### Spartanburg man indicted on federal gun charge

Brian Delquez Edwards, age 19, of Spartanburg, was charged in a three-count indictment with possession of a firearm by a prohibited person; and possession of a stolen firearm. The maximum penalty Edwards could face is a fine of \$250,000.00 and/or imprisonment of 10 years. This case was investigated by agents of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) and is being prosecuted by Special Assistant United States Attorney Jennifer Wells of the Greenville office.

### Thirty-two complete Doctor of Chiropractic program at Sherman College

Thirty-two students from around the world received the doctor of chiropractic degree from Sherman College of Chiropractic in Spartanburg, on Saturday, June 17th. The commencement was a shared ceremony for June and September 2017 graduates.

Kara Louise Gingras of New Hampshire, recipient of the Milton W. Garfunkel Award, presented the farewell address to her classmates. The Garfunkel Award is the highest award given at graduation. Students receiving this honor must have a grade point average of 3.5 or above, and in addition, best exemplify those qualities Sherman College would like to inculcate in all of its graduates: love of the profession, an understanding of the philosophy, willingness to share, and service to the college and community.

Gingras also received the Academic Achievement Award.

The Clinical Excellence Award was presented to Gingras and also to Stephanie Marie Gates of New Jersey in recognition of their successful practices in the Health Center.

Joseph Frank Messina of Connecticut and Breanna Rose Riggs Smith of Pennsylvania received the B.J. Palmer Philosophy Distinction Award.

The commencement address was given by Sherman College Executive Vice President Neil Cohen, D.C. Douglas Gates, D.C., delivered the charge to the graduates.

The doctor of chiropractic program at Sherman College requires students to complete more than 4,900 hours (14 quarters) of classroom and laboratory study and also includes an internship in the college's on-campus Chiropractic Health Center. To enter the D.C. program, students must have at least 90 semester hours of college-level courses, including courses in the sciences.

### Youth leaders learn agriculture at SC Farm Bureau Conference

Newberry - Forty rising high school juniors and seniors from across South Carolina recently participated in the South Carolina Farm Bureau Federation's (SCFB) 2017 Youth Leadership Conference in Newberry.

The conference, held on the Campus of Newberry College June 11-14, allowed students to gain valuable leadership skills and a better understanding of SC agriculture.

The conference operates on a two-year curriculum cycle where students learn about agricultural marketing and promotion one year and about government relations and agricultural advocacy the next. This year's conference focused on marketing agricultural commodities in South Carolina.

Students traveled to Clemson University to learn about the Clemson Cooperative Extension system and the agricultural research and development taking place at the state's largest land grant university. Mike Echols, supervisor of Clemson athletic grounds, hosted the group on the fields of both the Doug Kingsmore Baseball Stadium and Memorial Football Stadium for a lesson on turfgrass management. Dr. Lance Beecher, aquaculture and fisheries specialist, took students into his greenhouses to learn about aquaculture. Carra Eisenbies, program coordinator and assistant farm manager at the Clemson University Equine Center, showed students around the equine facilities. The Newberry County Young Farmers and Ranchers also hosted their annual Ag Olympics competition for the conference attendees.

### Tips for encouraging good behavior in your children

As parents we all would like to have perfect, well-behaved offspring of whom we can always be proud. Yes, well, it's nice to dream. Kids are kids, and while we love them, and while they may often try to please us, they are also going to continue to be kids and do things that encourage those gray hairs we're now noticing in the mirror.

For most parents, when our children are not living up to our expectations, the natural reaction is to punish or lecture in order to "teach" the child that what he or she did was wrong. While that will usually end the undesired behavior ("Put down the chainsaw, Jimmy!"), it's often a short-lived change, happening mostly to stop the lecture, yelling or punishment.

What researchers have found is that in order to alter long-term behavior, rewards are generally more effective than punishment or other negative consequences. Knowing how to use rewards to promote the right types of behavior should be an important part of parenting skills.

