighbors.

But Mumuni offers hope

in his more recent book, “Demand by Terror,” laying out ways that a diplomatic response to terrorism may be successful.

“No nation wants to look vulnerable or weak and give in to terrorist demands, but the way to resolve some of the vio-

lence will not come from military actions alone,” he says. “Diplomacy should be an important tool, too.”

Local citizens can get informed about the varied nature of terrorism and become vocal advocates for government responses that offer fewer risks and

more chances of success. Average citizens can voice their opinions through a number of channels at the local, state and national level, including voting for candidates whose policies they support.

In the Community

Be involved in your community, whether that means attending city council meetings and having your voice heard on security issues or getting trained to be a volunteer emergency responder. Many communities offer an opportunity to participate in “neighborhood watch,” or other crime deterring organizations.

Grassroots-level action matters. Take steps at home and in your community at-large to build bridges between neighbors and promote safer streets and neighborhoods.


