Pandemic EBT means food for those who need it most

On July 7, 2020, the Department of Social Services began issuing P-EBT, a one-time benefit to help supplement family food costs resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic and prolonged school closures. K-12 students who are enrolled in a free or reduced-price school meals program under the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) or are enrolled in a school that has opted to participate in the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) are eligible to receive P-EBT. Preliminary estimates by DSS indicate that the state will issue approximately \$154 million in federal SNAP benefits under the P-EBT program. Every dollar in federally funded SNAP benefits generates between \$1.50 and \$1.80 in economic activity.

Kemboi named to

ASUN Men's Cross Country All-Decade Team

Atlanta, Ga. – The ASUN Conference announced the Men's Cross Country 2010-2019 All-Decade Team and USC Upstate's Gilbert Kemboi (Eldoret, Kenya) earned a spot on the list.

From 2009-2013, Kemboi blazed a path for the USC Upstate cross country team. The native of Kenya is one of just three athletes to ever be named ASUN Runner of the Year (2010-2012). Kemboi still holds the ASUN record for fastest 8K winning time in ASUN Championship history and he holds the honor of being the highest and fastest finish by an ASUN athlete at Nationals, after a 42nd place finish in 2012. Kemboi also tied the league record for Runner of the Week selections with 10. The two-time All-Southeast Region selection (2011 & 2012) was also the 2009 ASUN Freshman of the Year. Kemboi is a member of both the 2011 and 2012 USC Upstate ASUN Cross Country Championship Teams. The Kenyan left USC Upstate holding the school record in both the 8K (23:22.28) and the 10K (29:47.31).

USC Upstate was a member of the ASUN Conference from 2007-18. The Spartans joined the Big South Conference on July 1, 2018.

Spartanburg Little Theatre to suspend all productions until Spring 2021

With deep regret, and heavy hearts, Spartanburg Little Theatre has announced the cancellation of all productions through February of 2021 due to health concerns for their performers, staff, and audience members, as COVID-19 cases continue to rise in South Carolina. This applies to scheduled productions of *Heathers*, *Sister Act*, *The Great Gatsby*, *Sh-Boom! Life Could Be a Dream*, *Every Christmas Story Ever Told*, and the *A Night at Studio 54* fundraiser.

The theatre has been monitoring national, state, and local guidelines since mid-March; trying to determine a plan to reopen safely. However, as there is still no timeline allowing for the reopening of performing arts venues in South Carolina, and many unknown and potential risks to the health of theatre participants and audience members still exist, the difficult decision was made to halt all planned productions and events until spring of 2021.

More than 80% of Spartanburg Little Theatre's revenue comes from ticket sales, contributions, sponsorships, ad sales, and schooltime performances for area educators and youth. The loss of that income will have a significant impact on the financial and artistic health of the theatre and the way in which the organization is able to reemerge and navigate a post-COVID 19 future. Fresh salmon can be baked, broiled, grilled or pan-fried in 10 minutes or less. This recipe for Italian-Style Microwave Salmon is the perfect dish to conquer your "fear of fish." Eat more salmon and ride the "wave" this summer by using your microwave to get in and out of the kitchen in record time!

ITALIAN-STYLE MICROWAVE SALMON

3 pounds salmon fillets with skin, thawed, washed and patted dry

1 tablespoon poultry seasoning

1 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon black pepper

1 cup Italian salad dressing

1/4 cup diced green or red bell peppers (or a combination of both)

1 tablespoon orange juice or lemon juice

1. Season both sides of the fillets with the poultry seasoning, salt and pepper. Place the fillets in a shallow microwave-safe baking dish. Fold and tuck the narrow ends of the filets under to make the pieces uniform in shape. This will help the fish to cook evenly. Place the thickest pieces near the edge of the dish.

2. Using a small bowl, mix together the Italian dressing, bell peppers and orange or lemon juice. Pour dressing mixture over the fillets. Cover with microwave-safe plastic wrap. Fold back a small (1-inch) section of the plastic wrap in the corner of the dish to allow steam to vent.

3. Place a small, microwave-safe saucer, upside down, on the turntable in the microwave. Place the dish containing the fillets on top of the saucer to elevate the dish and ensure that the fish cooks evenly. Microwave for 4 to 5 minutes on High. Fish should be moist and flake easily. Serve immediately. Serves 6.

Hubbard chosen to lead UofSC School of Law

William Hubbard, a prominent South Carolina attorney and former president of the American Bar Association, has been named the new dean of the University of South Carolina's School of Law, the state's only public law school. He will officially begin his duties on Aug. 1.

Hubbard is an attorney and partner with the Columbia office of Nelson Mullins, the state's largest firm, and an alumnus of UofSC. He earned a bachelor's degree in history from the university in 1974, graduating magna cum laude, and juris doctorate from the School of Law in 1977. As a student, Hubbard was awarded the Algernon Sydney Sullivan Award, the university's highest student honor.

