The Rotary Club of Spartanburg is providing grants to nine local non-profit organizations to make a positive impact on local youth and community.

Spartanburg Rotary Club gives away \$30,000

The Rotary Club of Spartanburg is providing grants to nine local non-profit organizations and awarding a total amount of \$30,000 to help them with their important work.

This year the Youth Opportunity Grant Committee received fifteen grant proposals from area non-profits requesting a total of \$67,950. From those fifteen worthy organizations the members of the Youth Opportunity Grant were tasked with awarding \$30,000. The committee diligently and thoughtfully reviewed all of the applications to find the programs that would create the largest positive impact on our youth and community.

Here are the award recipients and an overview of their programs:

*** Bethlehem Center was awarded \$5,000.00**

This grant will be used to support the “S.O.A.R. Summer Camp” program. The S.O.A.R. Summer Camp is a 7-week free program for low- and moderate-income youth ages 5 to 13. It will provide academic support, tutoring, leadership development, goal setting and financial literacy activities with field trips to take part in art and dance education. The program anticipates serving 130 children in Spartanburg over the Summer with 50 children attending each camp session.

Children's Cancer Partners of the Carolinas, Inc. was awarded \$2,000.00

This award will be used to support the families of 20 children in the City of Spartanburg who are and will be in various stages of treatment, remission, and survivorship this year. The grant will help pay toward hard costs for frequent, routine trips for treatment in Greenville or beyond, as well as the provision of emotional support to the children – our superheroes – and their families.

Girls on the Run Upstate SC was awarded \$2,000.00

This grant will provide twenty girls in Spartanburg's Title 1 schools with the opportunity to participate in the Girls on the Run program in the upcoming school year. These girls will receive 20 weeks of programming free of charge

and will be given tools to increase their activity levels, develop positive self-perception of their academic abilities, and reduce anxiety and depression. In short – these girls will be helped to discover their own limitless potential.

Healthy Smiles of Spartanburg was awarded \$2,000.00

Healthy Smiles of Spartanburg serves to advocate and promote the health of Spartanburg County children by providing community dental health screenings, education, and free oral health services to qualifying children. Healthy Smiles of Spartanburg collaborates to improve the health and futures of low-income, uninsured children in Spartanburg County by providing access to a school-linked oral health care program, prevention and education. In addition, they schedule, organize, and provide financial assistance for referrals for children in need of emergency referrals for specialized treatment that will require the use of sedation.

HALTER was awarded \$5,000.00

This grant will support its collaboration with Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Upstate, My Brother's Keeper, and BLOOM of the Upstate to provide equine assisted experiential learning to socially, emotionally, and economically vulnerable youth to help incorporate new knowledge, skills, and abilities for self-awareness, self-management, social awareness, relationship skills, and responsible decisionmaking.

Palmetto Council – Boy Scouts of America was awarded \$3,500.00

This grant will support the Palmetto Council's partnership with the Spartanburg Housing Authority and Mt. Moriah Baptist Church by providing youth from Prince Hall Apartments with an opportunity to experience character development programs at the weeklong summer camp held at the Glendale Outdoor Leadership School. These funds will allow over 25 youth to participate in this summer camp experience through which they will be biking, bouldering, fishing, and hiking and engaging in other activities focused on

health, safety, first-aid, physical activity, nutrition, and outdoor skills.

Spartanburg Methodist College was awarded \$3,500.00

This grant will support SMC's holiday housing initiative. Recognizing that some students do not have a safe housing to which to return during the college's four-week holiday break, SMC will open its dorms to thirty homeless or at-risk youth enrolled at the school. These funds will provide room and board, electricity, heat and food to students during the four-week holiday break so that these students will have the best opportunity to continue their studies in the spring semester and achieve their goal of a college education.

Upstate Workforce Futures Corp. was awarded \$2,000.00

This grant will be used to provide driver's education training to students involved in the ACHIEVE program at USC Upstate and the Intentional Program at Broome High School. These funds will relieve a barrier to employment by making the modalities of transportation more practically accessible – allowing these young people to be punctual, and productive employees with a bright working future.

