I-85 reconstruction left lane closure implemented

Please be advised that a left lane closure has been implemented on Northbound I-85 and Southbound I-85 from mile marker 69 to 77, reducing I-85 from three travel lanes to two travel lanes. This lane closure will be in effect for the foreseeable future. Automobile traffic may use Business 85 as an alternate route. ALL truck traffic is directed to stay on I-85.

Road construction to begin on Highway 29

Ashmore Brothers, a division of Rogers Group Inc. will be performing road improvements for the South Carolina Department of Transportation, Spartanburg County Construction Office, on U.S. Highway 29 (Warren B. Abernathy Highway) from Shannon Woods Drive to John B. White Sr. Boulevard. Work is scheduled to begin on or after May 8th. Completion of the work is anticipated to be on or before September 30. Spartanburg Area Chamber hires economic development veteran for new downtown-focused enterprise

The Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce has named Jansen Kent Tidmore to the post of Executive Vice President of the new Downtown Development Partnership.

A native of Dothan, Ala., Tidmore since 2011 has served as the Executive Director of the Dothan Downtown Redevelopment Authority, which was tasked with economic development efforts for Dothan's core downtown. During that time, the DDRA has acquired more than 100,000 square feet of downtown property, developed more than 60,000 square feet of property, and increased the business count to the core area by nearly 40 percent. Some of the DDRA's direct projects include a retail incubator called the Nest on Foster and its tech industry accelerator called the Hub on Troy.

As he did in Dothan, Tidmore will take the helm of a brand-new downtown development-focused entity. Never before in Spartanburg's history has an entity been solely dedicated to downtown investment, job-creation, and quality of place efforts. The Downtown Development Partnership was a central recommendation of the recently released OneSpartanburg plan, a five-year community and economic development strategy developed by the Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce.

Tidmore began his duties in Spartanburg May 1.

USC Upstate professor diagnosed with incurable blood cancer wins first place in literary competition

After being diagnosed with an incurable blood cancer, Dr. Thomas McConnell drew from a remembered conversation with a research nurse and from his own dreams to write *I Have Seen My Death*, which was awarded first place for non-fiction at the 2017 Porter Fleming Literary Competition on April 23 at the Morris Museum of Art. McConnell is a professor of English at the University of South Carolina Upstate.

"This cancer journal is an eloquent meditation on mortality, but it is more than that," said Barry Yeoman, a judge for the Porter Fleming Literary Competition. "Thomas McConnell deftly moves between the scientific and the personal: between the sickening feeling that gripped Anna Bertha Roentgen in 1895 when she saw the first x-rayed hand bones--her own--and McConnell's discovery, many decades later, that he had an incurable blood cancer. McConnell blends this material with precise, vivid language."

McConnell's work has appeared in the Southeast Review, the Connecticut Review, the Cortland Review, Yemassee, Emrys Journal, and the Charleston Post & Courier among other publications. His awards and prizes include an artist's grant from the Elizabeth George Foundation, the Hackney National

Literary Award for the Short Story, Porter Fleming Awards for Fiction, Essay, and Drama, the South Carolina Fiction Project, the H.E. Francis Award, and the Hardagree Award for Fiction. His lectures and readings have taken him to Istanbul, Berlin, and the Sorbonne in Paris. His collection of stories, *A Picture Book of Hell and Other Landscapes*, was published by Texas Tech University Press in 2005. A Fulbright Scholar in the Czech Republic, he taught American literature and creative writing at Masaryk University. His novel of the Czechlands in World War II will be pub-

lished by Hub City Press in 2018

The Porter Fleming Literary Competition recognizes talented writers who reside in Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina and Tennessee and was founded in 1993 by Shirley Fleming to honor her late father, noted author and artist Berry Fleming. The awards are funded by the Porter Fleming Foundation, which was established by Berry Fleming in 1963 as a memorial to his father, Porter Fleming, a prominent Augustan and one of the city's leading philanthropists.

How to help a friend in need

It usually isn't difficult to offer help to a friend or relative. Maybe he or she needs short-term financial assistance, advice about an upcoming vacation, or maybe just a ride to a doctor's appointment. Most of us are ready to step up and help when it's small things like that.

