Secretary of State offers free notary public seminar in Spartanburg

Columbia - Secretary of State Mark Hammond is offering eight free regional notary public seminars this summer and fall for all South Carolina notaries and those interested in becoming a notary, including one in Spartanburg.

Notaries public hold an important position of responsibility. Once commissioned as a notary public, it is the responsibility of the notary to maintain a level of training necessary to perform the duties of the position as required by law. These seminars will address state laws governing the duties and responsibilities of notaries. In addition, the seminars will provide information how notaries can avoid pitfalls related to the unauthorized practice of law.

Doors will open one hour prior to start time; seminars will conclude by 7:30 p.m. The Spartanburg County seminar will be held on Tuesday, September 10, 6 p.m. at Spartanburg Community College, Tracy J. Gaines Building, G01, 107 Community College Drive, Spartanburg.

Converse College donates space for Hub City Empty Bowls event

Hub City Empty Bowls will sponsor two free and public pottery bowl-making sessions at Converse College on Saturday, July 13, at 10 a.m.-noon and 1-3 p.m. The bowls made during these creative and grassroots events will be used later to raise money to feed needy Spartanburg citizens through TOTAL Ministries, a faith-based agency that aids people in financial straits.

No talent or skill is needed to participate, only a creative community spirit and the desire to help those in need. All materials -- clay, instruction, space -- are provided at no cost. Participants will hand-shape clay bowls that will be left at Converse College to be finished by experienced potters through the lead sponsoring agency Carolina Clay Artists. In the fall, the finished bowls will be used at the much-anticipated Soup Day, a community event that lets people select the bowls of their choice for \$20 donations and then eat soup provided by local restaurants, hear live music, and enjoy the fellowship.

Several hundreds of colorful bowls of various styles and shapes are available on Soup Day. About two dozen restaurants provide the soup. And for the past few years, more than \$30,000 has been raised each year.

Watermedia Annual Exhibition that travels throughout the state each year, showcasing the wealth of talent that uses water-based media to create works of art. The exhibit of 30 pieces opened at WMAC on Tuesday, July 2, and will close Saturday, Aug. 3.

The public can see this exhibit for free Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. A public reception for the exhibit will be held on Thursday, July 18, 5 to 9 p.m., during the city's monthly ArtWalk.

Among the 30 pieces that are in the 2018 collection is *Tree Tops* by former Spartanburg resident Dwight Rose, who is one of the only three artists from Upstate South Carolina chosen for the exhibit.

WMAC is one of the leading arts agencies in Spartanburg. It is a membership-based nonprofit agency that has more than 50 members, most of whom are visual artists. Some are performing artists. Each month, it sponsors three new monthlong exhibit by its members and by guest artists. In addition to its public galleries, it also has about 30 working studios for its members, two stages, a printery, and Spartanburg's most extensive collection of locally made artwork for sale on an ongoing basis. You do deserve the success you've earned

It's a feeling that affects both men and women. You've achieved success at work, with a community organization, or just within your family, and yet you don't feel you've really earned that achievement.

You may think that your accomplishments come from luck or good timing rather than any real talent and hard work on your part. You may feel like a fraud, not really capable of the tasks facing you.

Having these thoughts is fairly common. They're manifestations of self-doubt and a lack of self-confidence, and there's even a psychological term to describe them -- "imposter syndrome."

It's not a psychological disorder but rather a descriptive name developed in the late 1970s. Researchers and clinicians found that they were seeing people who had strong accomplishments yet were often convinced they didn't deserve the success they had won.

It happens to many of us. We may have trouble believing we are as intelligent and talented as we really are. The result can be our crediting outside reasons or forces as to why a good thing is occurring, rather than accepting that we actually made it happen ourselves.

Such feelings can become a problem when feeling like an imposter gets in the way of our daily lives. We might be afraid or even frozen when facing a work presentation or speech at a big meeting. We may question or avoid the decisions we need to make regarding our children and family. Professional counselors report that they have seen this self-questioning and lack of confidence in everyone from managers of large businesses to stay-at-home moms.

However, there are ways to overcome imposter syndrome. A starting point is to step back and look objectively at your accomplishments. Make a list of positive things, big and small, you've accomplished in the past year. Then own those accomplishments. Give yourself credit for the work and talent that achieved those successes.

Research has shown that simply talking to yourself can change how you see yourself. Tell yourself that you are worthy in all aspects of your life. Tell yourself that you are better and smarter than you think you are, and that you know more than you usually give yourself credit for. And be sure to remind yourself of these positive thoughts as often as possible.

If a form of imposter syndrome is negatively affecting your life, a professional counselor can offer assistance in overcoming the problem.

Are you doing enough to protect your skin from the sun?

Greater focus on financial literacy will help young people get ahead

Most of us probably remember learning things in high school that we rarely if ever use as adults – like how to calculate the area of a trapezoid or how to solve a quadratic equation.

Yet nearly all of us do, at some point, need to take out a loan, carefully manage our finances to survive lean times, or save for retirement. Unfortunately, the basic financial literacy needed to master these challenges isn't required learning in South Carolina. The result? We allow financial illiteracy to thrive.

That would change under a bill proposed in the S.C. Legislature earlier this year. The measure would create a standalone, half-semester financial literacy course for South Carolina high schools. Passing it would be required to graduate.

The lessons in finance currently offered in S.C. schools are sandwiched into other courses and aren't required to graduate. That's not good enough.

State lawmakers – who adjourned without taking up the bill during the 2019 session – should make it a priority next year.

I couldn't help but think about the importance of financial literacy recently while following a particular discussion in Congress. The topic being discussed was student loan debt, and some were arguing for taxpayers to pick up the tab.

It's become extremely common for college students to accumulate very high levels of student loan debt – in the hope that, through hard work, their debt will one day get paid off. But it's apparent that because they don't fully grasp financial basics, too many students have taken on greater debt burdens than they can sensibly bear.

What's the solution? Arguments for having taxpayers wipe out student debt are misguided at best, but what has emerged from the student debt debate is a strong case for requiring better money-management education in our high schools.

Consider the results of a

recent international study by financial analysts at Standard & Poor's: The United States, the world's largest economy, ranks at the unimpressive 14th place globally with only 57 percent of U.S. adults considered financially literate. That places us behind most European countries and only slightly ahead of Bhutan, a slightly-developed country

in the mountains of South Asia.

A study conducted by the National Financial Educators Council shows South Carolina's young people running about the national average when it comes to financial literacy. But our goal should be to be better than average.

There's a nationwide movement to make passing

a standalone financial literacy course mandatory for a high school diploma, though it appears slow to catch on: Only five states have the kind of requirement now under consideration in South Carolina. That's a shame.

We should do what it takes to ensure that South Carolina students are solidly grounded in financial basics like budgeting, maintaining

good credit scores, calculating interest rates, differentiating good debt from bad debt, saving for retirement, and detecting financial scams. That's the stuff they need to know to keep from getting in debt over their heads. And it's more important than ever in a time when cash transactions are increasingly replaced by waving a smart phone –

making it easier to rack up debt without fully realizing it.

To overlook the importance of sound financial literacy is to release into the real world too many adults who are unable to manage money wisely – and even worse, too many members of Congress who are unable to do so.
