## 'Something larger than myself': Longtime servant-leader committed to strength of health system

Lib Fleming has always valued opportunities to make Spartanburg a better place.

She was a longtime community volunteer before winning a seat on Spartanburg City Council in 1994. She served for 10 years then took on a role with the state's Public Service Commission, which she held until 2018.

Along the way, Fleming says she gained a deep appreciation for the importance of infrastructure and essential services – including well-run hospitals. "A healthcare system with excellent, cutting-edge resources is so important to a vibrant community," she said.

Fleming considered it an honor to join the Spartanburg Regional Foundation Board of Trustees in 2019.

In addition to recognizing

health care as a vital resource, she also has longstanding ties to Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System. Both her late husband, Harold, and her son, Nick, practiced as physicians at Spartanburg Regional.

Dr. Harold Fleming was an advocate for helping patients through philanthropy. He helped create a fund to support expenses not covered by insurance. Following his death, the fund was named the Harold E. Fleming, MD, Patient Independence Fund to honor his legacy of caring for others.

The Fleming Fund is one of the Foundation's most active, with hospital employees donating more than \$40,000 annually and hundreds of patients receiving support. Community members also contribute, many in memory of Dr. Fleming.

"We are grateful to have the Fleming Fund to help

patients in need, and we are blessed to have Lib Fleming's leadership as a Foundation trustee," said Kristy Caradori, executive director of the Spartanburg Regional Foundation. "She has been a tremendous addition to the Foundation's board."

"I enjoy working with a diverse group of people to move things forward, and it's exciting to be part of something larger than myself," she said. ### Chapman Cultural Center awards '22-'23 3rd quarter community grants

Chapman Cultural Center is committed to expanding and strengthening Spartanburg's creative community. Because of this commitment, a major part of the work they do is centered around funding Spartanburg's arts and cultural community.

One of the Center's major funding opportunities comes in the form of the quarterly Community Grants Program. The Community Grants award up to \$5,000 per application and is open to both individual artists and non-profits/government agencies.

In addition to the Community Grants, the center is announcing the first round of awards for Chapman Cultural Center's newest grant opportunity, the Materials and Equipment Grant! The Materials and Equipment Grant was created in 2022 to evolve how they serve Spartanburg's creative community by providing artists with a new avenue for funding their artistic projects and initiatives.

Vivianne Carey was awarded a community grant in order to aid in the purchase of a kiln and kiln furniture to create a new body of figurative work

with ceramics. For her new work, a large kiln is necessary to fulfill her creative goals. The newly created sculptures will be shown first during the Open Studios in April, then later at the faculty show at Converse next fall, as well as additional upcoming showcases.

Jeff Edwards was awarded a Community Grant to aid in his latest project of producing a vinyl of his latest album, The Elephant Ascendant. His goal is to create a tangible, physical piece of artwork and memorabilia for the band's original music.

The purpose of the Equipment and Materials Grant is to assist local creatives with the tools they need to create their art. Creatives may request up to \$750 per year to help them purchase raw materials and basic items they need in order to make and/or properly display/present their art.

Christina Ramsey was awarded a grant to aid in the purchasing of canvases for her art practice.

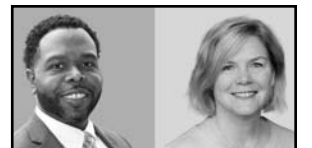
Judy Martin was awarded a grant to aid in the purchasing of fusing glass to be used for a project utilizing a new technique.

Kyra Douglas was

awarded a grant to aid in the purchase of various art supplies for her creative business including paints, canvases, apparel, and an electronic cutting machine.

Manuel Schmettau was awarded a grant to aid in the purchase of a digital camera to pursue his passion for photography and expand his creative practice. He plans to use the new camera to produce a new series of photographic work exploring the streets of Spartanburg, in particular the curbside oddities of leaf piles, cut grass clippings, and various small household curiosities placed upon the curb for city pick-up. This series of photographic work is, in essence, about the understated humor and curbside whimsy of this intersection of public and private, finding beauty in the banal and often overlooked.