But in some cases, offering help can be much more complicated. This occurs when someone close to us appears to be doing or saying things that we find troubling or disturbing. Offering help in such situations is more difficult because the person hasn't requested our assistance, and, in some cases, may resent our stepping in.

You might struggle over whether you should share your opinions with this friend, worrying that it might jeopardize the relationship. This feeling can hold true whether it's a friend, or someone even closer such as a spouse or another close relative.

The trick is to approach the person with your concerns in a manner that will minimize the risk of insulting or alienating the person. One way to do this is what is sometimes called a "caring confrontation."

It begins by ensuring that you are in a private place and that the conversation is only between the two of you. The initial part of this type of confrontation is simply to describe the behavior that concerns you. You don't want to criticize, interpret or offer personal opinions, but simply to objectively describe the facts as you see them.

It helps to make your description positive, rather than negative and accusatory. Instead of saying "You sure are depressed these days," a more positive spin would simply be, "You don't seem to be quite as happy lately."

The second part of this approach is to ask whether your friend agrees with your observation and to offer an invitation to discuss it.

This "one - two" approach provides an opportunity for your friend to talk about possible issues without positioning you as too nosy or offering to "fix" the problem. Sometimes simply talking about a problem is a major step in helping to work it out.

There may also be more serious issues going on that would benefit from professional help, such as meeting with a professional counselor. In such cases, your job is simply to be supportive and helpful. Doing this can assist someone address what's bothering him or her, and ensure that your relationship is maintained.

Special Ops Soldiers to parachute into S.C. Guard Air & Ground Expo

Fort Bragg, N.C. - The U.S. Army Special Operations Command Parachute Demonstration Team, the Black Daggers, are scheduled to perform a free fall parachute aerial display during the SC Guard Air & Ground Expo, May 6 - 7th.

The team is comprised of volunteers from throughout the Army Special Operation Forces community. Their diverse backgrounds represent various ARSOF elements including Rangers, Special Forces, psychological operations, civil affairs, and support. They deploy worldwide with their units and are defenders of the Nation in overseas contingency operations.

The Black Daggers use the military variant of ram-

air parachutes, which allows a free fall para-

chutist to jump with additional equipment. In addition to the extra weight, the jumper must also withstand high winds, frigid temperatures and low oxygen levels common at high altitude, requiring the jumper to be highly skilled.

Thousands of ARSOF Soldiers have completed multiple combat rotations supporting overseas contingency operations since September 11, 2001. ARSOF remains deployed along with conventional forces and multinational partners ensuring the success of operations, whether in a direct combat or in a humanitarian assistance role.

On any given day, more than 5,500 ARSOF Soldiers are deployed to about 50 countries worldwide.

Parents should know the driving risks on prom and graduation nights

Charlotte, N.C. - Every parent wants their teen to arrive home safely following prom and graduation parties. Parents continue to play an important role as teens take on the responsibilities of driving to these events.

According to a recent AAA study, eighty-seven percent of parents with a teen between the ages of 15 and 18 said they would be less angry if their teen called them for a ride home, instead of getting behind the wheel if they are intoxicated.

"Discuss the importance of driving safely with your teen before these events,"

said AAA Carolinas President and CEO Dave Parsons. "Talking openly to your teen about the dangers of drunk driving, distracted driving and other driving risks greatly increases their chance of getting home safely."

Teen Driving Safety Tips:

Distracted driving - Many teens admit to cell phone use and texting while behind the wheel despite being aware of the dangers. Make a family rule covering these and other distractions that everyone abides by.

Alcohol and drug use -

Eight young people die every day in the U.S. in alcohol-related crashes. Talk with your teen about the dangers of driving drunk or riding with someone who has used alcohol or drugs and enforce strict zero tolerance rules with your teen.

Seat belt use - Seat belt use is the most effective way to save lives and reduce injuries in a crash. Require everyone to buckle up.

Driving with passengers - Teen drivers' crash risks multiply when there are teen passengers. Set limits and enforce them.

Peer pressure - Talk with

your teen about the importance of resisting peer pressure and offer advice on how to handle hypothetical driving situations. This is also important if your teen is going to be a passenger in a car driven by a teen. Encourage teen passengers to speak up if they feel they are in danger.

Speeding - speed is a leading fact in crashes for teens and adults. Set a good example and set strong rules.