Note that rewarding good behavior is not the same as "bribing" your children. Your goal is to help your children learn that good consequences come from good behavior.

Sometimes a reward might be something tangible - a toy, a favorite food, a new book - that says thank you for the good behavior and encourages more of it for the future.

But rewards can also be intangible - time spent with Mom or Dad, extra play time, getting to watch a favorite TV show or spend time on the computer. Often kids find more value in such rewards than in that new toy. Studies find that simple praise for something done well is one of the most powerful and long-lasting rewards for children of all ages.

You also have to think about how you reward positive behavior. Rewards should be given occasionally and when they aren't expected, otherwise they do become bribes. They should also be given immediately after the desired behavior, not hours or days later. And it's important to reward effort, not just final performance. Trying to do the right thing counts.

Tangible rewards will lose their value over time, but when children know they'll earn your praise and approval for good behavior, it can be a real motivator. Just letting your children know that you appreciate when they're working to do the right thing is often reward enough.

## Andrew W. Mellon Foundation awards \$800,000 grant

Furman University has received an \$800,000 grant from The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation to support eight new faculty positions in the humanities and interpretive social sciences.

The three-year grant will help the university further implement its plans to both improve diversity, inclusion and equity throughout the campus and grow its faculty to maintain an 11-to-1 student-to-faculty ratio while increasing student enrollment from about 2,800 to 2,900. The diversity effort is part of The Furman Advantage, which promises each student an individualized experience that connects them with a team of mentors and engaged learning opportunities.

"We thank The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation for its support of The Furman Advantage and our goal of developing a more diverse

faculty and student body," said Furman President Elizabeth Davis. "Increasing faculty and staff diversity will allow us to continually improve the educational experience for all students and deliver on the promise of The Furman Advantage. This generous grant will allow us to move significantly toward that important goal."

Furman will hire three tenure-track faculty in the first year of the grant

(2017-18), three in the second year (2018-19) and two in the grant's final year (2019-20). Each of the new faculty members will be designated as Mellon Fellows for their first three years.

"These new faculty members will enhance the university's curricular offerings and diversify the breadth of the academic experience at Furman," said Vice President for Academic Affairs and

Provost George Shields. "We will hire in areas where growth is likely to occur and where diverse perspectives are woven into the fabric of the disciplines, which include communication studies, Middle East and Islamic studies, Latin American studies, and African American and African diaspora studies."

The initiative is part of Furman's larger diversity efforts. The university

hired its first Chief Diversity Officer, Michael Jennings, this summer, and this fall's freshman class is expected to be the most diverse in the university's history. The new faculty members who will join the university in 2017-18 are also among the most diverse group in history.

"Furman has a rare opportunity to diversify the breadth of students' academic and cultural experiences and to bring greater socioeconomic, racial, ethnic and ideological diversity to the curriculum and faculty pedagogy," said Eugene Tobin, Mellon's senior program officer in Higher Education and Scholarship in the Humanities. "The university's use of its home city of Greenville as a laboratory to explore the issues of poverty, community health and sustainability will also create robust undergraduate research opportunities."

The Coordinating Council for Economic Development awarded a \$200,000 Closing Fund grant to Greenville County to assist with the costs of building construction.