Chapman Cultural Center receives general financial support for cultural projects impacting Spartanburg County, funded in part by the South Carolina Arts Commission, which receives support from the National Endowment for the Arts and the John and Susan Bennett Memorial Arts Fund of the Coastal Community Foundation of SC.



### Nowatka, Stukes honored by SoCon

Wofford College's Dr. Cecile Nowatka and Dr. James Stukes have been recognized with a place on the 2022-23 Southern Conference's (SoCon) All-SoCon Faculty and Staff Team for their dedication to the college community and Spartanburg.

Each year, the athletics conference recognizes faculty and staff from its member institutions for service to campuses and communities.

Nowatka, a licensed clinical psychologist, is a professor and chair of the department of psychology, where she has taught since 1999. She teaches courses on child development, abnormal psychology and statistics. Before the COVID-19 pandemic, she was the volunteer therapist at St. Luke's Free Medical Clinic for many years.

Nowatka has found many opportunities to get her students involved with service learning, including the sponsorship of a blood drive, raising money for multiple sclerosis research, the creation of a reading garden at an elementary school and working with infants and toddlers at a child development program. She has served on several committees at Wofford and was a fellow in the year-long Teach.Equity.Now program, which focuses on ensuring equity in classrooms and academic curriculums.

Stukes is a proud first-generation college graduate, who serves as the assistant dean for student success and college access in the Office of Student Success and the Center for Community-Based Learning. For the past 10 years, he has worked in various areas of higher education, including federal TRIO programs supporting underrepresented populations of students. Throughout his career, he has served in capacities related to creating welcoming and affirming spaces for students, faculty and staff.

In 2018, Stukes created the Wofford Firsts initiative to serve as a resource for first-generation college students. The initiative led to the college being chosen for the 2022-23 cohort of First-Gen Forward institutions with the National Association of Student Affairs Professionals (NASPA). He is a member of the Black First-Gen Collective Steering Committee. His work with college access also reaches into the local community through Wofford students serving as near-peer mentors for high school students considering college.

At Wofford, Stukes has taught several courses focused on the first-year experience, community sustainability and self-identity.

Nowatka and Stukes were recognized during the Wofford men's basketball team's home game against The Citadel on January 7.

## Redwood Materials establishing operations in South Carolina with largest economic development announcement in state history

Columbia - Redwood Materials, a producer of anode and cathode battery components for electric vehicles, along with Governor Henry McMaster, recently announced plans to establish operations in Berkeley County. The company's \$3.5 billion investment, which marks the largest economic development announcement in the history of South Carolina, will create 1,500 new jobs.

"Redwood Materials' record-breaking announcement shows that our state's strategic plan to remain a top destination for automobile manufacturers and their suppliers as the industry innovates is working," said Gov. Henry McMaster. "This \$3.5 billion investment, and the 1,500 jobs it will create in Berkeley County, is a transformative accomplishment that can only be attributed to the strong, talented, hardworking South Carolinians who make our state as great as it is."

Headquartered in Carson City, Nevada, and founded by Tesla's former Chief Technology Officer and Co-Founder JB Straubel, Redwood Materials will use its South Carolina campus to create a circular supply chain for electric vehicles. To do so, the company will onshore production of the most critical components in batteries –

the anode and cathode – to drive down costs and emissions while securing the supply chain within the United States. All battery components will be built from as much recycled material as possible. The more than 600-acre campus, located at Camp Hall Commerce Park in Ridgeville, will initially produce enough anode and cathode material for 100 gigawatt-hours (GWh) of battery cell production or 1 million electric vehicles each year.

"South Carolina's commitment to creating a secure energy future and a competitive landscape for electric vehicle manufacturing, supported by a

world-class workforce, fast and efficient logistics, zero-carbon electricity and a phenomenal site made it a smart decision for Redwood to invest here. Redwood's South Carolina Battery Materials Campus will recycle, refine and remanufacture anode and cathode components allowing us to support our current and future customers in the heart of America's battery belt. We're ready to support this region and U.S. electrification by driving down battery costs, emissions, and reducing reliance on foreign supply chains," said Redwood Materials Founder and Chief Executive Officer JB Straubel.

