### Gaffney receives

#### Community Development Block Grant funds

Columbia - Eleven communities from across South Carolina are slated to benefit from public improvement projects supported by more than \$4.3 million in funds from the latest round of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program. The S.C. Department of Commerce is awarding CDBG funds to these communities, representing more than 26,600 residents.

The City of Gaffney received \$229,000 for Tank Branch Neighborhood Revitalization.

S.C. Commerce awards CDBG funds in the fall and the spring of each year. Selected through a statewide competitive process, local governments receiving CDBG funds are required to provide at least a 10 percent match in funding to complete the projects. Grant funds are allocated on an annual basis to South Carolina from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), and S.C. Commerce administers the CDBG program on the state's behalf. CDBG assists communities in providing housing, a suitable living environment and expanded economic opportunities.

## Wofford student becomes youngest elected official in South Carolina

Armed with \$30, his Facebook friends and just a week to campaign, Wofford College junior Phillip Habib managed to become the current youngest elected official in South Carolina.

The 20-year-old from Goose Creek was elected Nov. 8 as a commissioner on the Berkeley County Soil and Water Commission as a write-in candidate. He got 463 write-in votes during the general election in which no name appeared on the ballot. His closest competitor received 148 votes, and a total of 5,228 names were submitted as write-in candidates for the position.

Habib's campaign - run primarily on Facebook, which included just \$20 spent on advertising - began about a week before the election when he was filling out his absentee ballot and noticed the commission seat had only a write-in option. He inquired about why and was told the current commissioner had decided not to run.

Habib quickly decided, "Why not me?" He launched a Facebook campaign that "caught on like wildfire," he told his hometown newspaper, the

Berkeley Independent.

His only other campaign expense was \$10 for poster boards to make signs.

"Looking back, I'm not that surprised (to be elected) because of the great response I got on social media," Habib, a business economics major at Wofford with about 1,700 Facebook friends. "However, on election day, I was very nervous. I woke up at 4 a.m. to get ready and set out signs. I was going from poll station to poll station to let people know my platform and ask them to write in my name. I stayed at the office for the election commission in Berkeley County until 11 p.m. trying to figure out if I had won, even though I knew it would be a few days before the results were official."

He also created a "Phillip Habib for Soil and Water Commission" page that received 226 likes.

Habib says he wanted to serve on the commission because he believes that Berkeley County's "natural beauty is undervalued. I want to create programs that encourage people to properly use our resources, such as the Berkeley Blueways pro-

gram that promotes kayaking in the county."

He credits his experiences in the Launch program of The Space in the Mungo Center at Wofford with the idea of using Facebook for his campaign. "One of the things they teach us is how valuable social media is to spreading your brand," he says. "I used a lot of things they taught me in The Space while running my social media campaign. Also, Facebook has the most users, so it only makes sense to use a social media platform that can reach the most people."

While Habib isn't sure what he will do after graduating from Wofford, he says the experience of interning with the Berkeley County Economic Development Office over the past two summers - helping to recruit more than \$100 million in investment - and The Space have him thinking of becoming an entrepreneur. He is the co-founder of a start-up called Voyway, which aggregates the travel industry.

At Wofford, in addition to The Space, Habib is a member of Kappa Sigma fraternity and serves on the Judicial Commission.

Learning to care for yourself when caring for another

Taking care of a loved one is not an uncommon occurrence these days. Lifestyle changes and medical advances have more people living longer, but sometimes without the ability to safely handle the challenges of daily living themselves.

It isn't simply an aging population that is expanding the need for caregivers. Many families have members who may have mental or physical impairments, or serious, debilitating health issues. And while there are a growing number of facilities and organizations that can provide care, they are often out of the financial reach of many families or go against a family's wishes to personally provide the needed care for a loved one.

The result is that many people find themselves in the role of family caregiver, a role that can often be close to a 24-hour, 7-day a week job. Unfortunately, many of those providing family care often fail to realize or choose to ignore the toll that such an obligation, along with other family or work requirements, can have on them.

