Popeyes plans third Spartanburg County location

Popeye's will open a second location within the City of Spartanburg, as site plans were recently approved for a restaurant to be located at 2087 East Main Street, within the East Main Centre shopping center.

No opening date has been set.

The east side location will join the Popeye's located along John B. White Sr. Boulevard, which opened last year. There is a location in Boiling Springs as well.

Spartanburg Memorial Auditorium will no longer accept cash for concessions as of May 14

Spartanburg Memorial Auditorium will soon begin conducting all food and drink transactions without cash. The first cashless show is scheduled to be the Alice Cooper concert on May 14. Debit cards, credit cards and mobile payments will be the only forms of payment accepted for food and drink concessions.

Tickets, as well as merchandise, will still be able to be purchased with cash.

Spartanburg's River Burch Trail to be extended

PAL (Play, Advocate, Live) recently announced that will transform the half-mile trail in downtown Spartanburg to double its existing size. This will allow pedestrian access from the River Birch Trail to the Drayton Mills Trail. Two bridges, one 30 feet in length and one 100 feet in length, will be installed in May to cross Lawson's Fork Creek. In July, the rest of the extension should be completed, connecting East Main Street to Heywood Avenue. The extension will be open to the public at that time.

Dr. Boone J. Hopkins installed as 12th president of Converse University

On Friday, April 21, 2023, Converse University celebrated the investiture of its twelfth president, Dr. Boone J. Hopkins, in the Zimmerli Performance Center at Twichell Auditorium.

All week, the Converse campus had been bustling with activities leading up to the inauguration and detailed event preparations.

Past President Dr. Elizabeth (Betsy) Fleming said it was her honor to welcome Dr. Hopkins as Converse's 12th president. She reminded him of Sir Isaac Newton's quote from 1675: "If I have seen further, it is by standing on the shoulders of giants." Fleming advised Dr. Hopkins to learn from the mountain of experience that previous Converse presidents have provided.

The Honorable Max T. Hyde, Jr. Representative, Thirty-Second District of South Carolina, spoke to the need for creative thinkers and the advantages of a liberal arts education to help unite the community and the country. "[Dr.

Hopkins] is steeped in the liberal arts tradition, and he can communicate the relevance of the liberal arts today and for the future," Hyde said.

The Honorable Jerome Rice, Mayor of the City of Spartanburg, sported a "Boone-style bow tie," noting that he and Hopkins have a mutual love for this unique style.

"Dr. Hopkins takes the reins at Converse at a time of historic growth and renewed optimism in our city," Rice said. Rice talked about the history of Converse — especially fitting as the inauguration landed on the same day as the birthday of Converse's founder, Dexter Edgar Converse.

Rice reminded attendees that the work we all do now will echo throughout the Spartanburg community for decades to come. He also spoke to the positive effect Dr. Hopkins' leadership will have on Converse University's legacy, both on- and off-campus, as his presidency will help write Spartanburg's next chapter.

One of the most highly anticipated speakers was Hopkins' mother, Dr.

Marsha Roberts Hopkins. She proudly stated that she was representing their family not only in Spartanburg but from their hometown of Gainesville, GA, as well.

"Life with Boone has never been boring", she shared, as the audience laughed wholeheartedly. "We watched him compete fiercely in academic bowls, in football games, and wrestling matches. He learned to tap dance and to perform a stunt fall over a balcony!"

Grand Marshal, Dr. Patricia S. Foy, Professor of Music Education, had the honor of presenting Dr. Hopkins with the Converse Mace, a symbol of the governing authority of the University. The Mace bears the names of Converse's academic departments in its spiral elements, symbolizing the central educational mission of Converse and the essential connection between the president and the faculty.

The auditorium shook, momentarily even affecting the live stream, from the standing ovation Hopkins received as he was formally inaugurated as Converse's 12th President.

BMW Manufacturing's landfill gas-to-energy project continues to power factory

For decades, the BMW Group has been using innovative technologies in its efforts to improve sustainability. It was 20 years ago that BMW Manufacturing started using recycled methane gas from a local landfill to provide electricity and hot water for the plant. The result of this groundbreaking idea: more than 9,200 tons of CO2 emissions have been reduced each year, which is equivalent to eliminating CO2 emissions from vehicles driving 23.5 million miles every year. Currently, about 20 percent of Plant Spartanburg's total energy needs (electricity and heat) are provided by landfill gas.

Because of the great success of this project, BMW Manufacturing announced recently that it will extend its partnership with Ameresco, Inc. for an additional eight years. Ameresco constructed the 9.5-mile pipeline from the Palmetto Landfill to Plant Spartanburg. This means nearly 74,000 tons of CO2 emissions will be reduced over the next eight years.

"For two decades, this project has been a win-win for Upstate South Carolina. It greatly reduces CO2 emissions, resulting in cleaner, healthier air for everyone to breathe," said Dr. Robert Engelhorn, president and CEO of BMW Manufacturing. "Intelligent resource management and the fight against climate change are

expressions of our sense of responsibility. The BMW Group will reduce CO2 emissions per vehicle by 40 percent from 2019 levels by 2030 across the spectrum."