Currently, nearly 100% of the components required for electric vehicle batteries are manufactured overseas. Redwood Materials works to recover more than 95% of the critical minerals and rare earth elements from batteries, like nickel, cobalt, lithium, and copper, and then reintroduce those materials into the supply chain through the anode and cathode materials it produces for U.S. battery manufacturers.

Redwood Materials works with multiple partners that have existing operations across the U.S., such as Volvo, Envision AESC, Proterra, Panasonic, Volkswagen and Audi, for reclaiming and recycling end-of-life batteries

and production scrap to produce battery components.

"The future of the automotive industry is paving a path through South Carolina, and Redwood Materials establishing operations in our state proves that point. The company's historic announcement and the 1,500 new jobs it will create mean we are strengthening sustained, long-term economic growth that will benefit South Carolinians for years to come. We applaud Redwood Materials for their commitment to creating a circular economy here and working to shorten the supply chain

through recycling efforts," stated Secretary of Commerce Harry M. Lightsey III.

"South Carolina Ports is excited to welcome Redwood Materials to South Carolina. SC Ports is a critical supply chain partner for many of South Carolina's advanced manufacturers, efficiently importing goods for production and exporting finished products to global markets. SC Ports looks forward to supporting Redwood Materials' new investment that will strengthen our state's position as a leader in automotive, electrification and sustainability," added SC Ports President and CEO Barbara Melvin.

"Redwood Materials represents a tremendous opportunity for South Carolina to increase our sustainable manufacturing footprint and supply chain security. Redwood Materials fits perfectly with Santee Cooper's vision in developing Camp Hall, and we are proud to welcome JB Straubel and his team to Berkeley County, South Carolina," added Santee Cooper Director Stephen H. Mudge.

## Research shows new car safety features can help with crash reduction

(StatePoint) At a time when highway fatalities are on the rise, new research shows that the widespread adoption of the latest vehicle safety features could mean fewer crashes and safer roads. However, it could be awhile before we see the full benefits of these advancements.

"With drivers holding onto their vehicles for 10 years or more, it could take many years before the fleet fully turns over," says Rini Sherony, senior principal engineer, Toyota Collaborative Safety Research Center. But what if every vehicle on the road was fully equipped with crash-prevention features? And how do engineers identify which new vehicle safety features to prioritize next? To find out, Toyota Collaborative Safety Research Center and Virginia Tech teamed up to research the potential benefits that different safety systems have in various crash scenarios.

The team took real-world crashes and reconstructed the data, performing multiple crash simulations. They started modeling with more traditional "passive" safety features, like the latest vehicle structures, and extended their work to include such technologies as automatic emergency braking, lane-keeping assistance, blind-spot warning, etc. Assuming full deployment and

optimal activation of safety features, such as those that were modeled, their research showed that over half of all U.S. crashes could be avoided and nearly 60% of moderate to serious injuries could be mitigated. At the same time, the research also identified what types of crashes are likely to still occur even if these safety features were deployed.

The research center has made the study's data, found at [toyota.com/CSRC](http://toyota.com/CSRC), publicly available so that automakers, policymakers, technology research universities and tech companies can work together to continue to make safety gains and fill the crash prevention gap.

"While drivers can't avoid every danger on the road, our research shows that safety systems have the potential to be very effective in reducing the risk and severity of crashes," says Sherony. "It's important to know that most automakers offer features like lane departure warning, automatic emergency braking, audio warnings and steering

assist (often with additional functionality). When you search for your next car, consider these features, even possibly opting for those that do not come standard-equipped. We hope that as drivers continue to adopt and use such technologies, we will be able to realize more of the accident mitigation and prevention benefits that they can offer, resulting in safer roads for everybody."