While there are no easy solutions to such situations, there are things that can be done to help family caregivers take better care of themselves.

In many cities, it is possible to find businesses, organizations or individuals who can provide what is called "respite" care. This is when someone comes in for a few hours, maybe once or several times a week, in order to give the primary caregiver a much-needed break. Such services, however, can be hard to find in many places, especially smaller towns and rural areas, and may be prohibitively expensive if they are available.

The alternative is for the individual providing the care to learn to care better for himself or herself, to essentially work out a "personal respite" program.

This can take a variety of forms, from just scheduling a short break to have a cup of tea or read a book, to turning to friends and other family members for their assistance in providing the help that will give the caretaker a few hours of personal time.

While family caregivers tend to be concerned, giving people, it's vital for them to monitor their own mental and physical well-being, too. Failing to recognize when the stress of helping is having a negative impact on their patience or ability to think clearly or respond appropriately can lead to serious and unexpected issues.

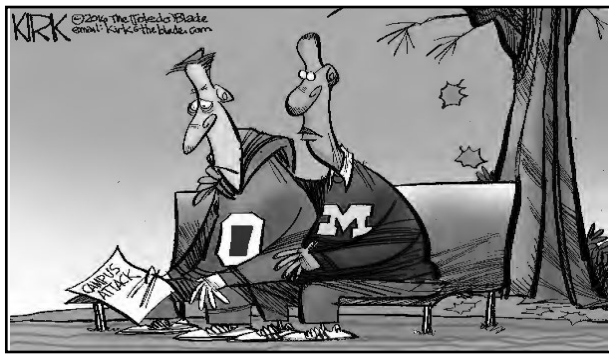

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# S.C. school district superintendents affirm support for military-connected students

Columbia - South Carolina school district superintendents and senior leaders from the Active Duty military, the National Guard and Reserves came together at the South Carolina Association of School Administrators (SCASA) Building on December 1st to demonstrate their support for military-connected students and families. Recognizing the importance that the Department of Defense, the Department of the

Army and all military services place on the education of the service members' dependents, the superintendents signed a resolution in support of military-connected students. The resolution recounts many of the challenges faced by military-connected students and affirms the school districts' commitment to caring for and serving those students.

South Carolina is the first state in the nation to have all school districts

come together to affirm their support for military-connected students. This action demonstrates South Carolina's deep commitment to our military service members, their families and especially their children.

Bill Dukes, South Carolina Civilian Aide to the Secretary of the Army; Major General John P. "Pete" Johnson, Commanding General of Ft. Jackson; Brigadier General R. Van McCarty, The

Assistant Adjutant General South Carolina National Guard; William L. "Bill" Bethea Jr., S.C. Military Base Task Force Chairman; Beth Phibbs, Executive Director of SCASA; Darrell Johnson, Superintendent of Greenwood District 50; and superintendents or their representatives from school districts in South Carolina were in attendance at the signing.

Darrell Johnson, President of the Superinten-

dents' Affiliate of the South Carolina Association of School Administrators said, "This resolution is an excellent opportunity for every superintendent and school district in our state to show how much we appreciate our military. These men and women have done so much and sacrifice all for our country and we are honored to be part of this endeavor."

SCASA, the professional organization for school

leaders in South Carolina, has more than 4,000 members. From professional development opportunities and research, to publications and legislative advocacy, SCASA's focus is to support school leaders in providing the best possible education for South Carolina's young people. SCASA also works on the national level, as a state affiliate of three national associations for school leaders.

## Three additional men plead guilty for illegally harvesting and selling American eels

WASHINGTON - Recently, three individuals pleaded guilty in federal district court in Charleston, to trafficking more than \$740,000 worth of juvenile American eels aka "elvers" or "glass eels," in violation of the Lacey Act. Harry Wertan, Jr., Mark Weihe and Jay James each pleaded guilty to selling or transporting elvers in interstate commerce, which they had harvested illegally, or knew had been harvested illegally, in South Carolina.

