Upstate residents plead guilty to mail theft conspiracy

Columbia - United States Attorney Beth Drake stated on April 25th that Nerissa A. Orr, age 42, of Simpsonville, and Craig A. Mann, age 21, of Greenville, pled guilty in federal court in Greenville, to a conspiracy to commit mail theft. United States District Judge Bruce Howe Hendricks, of Charleston, accepted the plea and will impose sentence after she has reviewed the presentence report which will be prepared by the U.S. Probation Office.

Evidence presented at the change of plea hearing established that the defendants stole mail in and around Greenville County in an effort to obtain bank account numbers, routing numbers, and identification information. Once in possession of this material they would create counterfeit checks and negotiate them to obtain money for methamphetamine.

Ms. Drake stated the maximum penalty defendants can receive is a fine of \$250,000 and/or imprisonment for 5 years, plus a special assessment of \$100.

New Study: South Carolina could save over \$37 million by helping workers save for retirement

Columbia - Recently AARP South Carolina released a new report showing that South Carolina could save taxpayers \$37,450,872 over the next 15 years by helping people save more of their own money for retirement. AARP is working to create access to private savings vehicles for the 826,790 South Carolinians who lack access to a workplace retirement savings plan, like a 401(k), by setting up programs that are similar to 529 college savings plans for retirement.

Without access to retirement savings plans for the 55 million Americans who currently cannot utilize such plans, state public safety net programs, such as Medicaid and food stamps, could cost taxpayers \$86 billion more nationally over the next 15 years. This does not include Social Security or Medicare.

The new report – from the University of Maine – comes against a background of increasing interest in the states regarding state-based retirement security solutions.

But the research also comes against a backdrop of controversial Congressional deliberations over House Joint Resolution 66, which would roll back this DOL guidance and have a negative impact on state flexibility and initiatives. A Congressional vote could have a chilling effect on state and local retirement savings initiatives, but AARP remains steadfast in its backing for continuing action at the state level to make these vital programs a reality.

Owens named Chesnee's new head football coach

Spartanburg District Two recently announced that Bill Owens has been named the new Head Football Coach at Chesnee High School.

Owens is no stranger to the District or the Chesnee community. For the last six years he has served as athletic director at Chesnee High School.

"One of the things that I fell in love with Chesnee over my last six years here as athletic director is watching the community we have rally around our kids," Owens said. "Everything in Chesnee centers around the church and around our school and they support every aspect

of Chesnee High School, the athletics, arts, anything that is going on here. It's one of the things that drew me here and one of the reasons that I wanted to become the next head football coach at Chesnee."

Owens has previously coached at Ninety-Six, West Oak and Union High schools. He also served as head coach at Indian Land and Broome High schools. In 2004 Owens led the Centurions to a State Championship.

Chesnee High School principal Tom Ezell said he thinks Owens is the perfect fit to coach the Eagles. "I've known Bill for most of his career," Ezell said.

"He has been a fantastic athletic director and he will be equally as good of a football coach. I think Bill will bring some excitement to the program."

Spartanburg Two superintendent Dr. Scott Mercer said Owens will assume his coaching duties immediately and the District will soon begin the search for a new athletic director at Chesnee High School.

"We have found Coach Owens to be a man of character and feel strongly he will keep the program at Chesnee High School moving in a direction that will make the community proud," Mercer said.

New leadership at Spartanburg Chamber

The Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce has named a new Chair of the Executive Board. Former Chair Todd Horne tendered his resignation, at the April 10 meeting of the Executive Board, as he is diverting his time and energy into a campaign to become the next Mayor for the City of Spartanburg. In accordance with the Chamber's governance structure, Horne is now Immediate Past Chair, and John Easterling is the new Chair of the Executive Board.

Easterling stated, "I'm not sure if I can articulate what Todd and his leadership have meant to our organization and community. I could outline dozens of Todd's contributions to our county and region but suffice it to say, thanks to Todd Horne, the Chamber is relevant again and is in the perfect position to lead meaningful community change well into the future. In 2016, \$555 million in new investment flowed to our county which resulted in 1,999 new jobs. Spartanburg's most iconic structure, the Montgomery Building, went under contract and will be completely renovated by the end of 2018. Education at all levels, both public and private, continues to garner regional, state and national acclaim not to mention the \$300+ million in education capital projects currently underway.

It's hard to imagine a more promising time to serve as Chair of the Chamber's Executive Board, and I am honored to serve alongside my fellow Executive Board members. We are blessed to have an incredibly capa-

ble Economic Futures Group, Convention & Visitors Bureau, Chamber and OneSpartanburg staff, and I firmly believe with these dedicated professionals in place, we've just begun to realize Spartanburg's potential.

In accordance with the Chamber's governance structure, Easterling's term will conclude on December 31, 2019.

So who are professional counselors?

Too many people know only one aspect of the counseling profession, and may be unaware of all that professional counselors have to offer. In many cases, the only contact a family may have had was with a school counselor when their children were in elementary, junior or high school. Yet while the counseling profession includes school counselors, they're only one part of the profession.

For starters, it's important to understand that professional counselors must complete quite a bit of specialized education before they can work in the counseling field. All professional counselors today hold at least a Master's degree, and growing numbers have earned doctoral degrees. In addition, as part of their education, they have typically spent at least 3,000 hours in supervised clinics to earn their license.