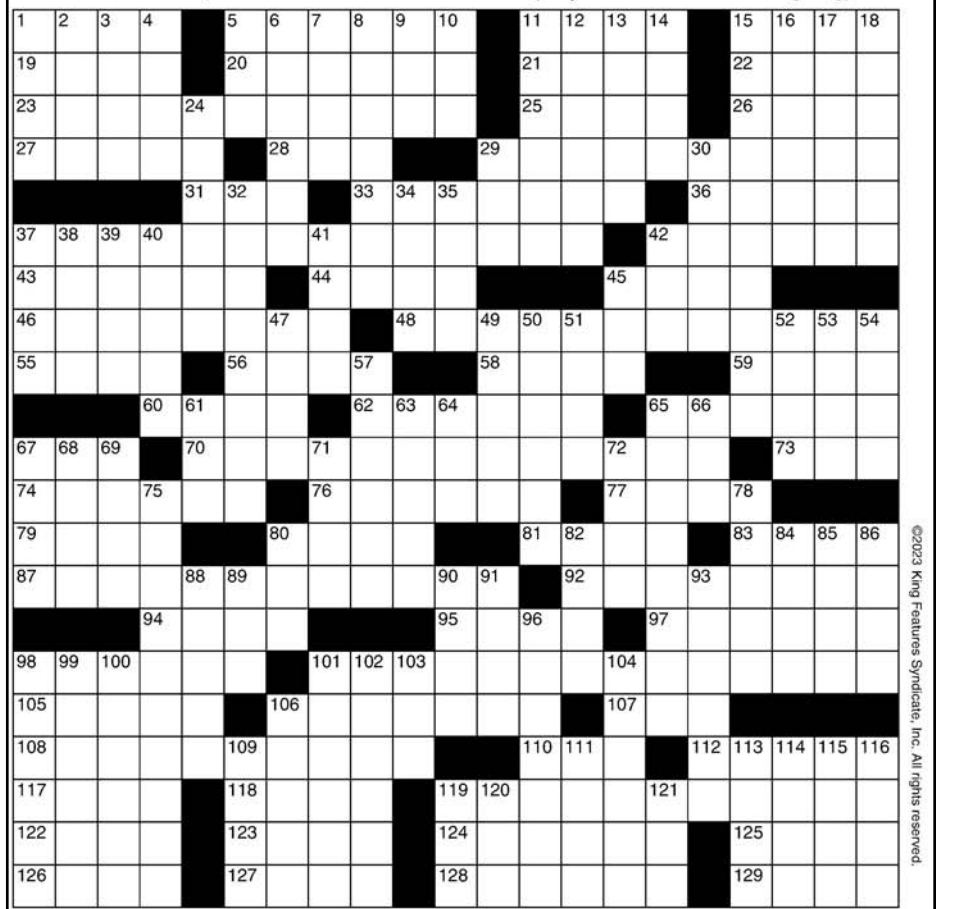

10. Invest in your mental health by managing stress, getting sufficient sleep, exercising and seeking help from a mental health professional when you need it.

# Ensuring every child in America has access to healthy school meals

(StatePoint) Starting in early 2020, every child in the United States became eligible for school meals at no cost, regardless of family income level -- no forms, no questions asked. That policy, along with other interventions, including increased Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Women, Infants, Children Program benefits, kept millions of children and families from going hungry during the pandemic. But support for school meals ended this September, putting healthy school meals increasingly out of reach for children who rely on them for nearly half their daily calories and a consistent source of good nutrition.

Amid soaring food prices, rising rates of nutrition and food insecurity, and families having a harder time accessing nutritious foods in their communities, advocates at the American Heart Association say that Congress's failure to extend healthy school meals is already having profound consequences.

For more than two years, the country has seen food insecurity rates stay relatively stagnant. Pandemic-era assistance helped ensure that already high rates of families struggling to feed their kids did not worsen. However, with these policies ending and food costs skyrocketing, early data from 2022 suggest that food insecurity is quickly on the rise. Food insecurity disproportionately

affects households with children (14.8%), Hispanic households (17%), Black households (21%) and households living at or below the federal poverty line (35%). This crisis also comes at a time when households across America are facing delayed health care, barriers to affordable housing, and a general financial squeeze caused by rising prices on consumer goods.

"Providing healthy school meals for students at no charge is a recipe for success that reduces food insecurity, improves children's diets and academic performance, generates critical revenue for schools and decreases stigma," according to Nancy Brown, CEO, American Heart Association. "Action by the federal government is long overdue. It is a necessity for families and schools to feed children the healthy meals they need for success."

Kids who eat well perform better in school. However, access to food is just part of the issue. The American Heart Association points out that with pre-pandemic numbers of more than 15 million school breakfasts and 30 million school lunches served every day, what children put on their plates has a significant impact on their overall health and well-being.

