City of Inman, Spartanburg Sanitary Sewer District receive grants for enhancing water, sewer and stormwater infrastructure

Columbia - The S.C. Rural Infrastructure Authority (RIA) has approved grant assistance for 26 communities, totaling more than \$12 million, to strengthen water, sewer and storm water infrastructure. This brings the number of projects awarded to 54 in Fiscal Year 2019, totaling \$25.7 million.

Access to adequate water, sewer and stormwater infrastructure is critical to supporting South Carolina's quality of life, as well as opening doors for economic development. The state is growing in population, business investment and jobs.

The City of Inman and Spartanburg Sanitary Sewer District received \$500,000 each for sewer system improvements.

I-85 reconstruction from mile markers 69 - 77 experiencing multiple traffic changes

Closure of the I-26 westbound to I-85 southbound ramp began June 1st and will last until mid-August. Travelers should use I-85 Business to I-85 southbound.

Closure of the I-26 eastbound to I-85 southbound ramp also began June 1st and will last until mid-August. Travelers should use I-85 Business to I-85 southbound.

Effective Tuesday night, June 4th, at 9 pm, the I-85 southbound off-ramp to Highway 9 was re-opened.

Effective June 4th, the southbound off-ramp and southbound on-ramp at I-85 and US 176/585 was closed for construction activities.

Drivers traveling through and around the construction zone are asked to be aware of equipment and crews working adjacent to traffic at all times. Motorists can use SC DOT's 511 Traveler system, <http://www.511sc.org/>, for updates to help make travel decisions. Calling all local musicians!

In the Summer of 2017, Chapman Cultural Center launched programming for Spartanburg's Downtown Cultural District. Through dynamic and diverse offerings, the hope is to support an economically vibrant city for broad community benefit. As part of programming efforts, Chapman Cultural Center will be coordinating live street music and performances by local artists.

Currently, performances are scheduled to be held near four street intersections including Liberty St. & East Main St.; Church St. & East Main St.; Magnolia St. & Dunbar St.; and W. Main St. Pocket Park by The Coffee Bar. The live performances will take place Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays, concluding in October.

Goals for downtown programming include increasing: pedestrian traffic, retail sales for local businesses, hospitality revenues, use of downtown parking garages, and diversity of both performing artists and audience.

Spartanburg Chamber introduces SURGE Leadership pilot program

At its Centennial Celebration, the Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce introduced SURGE, a new leadership program designed to create high-impact change in Spartanburg.

The inaugural class of SURGE will kick off in August featuring 12 community partners selected by the Chamber's Executive Board. 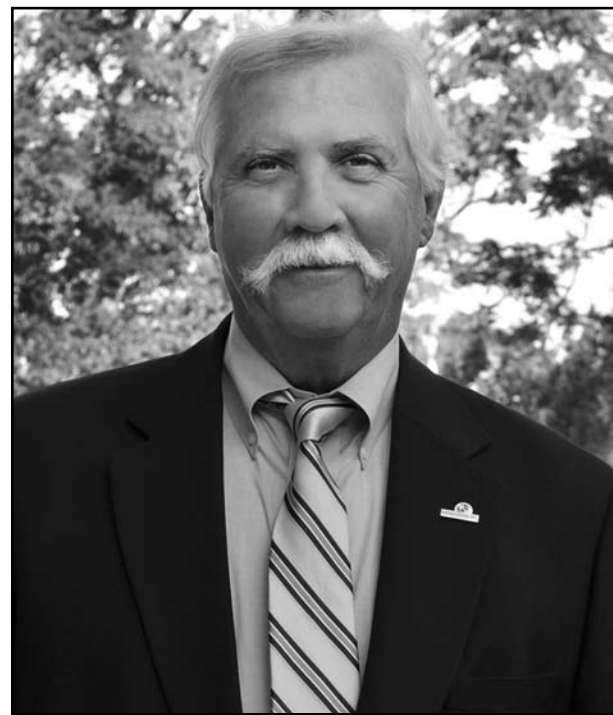

Carter, who announced his retirement earlier this year effective June 30, was surprised with the highest civilian award in South Carolina during the event.

"As an outstanding leader in the area of economic development, you

have demonstrated an uncommon commitment to the highest standards in all you do. Your extraordinary efforts - and success - in recruiting billions of dollars in global business investment to the state has resulted in the creation of countless jobs, brighter futures and promising opportunities for individuals and families throughout our state," said S.C. Gov. Henry McMaster. "You have made a positive impact, and one that will last for generations to come."

Carter was a key figure in many of the public-private partnerships that led to significant economic development in Spartanburg County. He played an integral role in attracting major firms, including BMW, Toray, Amazon, Adidas, Michelin, Keurig Dr. Pepper and many more. During his tenure in Spartanburg, Carter recruited \$16 billion in investment and 50,000 jobs.

In the last five years, nearly a quarter of the state's overall investment has come from announcements in Spartanburg County.

"Carter's record of success is unparalleled. Carter is of the utmost integrity, and his positive spirit is contagious. His record of success is remarkable and the Order of the Palmetto serves as a capstone to commemorate the impact Carter has had on Spartanburg County's economy and the lives of those who live and work here," said Spartanburg County Councilman and longtime colleague David Britt. "It was an honor to see Carter, a man who so often focuses the spotlight and praise on others, be recognized for the years and years of hard work he has taken on here in Spartanburg."

Carter will remain in Spartanburg and will work on a part-time basis with the EFG as Director of Special Projects effective July 1.

Motivating your kids to do more

Kids can be amazing. They develop new cell phone apps, set athletic records, volunteer with the elderly, and perform lots of good deeds. Unfortunately, much of the time it seems these are someone else's children.

