Spartanburg man pleads guilty to Treasury check conspiracy

Columbia - Acting United States Attorney Beth Drake stated recently that Joshua A. Martin, age 29, of Spartanburg, pled guilty in federal court in Anderson, to conspiracy to pass Treasury checks of the United States bearing falsely made or forged endorsements. United States District Judge Timothy M. Cain, of Anderson accepted the plea and will impose sentence after he has reviewed the presentence report which will be prepared by the U.S. Probation Office.

Evidence presented at the change of plea hearing established that Martin and co-defendant Brandy Page (who has already pled guilty) obtained Treasury checks by filing false tax returns and from other sources. They then would create a fraudulent power of attorney form giving them authority to cash the check that falsely purported to be executed by the payee listed on the Treasury check. Law enforcement estimates that the duo cashed over \$200,000 in Treasury checks in this manner before her scheme was discovered.

Law enforcement discovered the scheme in March 2014 when the Greer Police Department received a complaint from a Georgia man that someone had stolen and cashed his Treasury check in the Greer Wal-Mart. The driver's license number and date of birth written on the check came back to Page. The Internal Revenue Service assisted local authorities and uncovered the breadth of Page's scheme.

Ms. Drake stated the maximum penalty Martin can receive is a fine of \$250,000 and/or imprisonment for 5 years, plus a special assessment of \$100.

The case was investigated by agents of the Greer Police Department and the Internal Revenue Service. Assistant United States Attorney Bill Watkins of the Greenville office handled the case.

Maybe it's just agreeing that everyone will sit down together for dinner one set night each week. Scheduling a regular family game night with no TV or phones is another way to enjoy one another's company.

Our lives today are all quite busy, but making an effort to give family members more personal attention can pay big benefits. Spending just a few minutes each day to catch up with your spouse or your kids can keep you current on their lives and help catch small issues before they become major problems. It's well worth the effort.

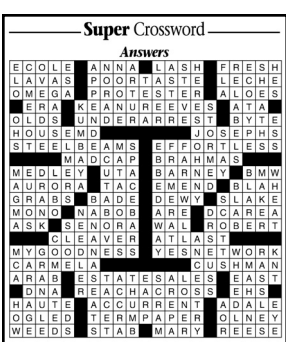

tially see two different endings! I cannot wait to see how the verdict plays out at each performance."

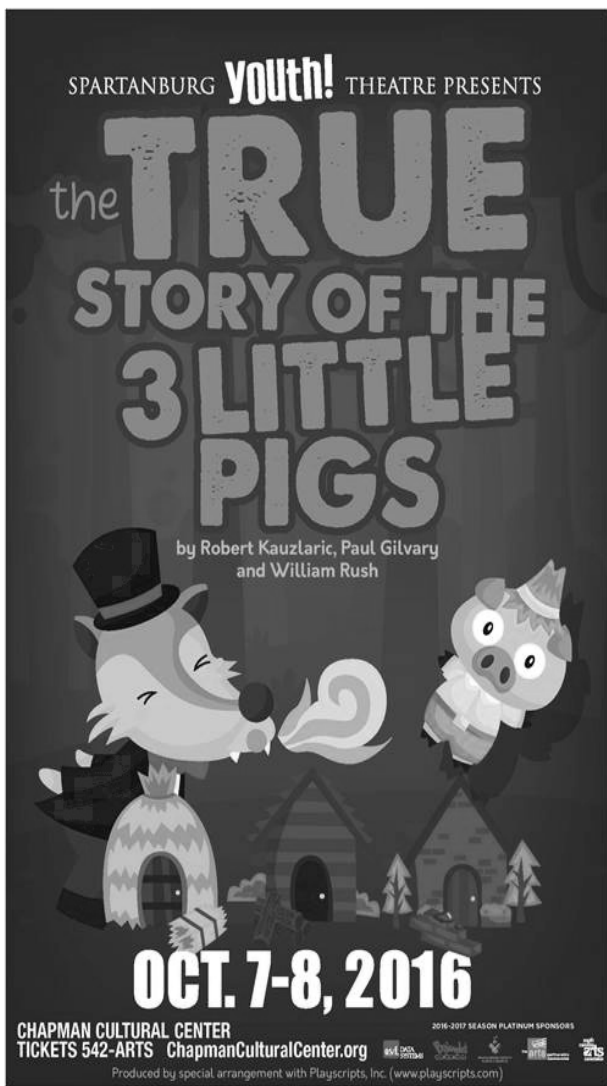

South Carolina Secretary of State releases first-annual Professional Solicitor Report

Columbia - Recently, Secretary of State Mark Hammond announced the publication of the Division of Public Charities Professional Solicitor Report. The Professional Solicitor Report provides a comprehensive listing of the joint financial reports filed in 2015 by paid solicitors operating in the state of South Carolina. The Professional Solicitor Report can be found at www.sos.sc.gov under the "From the Secretary's Desk" tab.

"It is important for donors to know where their charitable dollars are going," said Secretary Hammond. "This report serves to inform donors of what percentage is kept by the professional solicitor, and how much actually goes to the charity."

As administrator of the Solicitation of Charitable Funds Act, Secretary Hammond regulates charitable fundraising in the state of South Carolina. Some charities employ professional or paid solicitors to raise money for them. At the end of a fundraising campaign, or each year of a multi-year campaign, a professional solicitor is required to file a joint financial report with the Division of Public Charities. The Professional Solicitor Report provides a comprehensive listing of the data provided in joint financial reports filed by professional solicitors during 2015.

Secretary Hammond noted that the Professional Solicitor Report provides different information than what is provided for charities on the Secretary of State's website, or that which is highlighted during the Scrooges and Angels announcement each November. While those resources specifically focus on the percentage that charities spend on their charitable programs, the Professional Solicitor Report provides the percentage that charities receive from solicitation campaigns conducted by paid fundraisers.

"Professional fundraisers can provide a valuable service to charities by reaching out to donors on their behalf," said Secretary Hammond. "Unfortunately, though, in many instances, professional solicitors will remit to the charity only a tiny fraction of the donations collected from con-

tributors. For example, donors who receive a telephone solicitation may think that they are giving a \$25.00 donation, when only \$2.50 of that donation may reach the charity."

The information provided in the Professional Solicitor Report reflects national campaigns, and is not necessarily

limited to money raised in South Carolina. The Professional Solicitor Report also provides data on the types of fundraising used for each campaign. For example, based on the information reported, professional solicitors that operated telephone and direct mail campaigns

remitted an average of 36.2% of gross receipts to their clients. Charitable organizations that employed bingo promoters received an average of only 1.61% of gross receipts. Accounting for all joint financial reports filed with the Secretary of State in 2015, 52.3% of gross receipts from

professional solicitor campaigns went to charitable organizations.

Secretary Hammond stated that he intends to release the Professional Solicitor Report each year as a public service to South Carolina donors. He also reminded donors to contact the Division of Public

Charities at charities@sos.sc.gov or (803) 734-1790 if they have any questions or concerns regarding a charitable organization or professional fundraiser. Additional information is available on the Secretary of State's website at www.sos.sc.gov.

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