"Federal programs including SNAP and the Summer Food Service program have been integral to addressing hunger, but many policies focus on



improving access to sufficient quantities of food," says Brown. "While this goal is critically important, especially in mitigating the effects of poverty, we must modernize these policies and programs to also focus on food quality, so people have access to enough nutritious food."

There are opportunities for the federal government to change course and ensure that every child across the country has access to free, nutritious foods at school. The White House recently released a

national strategy to end nutrition and food insecurity and mitigate the effects of diet-related chronic diseases in the United States by 2030, making the recommendation for healthy school meals for all and strong nutrition standards. Additionally, a key committee in the House of Representatives has passed a child nutrition reauthorization bill that would protect and strengthen nutrition standards for school meals and help millions of children gain access to healthy school

meals, among other updates to child nutrition programs. Advocates at the American Heart Association say that the Senate now needs to do its part to give children the best chance to succeed. To learn

**Q.** Who is the actress playing Whitney Houston in the new film about her life? Is she doing the vocals for the film or lip-synching over Houston's? — *B.E.*

**A.** Naomi Ackie won the coveted role of legendary singer Whitney Houston in "I Wanna Dance with Somebody," the biopic about the superstar's accomplished, yet tragic life. Ackie's first screen credit was in a 2015 episode of "Doctor Who," but her big break came by playing Jannah in "Star Wars: The Rise of Skywalker."

According to Yahoo UK, Ackie, who is British, says that 97.9% of the vocals in the film are Houston's, but that she herself did sing the first song in the movie when the character was a bit younger and "needed to be refined." Even though she lip-synced, Ackie did a fantastic job recreating iconic moments in Houston's life, such as singing the "Star Spangled Banner" at Super Bowl XXV and starring in the hit film "The Bodyguard" with Kevin Costner. As for his career, after leaving late-night shows in 2014, the comedian launched his CNBC TV series "Jay Leno's Garage," where he and his celebrity friends celebrate everything from

classic cars to supercars. The show features a mix of stunts, challenges, reviews and interviews with guest stars.

**A.** Now 72 years old, Joan Lunden is still a journalist, still happily married and the mother of seven children. That ended in 1997, but she currently works for the competing "Today Show" as a special correspondent.

In 2014, Lunden faced a health crisis when she was diagnosed with an aggressive form of breast cancer. She underwent 16 rounds of chemotherapy as well as radiation treatment and a lumpectomy. She's a strong advocate for early detection and believes women should have mammograms before the recommended age of 45.