"The old saying that 'one person's trash is another person's treasure' is literally true for our landfill gas-to-energy project," said Manfred Pernitsch, vice president of Real Estate Management and Environmental Protection for the Americas. "This project has greatly reduced greenhouse gas emissions and air pollution for two decades. We have used the energy produced by our turbines to heat the office

and production areas as well as heat our water, saving BMW several million dollars each year."

When the partnership began, Ameresco designed and built the 9.5-mile pipeline from the Palmetto Landfill to Plant Spartanburg as well as the gas processing and compression facilities.

"When we look back to the start of this partnership more than 20 years ago, sustainability was in its infancy. While it was not a common topic in many Corporate America board rooms, it was for our partners at BMW. We are excited to be celebrating the renewal of an innova-

tive project engagement that was far ahead of its time," said Michael Bakas, Ameresco's Executive Vice President. "We are also grateful for the many core team members at BMW whose passion for sustainability resulted in a best-in-class project to harness the power of biogas solutions to usher in a cleaner era for the auto industry."

According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency website, landfills are the third-largest human-generated source of methane emissions in the United States. Methane gas is a natural byproduct of the decomposition of

organic materials in landfills. It is also a potent greenhouse gas that is a key contributor to global climate change. Reducing methane emissions, the EPA says, is one of the best ways to mitigate climate change.

Instead of "flaring" or burning off the methane gas, the BMW project captures the methane produced at the landfill using dozens of gas extraction wells. The gas is then treated to remove moisture and impurities and is compressed at the landfill's Recovery and Compression Station. The methane then travels through a 9.5-mile pipeline from the

landfill to Plant Spartanburg.

At the plant, the methane gas is cleaned and compressed again; then it's fed into two efficient gas turbines at the plant's Energy Center. The turbines generate electricity and heat water throughout the eight million-square-foot Spartanburg plant.

Since 1992, the BMW Group has invested nearly \$12.4 billion in its South Carolina operations. BMW Manufacturing is the largest BMW Group plant in the world, producing more than 1,500 vehicles each day. The plant is an important part of BMW's global production network and plays a critical role in meeting the high demand for BMW Sports Activity Vehicles and Coupes in the U.S. and around the world. Nearly 60 percent of its vehicles are shipped to about 120 global markets, making BMW the largest automotive exporter by value in the United States for nine consecutive years. In 2022, more than 60 percent of BMW vehicles sold in the U.S. came from Plant Spartanburg. The model portfolio includes six top-selling BMW X models, five Motorsport X models, and three plug-in hybrid electric vehicle X models. The factory has an annual production capacity of up to 450,000 vehicles and employs more than 11,000 people.

Furman University launches 'FU All the Time' straight bourbon whiskey

Greenville - Furman University fans and friends have a new way to show their spirit for the university. FU All the Time, a favorite Paladins cheer, is also now a private-label straight bourbon whiskey.

FU All the Time debuted at the launch party for the Clearly Furman campaign on Saturday night, April 15, on campus. The campaign is Furman's most ambitious, with a goal of raising \$426 million by the university bicentennial in 2026.

"The launch of the Clearly Furman campaign was an exciting time, with hundreds of alumni and donors and other friends on campus,"

said Elizabeth Lichtenberg, senior director of brand strategy and visual communications for Furman. "We thought FU All the Time bourbon would be popular, and it was a huge hit. Everyone loved it. It felt good to be able to offer the Furman Family something new and unique that they can enjoy and take some pride in, and give them a new way to toast and celebrate Furman. We expect this new product to be a favorite for a long time."

Lichtenberg manages licensing opportunities for the university and was pitched the idea of a bourbon in 2022 through Affinity Licensing, a university partner. They brought Ironclad Distillery in Newport News, Virginia, to the table, and the bourbon was born, along with a new way to share Furman's brand.

A small group of University employees got a preview of the spirits last May and gave it enthusiastic thumbs up, along with an idea for the name. The distinctive label was designed by Furman graphic designer Chris Turner.

"FU All the Time' really

resonates with alumni as well as faculty and staff," Lichtenberg said. The cheer was made famous by two former Furman presidents. Legend has it that Gordon Blackwell started the phrase in the 1960s, and John E. Johns amplified it, literally, as he would do the cheer with a megaphone at the big games. Joseph Vaughn, Furman's first Black undergraduate student and a Furman cheerleader, is also said to have had a hand in popularizing the beloved cheer.

FU All the Time's quality will also appeal to anyone not associated with Furman.

"This is super clean. It really is everyone's bourbon," said Zach Wheeler with Aleph Wines, the distributor for South Carolina. FU All the Time is made with four grains (corn, wheat and rye from Virginia and malted barley). It's aged in oak barrels from South Carolina for at least three years. "It's smooth and fruity on the front end, with a little bit of grain. It goes into a baked goods, biscuit flavor on the back of the tongue and ends with the rye bite that mellows out the 100 proof," Wheeler said.

FU All the Time straight bourbon whiskey is currently

available online and in liquor stores and restaurants across

the Upstate, with statewide distribution coming soon.
