### SCDNR announces November 29 public meeting to introduce draft Broad River Basin Plan

The S.C. Department of Natural Resources (SCDNR) has announced a public meeting on Nov. 29 in Spartanburg to introduce the draft Broad River Basin Plan to the basin's stakeholders.

The public meeting will be held from 6 p.m. and 8 p.m. Wednesday, November 29 at the Spartanburg County Office of Emergency Services, 175 Community College Drive in Spartanburg.

The draft plan was developed over a two-year period by the Broad River Basin Council, a working group of stakeholders with water interests in the basin, under the guidance of the South Carolina State Water Planning Framework published in 2019.

## Spartanburg breaks ground on new baseball stadium, additional downtown development

A groundbreaking ceremony was held on November 1 at what will be the site of a new baseball stadium that will mark the beginning of a new era in Spartanburg's professional baseball history. Spartanburg Mayor Jerome Rice, South Carolina Speaker of the House Representative Murrell Smith, Chair of the House Ways and Means Committee, Bruce Bannister, and Peter Woodfork, senior vice president of baseball operations at MLB attended the event and underscored the shared commitment of Fifth Third Bank and Diamond Baseball Holdings to foster deep connections within the Spartanburg community and create exciting fan experiences and family memories at the ballpark for generations to come.

Mayor Rice stated that the stadium would be the centerpiece of a new \$500 million project for Spartanburg which will feature apartments, retail stores, offices, a hotel and a parking deck. A new \$150 million joint city-county administrative complex is also planned at the site of the current Spartanburg City Hall.

A total of \$118.1 million in public funding will come from the State of

South Carolina, County of Spartanburg, City of Spartanburg as well as the Downtown Partnership Committee.

The Johnson Group and Diamond Baseball Holdings will provide the rest of the funding. Diamond Baseball Holdings purchased the Down East Wood Ducks, an affiliate of the Texas Rangers, in May. The Wood Ducks should move from their current home in Kinston, NC to Spartanburg after the stadium is completed in time for the 2025 season. The team will change its name before beginning play in Spartanburg. The Spartanburg Professional Baseball Club is being used as a placeholder until a new Club name, logo and mascot are unveiled to the public at a later date.

Fifth Third Bank has agreed to a multi-year agreement with Diamond Baseball Holdings to become the official bank and naming rights sponsor for the new state-of-the-art ballpark.

Fifth Third Park will be part of a multi-use project led by local development company, The Johnson Group, and is set to be completed before the 2025 season. The ballpark will feature modern amenities, cutting-edge technology and a seating capacity that ensures an intimate and

electrifying atmosphere for fans. In addition to serving as the home turf for the club, the stadium will host a variety of marquis events, making it a hub of activity and excitement for residents of Spartanburg and beyond.

"We are incredibly proud to partner with Fifth Third Bank to bring this remarkable ballpark to life," said Andrew Judelson, chief commercial officer of Diamond Baseball Holdings. "Their dedication to the community and shared vision for a vibrant Spartanburg align perfectly with our goals at Diamond Baseball Holdings. We are confident this venue will not only be a premier destination but also a source of pride for everyone in Spartanburg."

"In partnership with Fifth Third Bank and the Johnson Group, we are going to build one of the most beautiful facilities in minor league baseball," said Tyson Jeffers, general manager for the Spartanburg Professional Baseball Club. "Our goal is to establish a community-first culture here that harnesses the unique personality of the Upstate and creates nationwide attention for Spartanburg. But most importantly, Fifth Third Park will be a community destination for fun any night of the week."

## Duke Energy kicks off monthlong campaign providing nearly \$400,000 to help fight hunger in S.C. this holiday season

Beginning November 1, Duke Energy kicked off a monthlong campaign to support organizations in South Carolina that address food insecurities and inequities across the state. Duke Energy's monthlong initiative will provide nearly \$400,000 to more than 60 feeding programs leading up to the Thanksgiving holiday and will support organizations including Mill Village Farms, FoodShare South Carolina, Harvest Hope Food Bank and AIM, among many others.

"These organizations are fighting the good fight every day in our communities, but they cannot do it alone," Callahan said.

To celebrate the start of the monthlong campaign, Duke Energy is joining Mill Village Farms, WYFF and Bons Secours Wellness

Arena for this year's Yam Jam on Nov. 2 in Greenville. The community event will feature more than 160 volunteers from companies and organizations around Greenville. Participants will bag more than 50,000 pounds of sweet potatoes for Thanksgiving food boxes to be distributed by FoodShare South Carolina hubs and other food programs across South Carolina. Additionally, the Duke Energy Foundation will contribute \$100,000 to FoodShare South Carolina organizations across the company's service territory, including \$35,000 to Mill Village Farms.

## SCDMV to offer services at new kiosks located at grocery stores

The South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicles will soon offer self-service electronic kiosks inside grocery stores. The kiosks known as "SCDMV Express" will allow customers to complete certain DMV transactions any time the store is open, eliminating the need to visit an SCDMV branch office.