YMCA of Greater Spartanburg was awarded \$5,000.00

These funds will be used to provide FREE tutoring services at all six of the YMCA's Spartanburg Afterschool Program sites for the 2022-23 school year to support and improve the participants' academic performance. Specifically, these funds will help the YMCA employ qualified, trained tutors to provide individual and small group tutoring services three days per week, two hours per day, for thirty weeks.

Tutors will be either certified teachers, retired teachers, teacher assistants, education majors from local colleges, or college students who receive training and supervision from a certified teacher.

Youth Opportunity Grants have been a line item in the Spartanburg Rotary Club budget for many years with funding coming from member support.

Canton china

Canton china with its blue and white decoration has been a popular collectible for many years, but few can distinguish it from the other early or modern Chinese blue and white china. It has been popular for centuries partly because cobalt blue coloring was safe to use when decorating dishes. Red ware and pewter contained dangerous lead.

By 1710, the Chinese made at least four patterns of Chinese export porcelain that included landscape designs. Two of the most popular were Nanking (1770-1820) and Canton (1785- 1853). Nanking was decorated with a willow tree, boat, teahouse, birds and a fence. Canton had symbolic decorations including a border band of blue and white scallops representing rain and clouds, a bridge, water, rocks, a pagoda, scholar, waterwheel, riverboats or sampans, two kinds of orchid leaves, and a willow tree. Each symbol had a meaning reflecting endurance, harmony in nature, movement, the old leading the young, or life.

There are other unnamed blue and white patterns from the same period and even a similar English willow pattern. Later Canton pieces are thicker, heavier and have less detailed decorations. There are 92 known shapes of Canton including chamber pots, slop pots, plain pitchers, cider jugs, oyster bowls, patty pan bowls (used to bake crust), helmet pitchers, butter dishes, butter pats (five shapes) and hot water plates. Sometimes a color is added over the blue designs. This adds color to the piece but often covers the original blue decorations.

Q: My mother gave a little dish to my father as a hint to stop smoking. When and why was it made, and is it valuable?

A: Your dish is probably part of a set of small ashtrays used at elegant tablecloth dinner parties in the 1900s. Since almost everyone over 18 smoked cigarettes, it was customary to put a small dish or um at each table that held a few cigarettes and, of course, an ashtray. Between courses and after dinner, it was OK to light a cigarette or even a cigar. The dish was made by Copelan Spode, perhaps as early as 1900 but very popular after 1915. The 6-by-9-inch dish was listed recently at \$70 to \$90 online, and one sold at a show for \$58.

Around the Upstate

Clemson University, Prisma Health expand collaboration in aging research, education and community outreach programs

Clemson University and Prisma Health celebrate the expansion of their research and clinical collaborations with the opening of new space to accommodate the expanding community research and clinical programs of the Clemson University Institute for Engaged Aging. The institute now occupies the top floor of the Prisma Health Oconee Memorial Hospital in Seneca, South Carolina.

Leadership from both organizations, researchers, faculty and staff launched the institute in its new comprehensive center specializing in aging, cognition research and outreach.

According to Clemson University President Jim Clements, the partnership between the University and Prisma Health in aging research has already yielded important outcomes. He sees a dedicated space for this work as necessary to increase the positive impact on citizens in South Carolina and beyond.

"Aging, and the challenges that may accompany it, can affect us all, and is something many loved ones and caregivers face every day," Clements said. "That makes the work being done by Clemson University and Prisma Health timely and vital considering the ever-increasing proportion of older adults across our state and nation."

The Institute for Engaged Aging is a program of the Clemson University College of Behavioral, Social and Health Sciences' Department of Psychology. It was created to discover, develop and disseminate best practices for engaged aging through research, education and community outreach. Current institute initiatives focus on the brain, mobility and technologies that enable older adults to be engaged in family and community living regardless of their social, economic or health status.