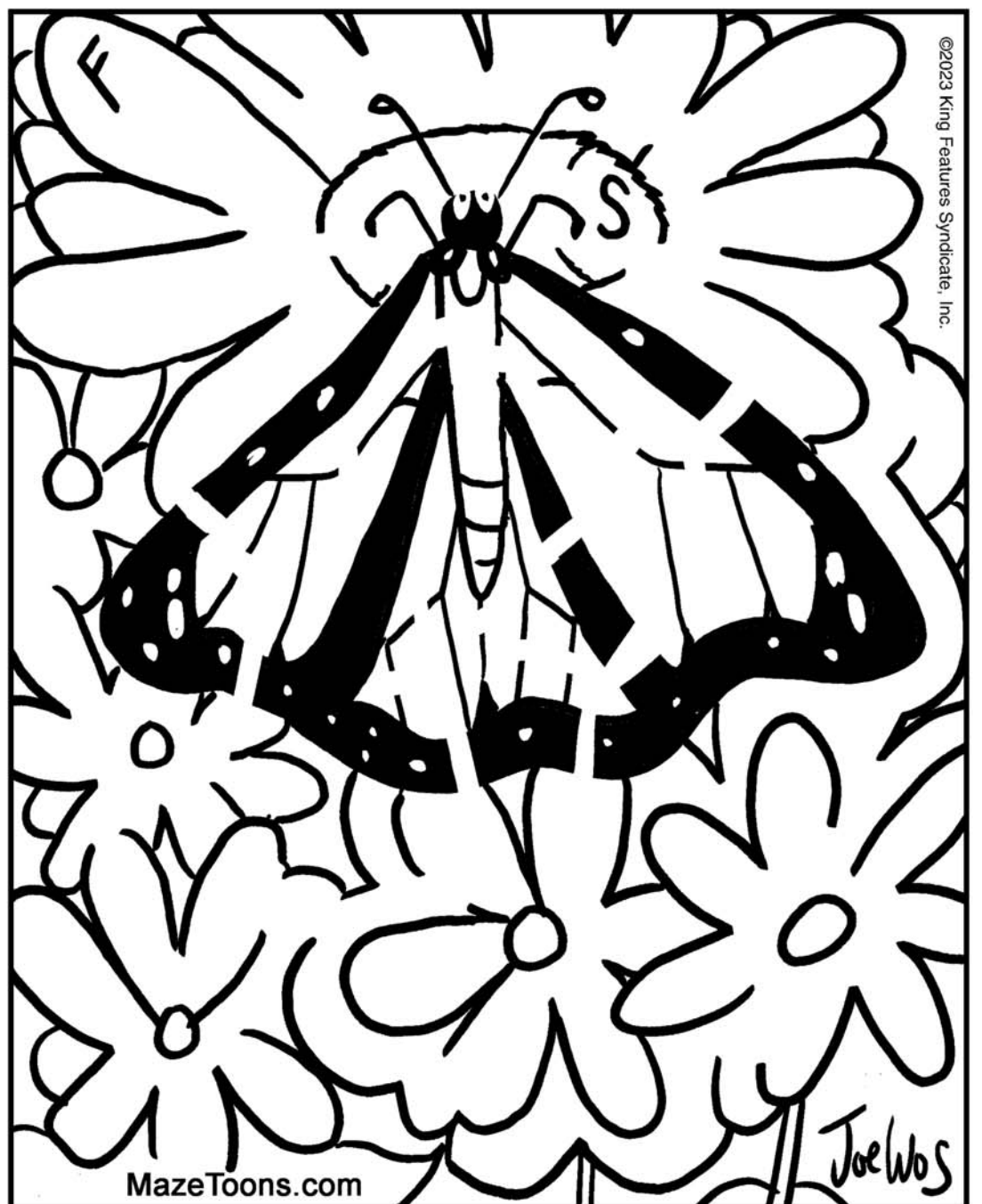

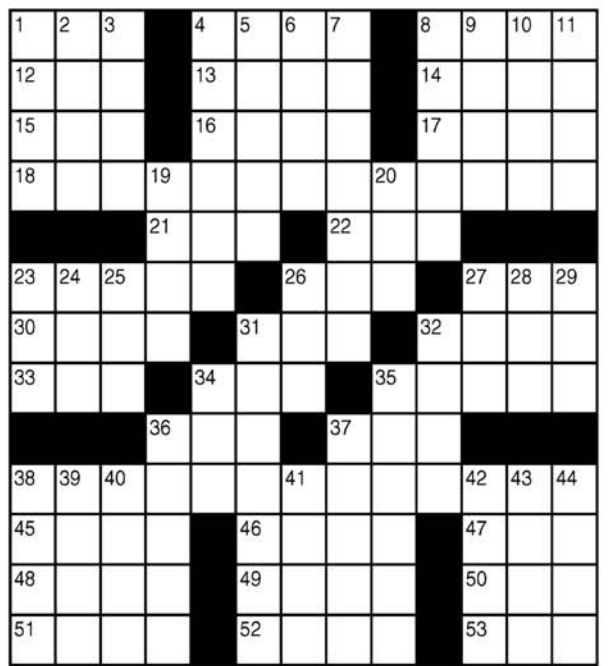

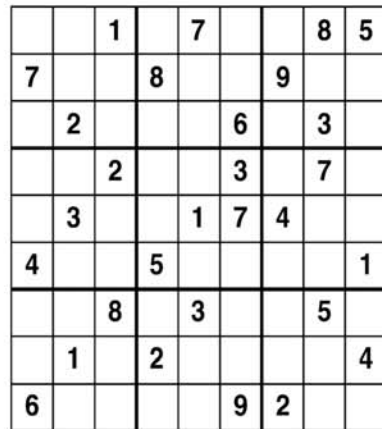