The SCDMV Express kiosks are scheduled to launch in November at three locations across South Carolina, with more sites to be added in the future to support customer demand.

The first three locations are: the Publix Grocery Store at Thornblade Village, 411 The Parkway in Greer; Kroger Marketplace at Killian Crossing, 1028 Roberts Branch Parkway in Columbia; and the Publix Grocery Store in The Market at Cane Bay, 1724 State Road in Summerville.

The goal of the project is to add another customer service platform, in addition to SCDMV's 66 branch offices and the numerous online services available on the agency's website, where they can complete SCDMV transactions.

"We are really excited about providing the opportunity to allow customers to obtain DMV services without coming into the DMV," said Kevin Shwedo, executive director of the S.C. Department of Motor Vehicles.

The SCDMV Express kiosks will be yellow and blue, and look similar to an ATM. The kiosks are fully compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

Through an SCDMV Express kiosk, customers can obtain a replacement vehicle registration and obtain their license plate registration decal, assuming they have completed payment of required county personal property taxes on the vehicle. Those customers wishing to renew a vehicle registration can scan the barcode on the renewal notice, pay the fees with a credit or debit card, and print the registration and decal from the kiosk.

In addition to registrations, other types of DMV transactions are expected to be added to SCDMV Express in the future.

Adding SCDMV Express is the latest step in an effort to help South Carolinians get DMV business done without standing in line at agency branch locations.

## Former South Carolina Supreme Court Justice Kaye Hearn joins Wyche, P.A.

Justice Kaye Hearn retired in April of 2023 as a Justice on the South Carolina Supreme Court. At the time of her retirement, she was the longest serving member of the South Carolina State Court Judiciary. She was elected

to the Supreme Court of South Carolina in May of 2009, becoming only the second woman member in the court's history. Prior to her election to the state's highest court, Justice Hearn was a member of the South Carolina Court of Appeals for fifteen years, serving as its Chief Judge for ten years. During her tenure as Chief Judge, Justice Hearn served as President of the Council of Chief Judges, a

nationwide network of chief judges of the intermediate appellate courts.

From 1986 until her election to the Court of Appeals in 1995, she served as a Family Court Judge. Prior to going on the bench, Justice Hearn was a trial attorney with the firm of Stevens, Stevens, Thomas, Hearn, and Hearn, and served as a member of the South Carolina Board of Bar Examiners. Immed-

ately upon graduation from law school, she served as law clerk to South Carolina Supreme Court Justice Julius B. Ness. She is the only former law clerk to return to the Court as a Justice.

In 2004, Justice Hearn was honored with a portrait by the South Carolina's Trial Lawyers Association. In 2010, she received the South Carolina Women Lawyers Association's Jean

Galloway Bissell Award; in 2011, she was honored with an award in celebration of Inspiring Women from Coastal Carolina University; and in 2012, Governor Nikki Haley presented her the Woman of Achievement Award from the South Carolina Commission on Women. In 2013, Justice Hearn received the Bethany College Alumni Achievement Award and was named an Alpha Xi Delta Woman of Distinction. In 2022, she received the Outstanding Jurist Award from the American Board of Trial Advocates.

Justice Hearn received her B.A., cum laude, from Bethany College and her J.D., cum laude, from the University of South Carolina School of Law. She received an L.L.M. from the University of Virginia's Graduate Program for Judges; an honorary Doctor of Laws from the Charleston School of Law; an honorary Doctor of Humanities from Francis Marion University; and an honorary Doctor of Laws from the University of South Carolina.

## Greenville Triumph head coach and sporting director Harkes to leave role in December

Greenville - Greenville Triumph Soccer Club Head Coach and Sporting Director John Harkes has announced he will not seek to renew his contract after five years with the club. Harkes, the winningest coach in USL League One history, joined the Triumph shortly after the club's inception in 2018.

The former US Men's National Team captain came to the Triumph after serving as the head coach of FC Cincinnati for the club's inaugural season in 2016. He led the club to a 16-6-8 record and a play-off berth, also being named a finalist for Coach of the Year. He continued his coaching success in Greenville, building a roster from scratch in less than a year that finished as League One runner-up in the club's inaugural season. Harkes' side dominated the COVID-shortened 2020 season, going wire-to-wire at the top of the league table to win the club's first League One title.

Harkes led the team to

the USL League One Playoffs in each of his five seasons with the Triumph, reaching three consecutive League One Finals from 2019-2021. Greenville is the only club to make the postseason in each of the league's first five seasons. Harkes was honored as the league's Coach of the Year in 2020 and has been awarded Coach of the Month five times. His squads have been known for elite defensive play, highlighted by strong goal-keeping and veteran line-ups that included four players with over 100 appearances for the club in Tyler Polak, Evan Lee, Aaron Walker and Brandon Fricke.