Hubbard's numerous professional affiliations include service as the president of the American Bar

Association from 2014-2015, past president of both the American Bar Endowment and the American Bar Foundation, and current chair of the board of directors of The World Justice Project. A longtime supporter of the university, he has served as a member of its Board of Trustees since 1986 and as chair from 1996-2000. Hubbard received the Order of the Palmetto in 2002, the state's highest civilian recognition awarded for service to the state of South Carolina.

"I am truly humbled to have the opportunity to work with the law school family, as well as our external stakeholders to bring additional support to the law school," Hubbard said. "I am most excited to be able to work with our students to ensure they have the tools to continue to develop their advocacy skills, respect for the rule of law, and passion for justice. These students will be

South Carolina's leaders of tomorrow. I will do everything I can to help them reach their full potential as lawyers and citizens."

Hubbard, who will step down as a university trustee, was chosen after an extensive national

search and will succeed Dean Rob Wilcox, who is retiring after 34 years with UofSC as a professor and serving nine years as dean.

"Under the inspired leadership of Dean Rob Wilcox, the University of South Carolina School of Law is excelling in exciting ways," Hubbard said. "The faculty is producing cutting edge scholarship and teaching at the highest level, the students are energetic and engaged, and the staff is deeply dedicated to the law school's mission." The oldest and only public law school in the state, UofSC's School of Law has a more than 150-year tradition of excellence. With a student enrollment of more than 600, its programs comprise a juris doctorate, 12 dual-degree programs and a Children's Law Concentration. Students benefit from law school partnerships with the National Advocacy Center, the training ground for the U.S. Department of Justice; the Rule of Law Collaborative, a university-wide initiative promoting justice and human rights; the Nelson Mullins Riley & Scarborough Center on Professionalism, promoting ethics and professionalism in the legal

profession; and the school's Children's Law Center, ensuring the best outcomes for cases involving children through education and training.

The all-volunteer Pro Bono program — the oldest in the nation — celebrates its 30th anniversary this year. The School of Law also is the only U.S. law school to offer its students a course taught at Gray's Inn, one of London's four Inns of Court.

"William Hubbard is an extraordinary choice for dean of our School of Law," said interim Provost Tayloe Harding. "His experience is unique and profound, his vision and reach bold and dynamic, and his posture for success and significant achievement for our School inspiring."

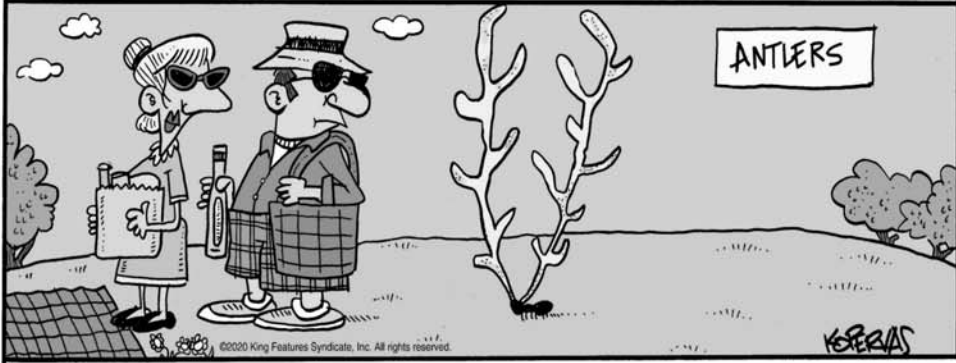

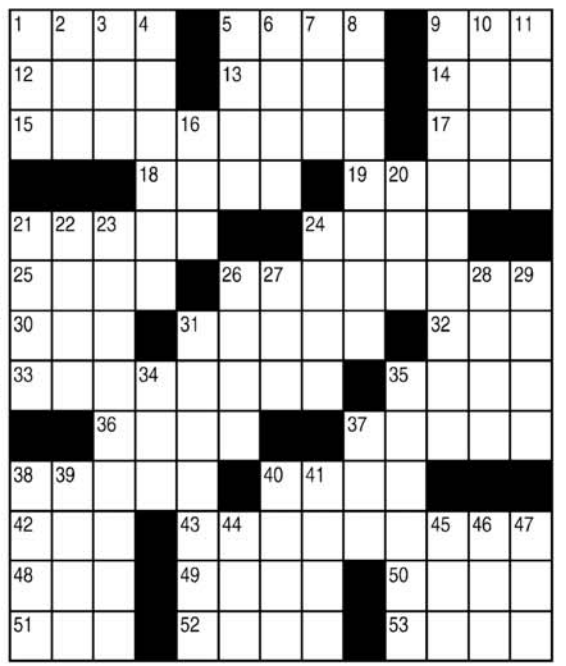

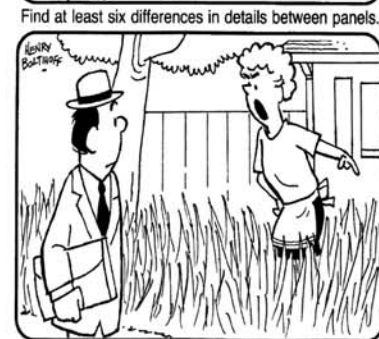