For many parents, the reality is kids sleeping till noon, buried in video games or so busy monitoring social media that they only surface for meals. This is even more obvious now with kids on summer vacation and no longer disappearing to school where we at least assume they are accomplishing something positive.

So how can a parent get the child in their home to be more active, or at least to contribute more to the household? A first step in that direction is simply to decide what your realistic expectations are for your child. If there are constant arguments and shouting about what isn't being done, what actions by your child would limit those arguments and make you all feel better?

The answer lies in specific goals, not just broad generalizations. Your starting point should be to negotiate some activities with your kids that will achieve something worthwhile and specific for your home and your child. You want to replace inactivity with positive accomplishment.

One simple goal might be to have your child take on one or more household chores. Maybe unloading the dishwasher, walking the dog each evening, or doing thirty minutes of yard work each day. Or it might be a positive growth activity, like reading books or getting a certain amount of daily exercise. It helps to have a structure for these activities. Set specific times or deadlines for when required activities are to be accomplished.

Step two is to provide motivation to help them want to complete the assigned chores. A negative motivation might be to cut off electronic gadget access until the assigned activity is completed.

Or a positive reward motivation could be getting an allowance, or an increase in a current allowance. If a desired reward is a major purchase, you can keep a running record of successful accomplishments with a clear goal of what's needed to earn that purchase.

The key is to develop specific activities that move your kids in desired directions and that make them feel good about doing required activities, even the most boring ones. Chores shouldn't be punishments, but rather activities that contribute positively to the family, household, and child him or herself.

AAA Carolinas: Memorial Day travel by the numbers

Charlotte, N.C. - AAA Carolinas projected an estimated 1,300,000 North Carolinians and 615,000 South Carolinians traveled during Memorial Day weekend (a 3.6 percent increase from last year), the highest travel volume on record since AAA began tracking holiday travel volumes in 2000.

"While gas prices have been up and down across the Carolinas, they are shaping up to be around 15-to-20 cents cheaper than last Memorial Day weekend, so we expect many Carolinians to hit the road to celebrate the long weekend," said Tiffany Wright, AAA Carolinas spokesperson. "For those of you getting behind the wheel, please practice safety by obeying traffic safety laws, putting away all distractions and focusing your attention on the road."

North Carolina's gas price average in 2018 was \$2.80, and South Carolina's was \$2.65. As of today, May 20, North Carolina's average is \$2.62 and South Carolina's is \$2.45.

By the Numbers:

- * 1,705,000 Carolinians (close to 1,166,000 North Carolinians and 539,000 South Carolinians) drove to their destinations, a 3.5% increase from last year.

- * 139,000 Carolinians (roughly 99,000 North Carolinians and 40,000 South Carolinians) took to the skies this Memorial Day, increasing air travel by 4.8%.

- * 70,800 Carolinians (37,000 North Carolinians and 33,800 South Carolinians), an increase of 3.8% from 2018, looked to other modes of transportation, including cruises, trains and buses.

For the 37.6 million Americans traveling by automobile, INRIX, in collaboration with AAA, predicted drivers will experience the greatest amount of congestion on Thursday, May 23 and Friday, May 24 in the late afternoon as commuters left work early and mix with holiday travelers. INRIX expected travel delays on major roads to be more than three times longer than normal.

Increased Danger on the Roads

Over the 2018 Memorial Day weekend, there were 3,462 reported crashes in North Carolina, resulting in 17 fatalities and 1,009 reported collisions resulting in eight fatalities in South Carolina. Memorial Day weekend marks the beginning of the "100 Deadliest Days", the period when teen traffic deaths historically rise, according to the AAA Foundation for

Traffic Safety. It runs from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Last year, there were 10,609 teen related collisions resulting in 31 fatalities in North Carolina and 1,008 collisions resulting in 501 injuries and 12 fatalities in South Carolina.

Travelers to see relief in lower hotel and car rental costs

While road trippers paid more to fill up their vehicles at the gas pump, some

of that additional expense could be made up with lower prices on car rentals and hotels this Memorial Day. According to AAA's Leisure Travel Index, car rental prices have declined 7% compared with last year, with an average daily rate of \$55. Mid-range hotels are between 2% and 3% cheaper this year, with an average nightly rate of \$146 and \$183, respectively, for AAA Two and Three Diamond Rated properties.

Meanwhile, airfares are holding steady compared with last Memorial Day, for an average roundtrip price of \$171.

Expert tips for lighting your home's outdoor spaces

Next, select task lighting to add focused illumination that makes entrances and pathways visible and shadow-free. A rule of thumb

for lighting doorways is to size lighting in proportion to the door itself. Select wall sconces and lanterns that measure anywhere from 1/4 to 1/3 the size of the door. Mount outdoor sconces and lanterns at eye level, with the center of the light source between 5 1/2 to 6 feet off the ground and 8 to 10 feet apart.

Install soft, non-glaring path fixtures about 14 inches high that direct most of the light downward. Define the edges of the path by placing lights about one foot from one or both sides of the walkway, staggering the placement slightly to create a natural flow.

For steps, install lights directly into the risers. This

soft light provides just enough brightness to mark each tread and prevent glare.

Finally, add accent and decorative lighting that accentuates your home's architectural features. For entertaining areas, select wall-mounted fixtures such as sconces or lanterns, or overhead lighting that

focuses task light on work surfaces. Outdoor chandeliers and pendants are a stylish way to bring the design appeal of indoor lighting outside. For a professional, pulled-together look, choose light fixtures with the same finish as door pulls, fencing and outdoor furniture.

Other accent lighting choices that add flair include post lights, spotlights, strip lights and water-feature lighting.

As a finishing touch, use timers, dimmers or motion sensors to control lights, turning them on or down as desired.