"My family and I have had an incredible journey with Greenville," said Harkes. "After much reflection and many discussions, I have decided to not renew my contract. I am grateful to this club, in particular the Erwin family, their ownership group and Chris Lewis for the steadfast trust in me to lead the club on and off the field. I hope that I have fulfilled my promises to build Triumph SC from the ground up and my dream to leave it in a better place. I am forever a member of the Greenville Triumph, and I will remain a full supporter of the club, fans, and community moving forward. I am indebted to Joe, Gretchen, Doug, Shannon, Billy, and Chris as well as my coaching

staff and players for their hard work, belief, and trust in me. I'd like to thank my family, in particular my wife Cindi, who supported me along this journey. I'm excited for the next chapter in my career and in our lives."

Harkes grew up in Kearny, New Jersey and played soccer at the University of Virginia from 1985 to 1987 under his future D.C. United head coach Arena. Harkes was named the MAC Hermann Player of the Year in 1987 before foregoing his senior season to play with the U.S. Men's National Team. With the National Team, Harkes earned 90 caps, appearing in FIFA World Cups (1990, 1994), the 1988 Olympics and serving as team captain from 1995-1998. Following a historic career in Europe as the first American to compete in the English Premier League, Harkes returned to the U.S. as one of the foundational players of the newly-created Major League Soccer. In addition to coaching since his retirement as a player, he's worked with ESPN, Fox, and SiriusXM as a commentator for MLS and World Cup coverage.

"John Harkes is special - a great head coach and sporting director, who is an even better person," said Triumph Chairman, Joe Erwin. "Having John guide our coaching staff and players the last five

years has been a joy for our supporters, fans, and everyone in our club. He's embraced our community and what makes the Upstate special, and he has built a culture of success that is unmatched in our league. We wish great happiness to John and his fam-

ily going forward, and we are forever grateful for their contributions to the Greenville Triumph." Harkes, whose contract runs through the end of December, will assist in staff and player transition as the club prepares for the 2024 League One season.

The club recently announced it will be returning to Furman's Paladin Stadium for a second season in 2024 as the organization continues to work on securing a location and plan for a permanent stadium.

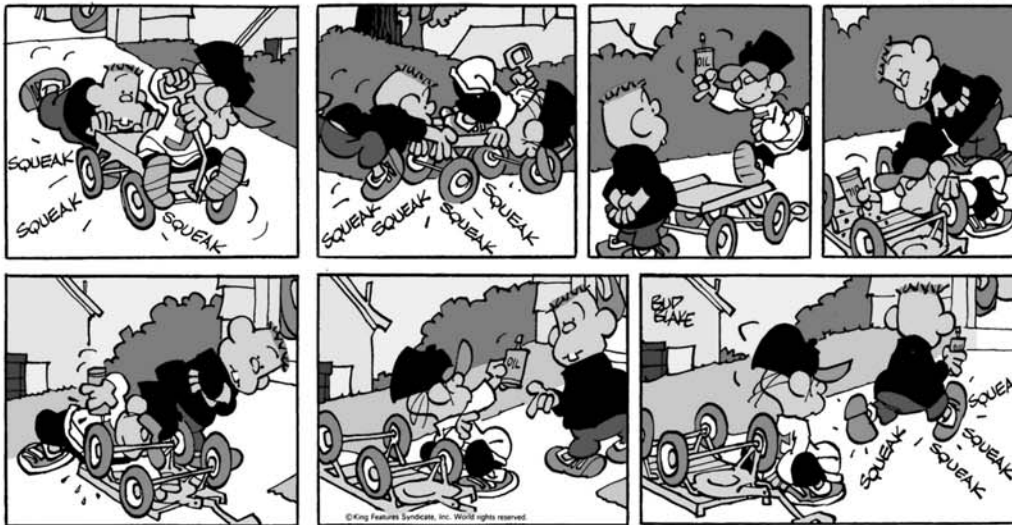

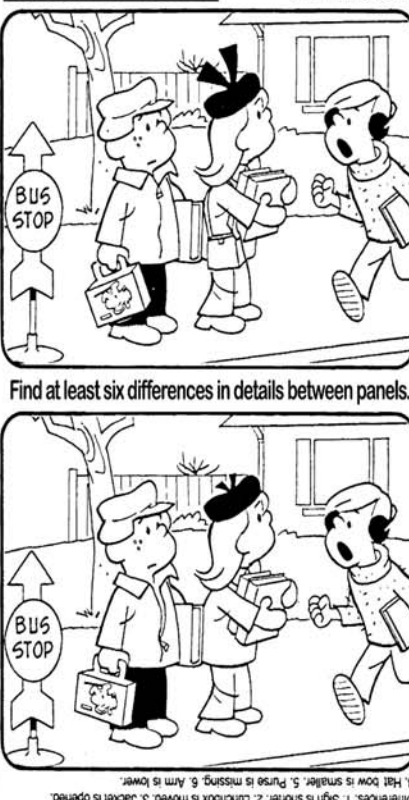