As part of their education and training, most professional counselors specialize in specific areas of counseling. They may focus on wellness, on career development, on relationship issues, on working with children or in any of the many other areas in which people may need help.

And help is what counselors have to offer. Often people are under the mistaken impression that when someone sits down with a professional counselor, that counselor is going to be to tell the person how to change and live his or her life. The reality is that counselors don't dictate to their clients, but rather assist the clients in discovering for themselves what issues are concerning them and what alternatives there might be to overcome problems and develop solutions.

Yes, some people who work with a professional counselor may be facing severe lifestyle or mental health issues, but the majority of the clients with whom counselors work are just regular people who are looking for help with everyday issues. Maybe the person is unhappy in his or her career, maybe there are relationship issues, maybe the person is feeling depressed without really know why. Working with a counselor is a means for finding answers that are often difficult to discover on one's own.

Finding a professional counselor to work with isn't difficult to do. Your physician or local mental health center can usually make recommendations. The American Counseling Association's website also offers a free referral service to locate a counselor in your area. It's online at www.counseling.org/findacounselor. Clicking there can be the first step in finding professional assistance to a happier and more fulfilling life.

Two Upstate school leaders receive top honors

Greenville County Schools' Superintendent, Dr. Burke Royster, has been named the 2018 South Carolina Superintendent of the Year, and Spartanburg School District 7's Deputy Superintendent, Dr. Terry Pruitt, has been named District Level Administrator of the Year by the South Carolina Association of School Administrators (SCASA).

'Operation Real Time': Spartanburg man enters guilty plea in federal court on gun charges

Columbia - United States Attorney Beth Drake stated on April 26th that Xavier Lee Gist, age 22, of Spartanburg, pled guilty in federal court in Greenville, to possession of a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime, and possession with intent to distribute crack cocaine. United States District Judge Bruce Howe Hendricks, of Charleston, accepted the plea and will impose sentence after she has reviewed the presentation report which will be prepared by the U.S. Probation Office.

Evidence presented at the change of plea hearing established that on May 19, 2016, officers with the Spartanburg Police Department observed a silver Nissan Maxima with North Carolina tags fail to signal a left hand turn. Officers initiated a traffic stop but the vehicle failed to stop. Officers were able to identify the driver as Xavier Gist by sight during the pursuit based on prior interactions with Gist. Gist jumped from the vehicle and was apprehended after a brief foot chase. Officers, with the vehicle, observed in plain sight a Smith and Wesson 9mm handgun on the passenger seat. Prior to the vehicle being towed, officers recovered a silver whisk and a set of digital scales from the center console. Approximately 4.4 grams of cocaine base (crack) was located on the street where Gist jumped from the vehicle.

Gist faces up to ten years in federal prison for the offense and remains in federal custody.

The case was investigated by the Spartanburg Police Department and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF). Special Assistant United States Attorney Jennifer Wells, a 7th Circuit Assistant Solicitor designated by Solicitor Barry Barnette to identify and expedite state cases for federal prosecution, handled the case.

Gist was arrested federally as a part of "Operation Real Time." The goal of this program is to identify individuals for federal prosecution with significant criminal histories who continue to actively possess firearms in the Upstate community.

In addition to the Spartanburg Police Department and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives, Real Time's core partners include the Greenville Police Department, the Greenville County Sheriff's Office, the Anderson City Police Department, the South Carolina Department of Probation, Parole, and Pardon Services, the South Carolina Highway Patrol, the Department of Homeland Security, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Drug Enforcement Administration, the 7th Circuit Solicitor's Office, the 13th Circuit Solicitor's Office, and the United States Attorney's Office. Since August of 2015,

the initiative has resulted in the expedited federal prosecution of some 97 defendants and seizure of approximately 130 firearms as well as assorted ammunition from prohibited persons.

U.S. Attorney Beth Drake commended the

partnership between the local, state, and federal agencies that led to the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives and the U.S. Attorney's Office adopting the case, "We work best when we work together. This 'real time' identifica-

tion of high risk offenders is smart policing, and we welcome the opportunity to work alongside our state chiefs and sheriffs in taking violent repeat offenders out of our communities."

Speakers included Secretary of Transportation Christy A. Hall, SCDOT Commission Chairman Woodrow "Woody" W. Willard Jr., of the 4th Congressional District, SCDOT Deputy Secretary for Engineering Leland Colvin, SCDOT Director of Occupational Safety and Health Kenny Eargle and SC Division Administrator of the Federal Highway Administration Emily Lawton.

Secretary of Transportation Christy A. Hall told families of fallen employees during the service, "Today we will pause to remember our fallen colleagues and recognize their ultimate sacrifice on the job for SCDOT and the State of South Carolina.

and a member of SCDOT Aiken Maintenance who was struck and killed when a driver left the roadway on March 13, 2017. 3. Robert Clark, a highway maintenance worker and a member of SCDOT Aiken Maintenance was struck and killed when a driver left the roadway on March 13, 2017. The impact of the loss of these team members is felt everyday within their family, crews and work units. We sincerely miss them and as such there remains a void in our daily lives.
