### Wofford again among Princeton Review's 'Colleges That Pay You Back'

## Tips for building and maintaining a long-term relationship

Each year, Valentine's Day brings thoughts of cute greeting cards and heart-shaped boxes of candy, but it's also a good time to think about long-term relationships. Our romantic Valentine's relationships actually share many of the same basics as any of our close relationships. Long-term relationships, whether a marriage, a friendship or even a business arrangement, are based on some common foundations and make a number of common demands of us.

Building a long-term relationship takes work. We are all different, even the people we are closest to. We are each a product of many different influences and personal choices. This means that there are always times, whatever the type of relationship, when there will be differing opinions. The reason that marriages and friendships survive is because the people involved are willing to work through differences and disagreements. In other words, they value the relationship more than the things over which they may disagree.

For a relationship to grow and evolve, it's important for both members in it to be honest with one another even when disagreements come up. Doing so helps build the essential trust that makes a relationship work.

One way to look at this could be called the ABC method of sustaining a relationship. The "A" is to "Affirm" the value of the relationship. In other words, agreeing that the relationship itself is more important than either of your views on a particular subject.

"B" stands for "Behaving" in ways that, when discussing points of disagreement, reaffirm the value of the relationship. This means letting the other person know that while you may disagree on this subject, it won't affect the basics of the relationship. It means not setting ultimatums or trying to force the other person to your point of view.

The "C" means "Clarifying" issues when there are disagreements. Each person must monitor and control his own tendency to want to "interpret" the words and actions of the other, as opposed to being open and talking with the other person to allow for clarification of his or her intent and meaning.

Long-term relationships are important in our lives. But there's no denying that it takes work to make them grow and last. The key is often finding room in the relationship for the differences that are bound to exist between any two people.

## Greenville man enters guilty plea in federal court on gun charges

Columbia - United States Attorney Beth Drake stated today that Michael Lee Westbrook, age 40, of Greenville, pled guilty on January 19th in federal court in Anderson to a felon in possession of a firearm indictment. United States District Judge Timothy M. Cain accepted the plea and will impose sentence after he has reviewed the presentence report which will be prepared by the U.S. Probation Office.

Westbrook, a previously convicted felon who is prohibited from possessing firearms or ammunition, faces a statutory mandatory minimum sentence of 15 years and a maximum of life in federal prison. Westbrook was arrested on federal firearms charges on September 7, 2016, and has remained in custody, since his federal arrest.

Evidence presented at the change of plea hearing established that on September 3, 2016, members of the Greenville County Sheriff's Office responded to a local residence in an attempt to locate West-

brook for a state probation violation. Upon their arrival, deputies located Westbrook located in the back yard and recovered a loaded Ruger .380 caliber pistol from his back pocket.

Westbrook was arrested federally as a part of "Operation Real-Time." The goal of this program is to identify individuals for federal prosecution with significant criminal histories who continue to actively possess firearms in the Upstate community.

In addition to the Greenville County Sheriff's Office and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms, Real Time's core partners include the Greenville Police Department; the Anderson Police Department; the South Carolina Department of Probation, Parole, and Pardon Services; the South Carolina Highway Patrol; United States Probation; the Department of Homeland Security; the Federal Bureau of Investigation; the Drug Enforcement Administration; the 13th Circuit Solicitor's Office; and the United States

Attorney's Office. Since August of 2015, the initiative has resulted in the expedited federal prosecution of some 90 defendants and seizure of approximately 110 firearms as well as assorted ammunition from prohibited persons.

Greenville County Sheriff Will Lewis and his office are crucial partners in this effort. "The Greenville County Sheriff's Office is committed to removing illegal weapons

from violent offenders and are very glad to be a part of this program and will offer any assistance we can."

U.S. Attorney Beth Drake commended the partnership between the state and federal agencies that led to the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and the U.S. Attorney's Office adopting the case, "We work best when we work together. This 'real time' identification of high risk offenders is smart policing, and we

welcome the opportunity to work alongside our state chiefs and sheriffs in taking violent repeat offenders out of our communities."

The Greenville County Sheriff's Office along with agents from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) investigated the case. Assistant United States Attorney Max Cauthen in the Greenville U.S. Attorney's Office is prosecuting the case.

# Five top tips for Heart Health Month

(StatePoint) Heart disease and stroke cause one in three deaths among women each year, killing approximately one woman every 80 seconds. While there are many risk factors involved that are beyond one's control, a healthy lifestyle can make a big difference.

February is American Heart Month and a great opportunity to adopt healthy habits that can reduce your risk for illness. Here are five to consider.

- **Move about:** Exercise doesn't have to be daunting! Aim for 10-minute sessions, three times daily. Movement sets your metabolism in motion, so make sure it's a consistent part of your life.

- **Get sleep:** Sleeping fewer than seven hours a night can make you gain weight and have more trouble taking it off, according to Columbia University research. Another study found that people who get enough sleep have a five percent



higher metabolism than people who don't. That means more calories burned while you're sleeping! Doesn't get much easier than that.

- **Eat small and well:** "Studies have found that losing five to 10 percent of your body weight can

lower the risk of a heart attack," says Dawn Zier, CEO of Nutrisystem and the 2017 Go Red for Women Campaign Chair in Philadelphia, a movement to help end heart disease and stroke in women.

Research suggests that eating smaller, balanced meals throughout the day

promotes greater weight loss and maintenance, and can also be good for your heart. Schedule meals every two to three hours, six times a day. Programs designed to help you eat healthy portions can mean seeing quick results. For example, Nutrisystem Lean13 is a new program

designed to help you lose up to 13 pounds and seven inches in the first month. For more information visit [nutrisystem.com](http://nutrisystem.com).


- **Rise, shine, drink water.** You'll burn more calories all day: A German study found that drinking 48 ounces (about six cups)

of cold water increased calorie burn at rest by up to 50 calories per day. This alone could melt a pound in a little more than two months. And drinking it before meals could give you an added bonus, as a Virginia Tech study found that dieters who drank two, eight-ounce glasses of water before meals for 12 weeks lost 36 percent more weight than those who didn't down the water.

- **Put your phone away:** Checking your email in the morning will just stress you out. Many productivity experts recommend waiting at least an hour once you get to work before checking your inbox, so you can tackle your most important priorities calmly without getting distracted.