The pleas were the result of "Operation Broken Glass," a multi-jurisdiction U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) investigation into the illegal trafficking of American eels. To date, the investigation has resulted in guilty pleas for ten individuals whose combined conduct resulted in the illegal trafficking of more than \$2.6 million worth of elvers.

The guilty pleas were announced today by Assistant Attorney General John C. Cruden for the Justice Department's Environment and Natural

Resources Division, Acting U.S. Attorney Beth Drake for the District of South Carolina, and Director Dan Ashe of the USFWS.

"We will not allow the rivers of the United States to be the poaching grounds for international seafood markets," said Assistant Attorney General Cruden. "The American eel is an important but limited natural and economic resource that must be protected. Trafficking only undercuts the toil and honest efforts of those who obey the law."

"This case underscores the role U.S. citizens often play in wildlife trafficking and demonstrates that this deadly trade does not solely impact large, charismatic mammals in distant countries," said Director Dan Ashe for USFWS. "U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service law enforcement agents work tirelessly to save wildlife from the threat traffickers pose here at home, and together with the Department of Justice, bring these individuals to justice for their illegal

activities."

Eels are highly valued in east Asia for human consumption. Historically, Japanese and European eels were harvested to meet this demand; however, overfishing has led to a decline in the population of these eels. As a result, harvesters have turned to the American eel to fill the void resulting from the decreased number of Japanese and European eels.

American eels spawn in the Sargasso Sea, an area of the North Atlantic Ocean bounded on all sides by ocean currents. They then travel as larvae from the Sargasso to the coastal waters of the eastern United States, where they enter a juvenile or elver stage, swim upriver and grow to adulthood in fresh water. Elvers are exported for aquaculture in east Asia, where they are raised to adult size and sold for food. Harvesters and exporters of American eels in the United States can sell elvers to east Asia for more than \$2000 per pound.

Because of the threat of overfishing, elver harvesting is prohibited in the United States in all but three states: Maine, South Carolina and Florida. Maine and South Carolina heavily regulate elver fisheries, requiring that individuals be licensed and report all quantities of harvested eels to state authorities. Although Florida does not have specific elver-related regulations, the limited population of elvers in Florida waters makes commercial eel fishing impossible.

"This investigation is an outstanding example of the dedication and ingenuity shown by multiple agencies working together to expose and curtail the illegal trade of American eels," said Special Agent-in-Charge Luis Santiago Southeast Region for USFWS. "Today's pleas are a success in our collective efforts to conserve and protect an important American fishery."

"Today's pleas in the illegal trade of American Eels are a tremendous step in preserving this impor-

tant fishery," said Colonel Chisolm Frampton for the South Carolina Department of Natural Resources, Law Enforcement Division. "A multitude of state and federal agencies did outstanding work to bring this case to successful conclusion."

The offenses in the case are felonies under the Lacey Act, each carrying a maximum penalty of five years' incarceration, a fine of up to \$250,000 or up to twice the gross pecuniary gain or loss, or both.

Operation Broken Glass was conducted by the USFWS and the Justice Department's Environmental Crimes Section in collaboration with the Maine Marine Patrol, South Carolina Department of Natural Resources Law Enforcement Division, New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife Bureau of Law Enforcement, Connecticut Department of Energy and Environmental Protection Conservation Police, Virginia Marine Resources Commission Police, USFWS Refuge Law

Enforcement, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration Office of Law Enforcement, Massachusetts Environmental Police, Rhode Island Department of Environmental Management Division of Law Enforcement, New York State Environmental Conservation Police, New Hampshire Fish and Game Division of Law Enforcement, Maryland Natural Resources Police, North Carolina Wildlife Resource Commission Division of Law Enforcement, Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, Yarmouth, Massachusetts Division of Natural Resources, North Myrtle Beach, South Carolina Police Department and the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission.