Driving conditions - Spring time rain, darkness, heavy traffic and other realities of driving pose challenges for teen drivers.

Make sure your teen has practice driving under each of these conditions.

Tips for Parents:

Don't assume all parents share your values - Exchange phone numbers and talk with other parents and your teen's friends to ensure ample communication.

Take inventory of alcohol and prescription drugs - If you are hosting a prom party, make sure you secure your alcohol and prescription drugs to ensure teens do not get their hands on them.

Check limo policies - If renting a limo, check their

policy on allowing alcohol in the vehicle and talk with the limo driver about your expectations for the evening.

Set a reasonable curfew - Let your teen know you will wait up for them to return home.

Economic impact of military presence in South Carolina reaches \$24.1 billion

Charleston - The South Carolina Military Base Task Force (Task Force) will be releasing an updated study, which reflects that the South Carolina military community collectively creates an economic impact to the state of \$24.1 billion. The 2017 study was prepared by Dr. Joey Von Nessen of the Darla Moore School of Business at the University of South Carolina. The Palmetto State is home to eight major military installations and numerous facilities, supporting 62,520 in Department of Defense (DoD) personnel with \$2.6

billion in payroll. Additionally, \$2.1 billion in DoD contracts is currently being executed among 752 firms within the state.

The 2017 study reports that the military community represents 8.4 percent of the South Carolina economy, composed of 181,847 jobs, or one of every 12 jobs in the state. The average compensation for jobs supported by the military community is \$54,701 per year, 37 percent higher than the average job.

"A very large contributor to our military-friendly reputation and its accom-

panying positive economic impact is the presence of 417,515 military veterans," said Howard Metcalf, S.C. director of Veterans' Affairs and a member of the Task Force. "The Veteran's Administration (VA) has said there are perhaps twice that many veterans in the state because that count only includes those who have applied for services."

"Among those veterans are 56,969 retirees who annually bring \$1.6 billion in DoD-funded retirement income into the state, and the VA contributed another \$1.9 billion in compensa-

tion and pensions," said Dan Beatty, a recently retired Army Colonel and member of the Executive Committee of the Task Force, who established his post-military career in the Palmetto State.

"A large number of those retirees have second careers and bring tremendous experience and skills to the state workforce," he said.

According to Dr. Von Nessen, access to a large supply of highly-skilled workers will be especially needed in 2017.

"One of the less-known benefits of the military

community to South Carolina is the pool of skilled workers it provides to the state," said Dr. Von Nessen. "South Carolina's labor market has tightened considerably within the last year, and, with an unemployment rate under five percent and employers continuing to expand, access to these skilled veterans is crucial for maintaining our current healthy rate of economic growth."

The 2017 report estimates the annual South Carolina state tax revenue generated by the military community is approximately \$884.1 million.

"South Carolina is blessed with a significant number of important economic engines, including the S.C. Ports Authority, tourism and great manufacturing, such as BMW, Boeing and Michelin, to name a few," said Task Force Chairman Bill Bethea. "Given the enormous impact of the military community on our economy, as evidenced by the 2017 report, the military presence surely is one of the leaders in that category."

2017 Wofford football season tickets are now on-sale

Season tickets for the 2017 Wofford College football campaign are now on-sale! This season marks head coach Mike Ayers 30th leading the black and gold and he will look to lead the team back to the NCAA FCS Playoffs again in 2017.

Coming off a 10-win campaign in 2016 and advancing to the FCS Quarterfinals, Wofford finished with Top 5 rankings nationally in rushing offense and total defense.

Wofford will celebrate Family Weekend on Saturday, September 23 highlighted by the only non-conference home game on the schedule against Gardner-Webb. Two weeks later, as the Terriers host Western Carolina, will be our designated "Pink Weekend" as we show our support and raise awareness for those engaged in the fight against breast cancer. Move ahead two more weeks and Homecoming festivities will take place the weekend of October 21 vs. Samford. The final home game is November 4 against Chattanooga for Senior Day and our annual "Salute to Service" contest honoring members of the military and first responders.

Wofford football season ticket prices will not change in 2017, they remain one of the best values in college football at \$115 per reserved seat.



The most significant change for fans is that the renewal deadline for season tickets is now June 1. After this date, all Gibbs Stadium seats are released to the general public.