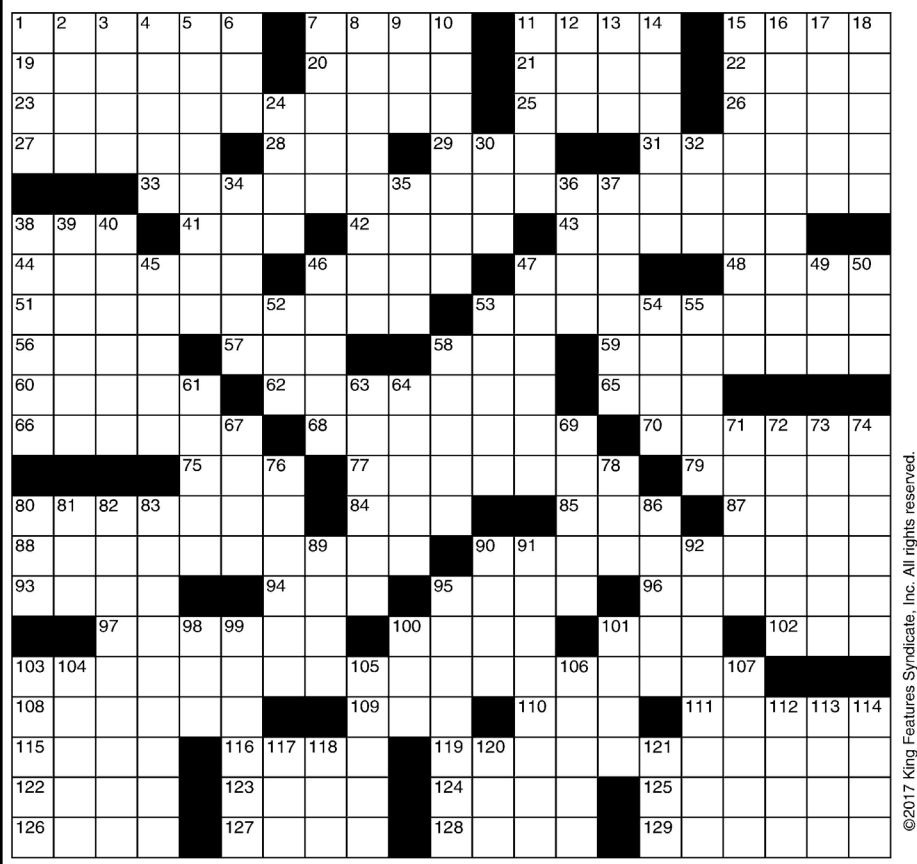

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# As temperatures rise, know the signs of heat exhaustion vs. heat stroke

Popular culture paints the picture of summer with young people surfing at the beach, diving into a cool pool, dancing at an outdoor concert or cheering on the team at a baseball game.

Outdoor activities are popular during the summer, but while you're having fun, stay safe in high temperatures.

During the summer months, the Emergency Center at Spartanburg Medical Center sees a rise in heat stroke and other heat-related illnesses—especially when the temperatures are well above 90 degrees. The majority of these patients are the elderly or those playing sports, said Tom Boyd, MD, director of emergency medicine for Spartanburg Regional Healthcare System.

"Sometimes the medications prescribed to elderly people predispose them to being susceptible to the heat," Dr. Boyd said.

Heat-related illnesses are treatable, but heat stroke is more serious and requires hospitalization.

"It's important to know the differences between feeling hot and having a heat stroke," he said.

The signs of heat exhaustion and heat stroke are different. Heat exhaustion



symptoms include dizziness, nausea, vomiting, headaches, weakness, profuse sweating, excessive thirst, muscle aches and cramps, agitation, and sometimes unconsciousness. Heat exhaustion requires immediate attention, but is not usually life-threatening.

Heat stroke is a more serious matter, with symptoms including vomiting, seizures, disorientation or delirium, unconsciousness, or shortness of breath. It can occur suddenly, without any symptoms of heat exhaustion. Any delay in treatment could be fatal.

"When people get a little light-headed or a little dizzy, typically they only need to be removed from the hot environment and

get some fluids," Dr. Boyd said. "But any kind confusion or change in mental status is a very concerning symptom and an ambulance should be called right away."

A few tips to keep in

mind while staying outdoors:

1. Stay well-hydrated. When you don't feel thirsty, it is still a good idea to drink plenty of cool water. Your body relies on sufficient hydration to be

able to sweat and cool off. Consumption of caffeine and alcohol can actually dehydrate you and result in fluid loss.

2. If possible, plan outdoor activities during cooler times of the day. The

hottest hours of the day are between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Vigorous exercise should be avoided during these hours to keep from being overheated.