As part of the expanded collaboration, Clemson University and Prisma Health Oconee Memorial Hospital are partnering to explore a new advanced 3T

MRI unit to be housed at Oconee Memorial Hospital for research as well as patient diagnostics. 3T technology differs from standard MRI units (1.5 T) in that it allows more refined imaging detail, particularly related to changes in the brain, and is a critical tool for research related to aging. A Certificate of Need application for the MRI was filed with the state on Feb. 18, 2022 and is currently under review.

Both institutions are working to improve access to MRI technology for researchers, patients and health care providers. Providing this technology at Prisma Health Oconee Memorial Hospital ensures patients who live in Oconee County will no longer have to travel outside of their service area for imaging studies that require the 3T magnet.

"The challenges inherent to research and patient care related to aging and cognition are varied and multidisciplinary," said Mark S. O'Halla, president and chief executive officer of Prisma Health. "Our partnership and the physical space afforded to the institute not only embed it within a healthcare organization, but also create a hub where faculty, staff and researchers can come together to provide important services accessible to community members close to where they live."

The official opening celebration is an important milestone in the completion of the institute's new home, and researchers spanning multiple Clemson University colleges and departments have been actively working in sections of the Oconee space for months.

A large portion of this work has been dedicated to

Clemson's part in a multi-university research project funded by the National Institutes of Health's National Institute on Aging. Clemson was chosen as one of six sites across the U.S. to conduct this study, which is the largest primary prevention trial to date designed to test the effectiveness of computer-based training to protect against Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.

The Clemson University portion of the grant, \$3.5 million, was awarded to Lesley Ross, Ph.D., Smart-LIFE Endowed Chair in Aging and Cognition in the College of Behavioral, Social and Health Sciences; director of the Clemson University Institute for Engaged Aging; and associate professor in the University's Department of Psychology. Ross is leading the Clemson-PACT Study with Christine Phillips, Ph.D., research assistant professor in the Department of Psychology, who is leading participant recruitment and retention efforts across sites.

Leslie Hossfeld, Ph.D., dean of the College of Behavioral, Social and Health Sciences, said the institute and the work of the many researchers involved serve as great examples of the power of collaboration among institutions and disciplines.

"The Institute for Engaged Aging is a premier program for our College and Clemson University," Hossfeld said. "It demonstrates the importance of interdisciplinary research and scholarly engagement in building people and communities."

Other researchers currently working with the institute include:

Christine Phillips, Ph.D., of the Department of Psychology who focuses on understanding individual and environmental-level influences on behavioral and functional outcomes and applying this knowledge in real-world settings.

Marieke Van Puymbroeck, Ph.D., of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Tourism Management who has introduced a Balance Lab that uses evidence-based programs and interventions to improve balance and reduce falls in older adults.

Kapil Chahil Madathil, Ph.D., of the Glenn Department of Civil Engineering

who is leading research on the design, development and evaluation of health information technologies to improve the delivery and quality of care for older adults.

Kaileigh Byrne, Ph.D., of the Department of Psychology who is examining the effect of social isolation and loneliness on cognitive functioning and decision making and how decision-making strategies change across the lifespan.

Zahra Rahemi, Ph.D., RN, of the School of Nursing who is focused on enhancing the quality of end-of-life care and reducing health disparities in end-of-life care for racially

diverse older adults and persons with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias.

Nicole Davis, Ph.D., AGCNP-BC, GNP-BC, of the School of Nursing who uses her research to address health disparities in the management of Alzheimer's Disease and related dementias among underserved groups with a focus on caregiver support and the use of technology applications.

Winifred Elysse Newman, Ph.D., of the College of Architecture, Arts and Humanities who studies space perception in older adults and adults with neurological disorders. She uses advanced digital technologies in applied research in spatial and environmental analysis to address problems in mobility in aging.

The Institute for Engaged Aging is part of the University's College of Behavioral, Social and Health Sciences (CBSHS). Established in July 2016, CBSHS is a 21st-century, land-grant college that combines work in seven disciplines — communication; nursing; parks, recreation and tourism management; political science; psychology; public health sciences; sociology, anthropology and criminal justice — to further its mission in "building people and communities" in South Carolina and beyond.