3. If someone is overheated, apply cool compresses (such as a bag of ice or ice pack) on the back of their neck and under their armpits.

4. Monitor large groups. When a larger group of individuals is interacting outdoors, have one person watch what is going on in the case of a heat-related emergency. Children, for example, often get engaged in their play and forget to cool off and hydrate themselves.

If notice someone who may be experiencing a heat-related illness, get them cooled down or call 9-1-1.

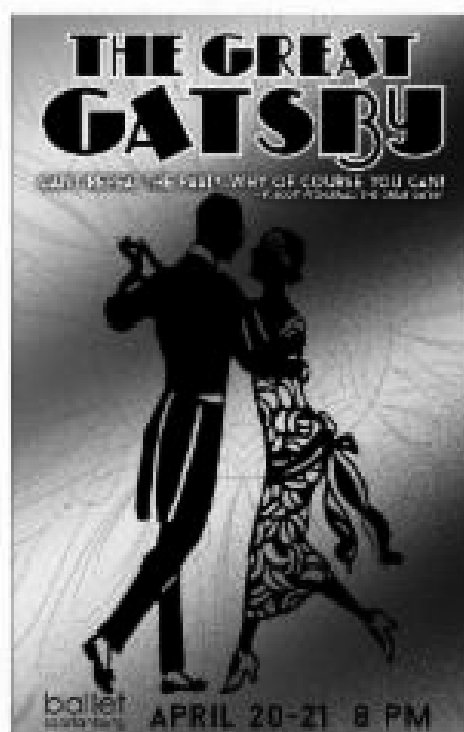
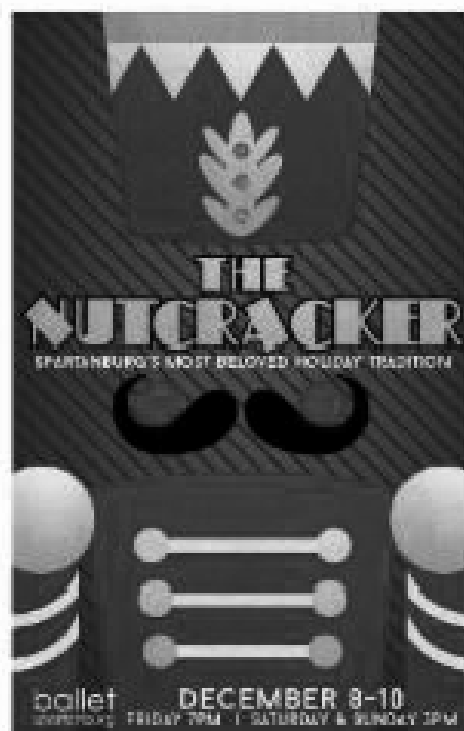
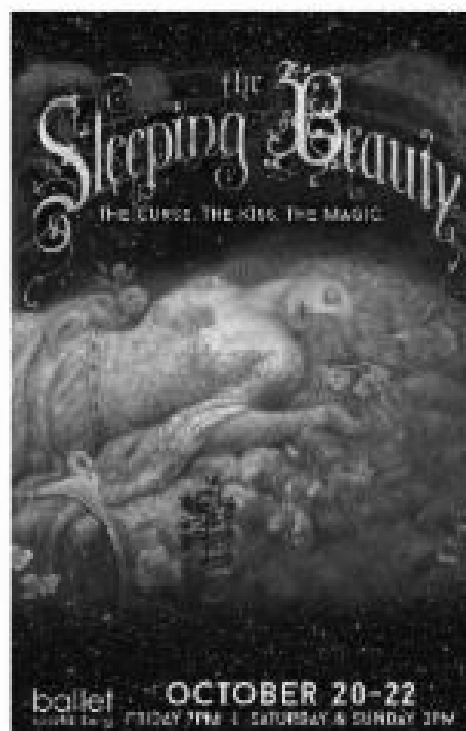
