Keep OneSpartanburg Beautiful announces second group of Community Impact grants

Keep OneSpartanburg Beautiful recently announced the second group of Community Impact grant recipients. In all, \$10,985 in grants were awarded to cleanup and beautification projects across Spartanburg County.

Projects receiving grant money, funded by the OneSpartanburg Vision Plan, are:

The Charles A. Walker Community Park will receive \$2,000 to aid in clearing greenery and installing a paved asphalt walking trail around the park.

The Habitat Sycamore Neighborhood Association will receive \$436 to install a bench for children to sit on while waiting for the school bus, and to plant native species at the neighborhood's community park.

The League of Women Voters will receive \$316 to purchase and plant wildflowers and perennials at the recently-painted mural commemorating Angelina and Sarah Grimke.

The Palmetto Council of the Boy Scouts of America will receive \$1,252 will be used to clean up litter and debris around the Glendale Outdoor Leadership School and Welcome to Glendale signs. Scouts will also plant native plant and shrub species in garden boxes around the signs.

The Park Hills Neighborhood Association will receive \$1,274 will be used to remove invasive plants and clean up illegal dumping at Montgomery Park, an 8-acre green space owned by the City of Spartanburg.

The South Converse Neighborhood Association will receive \$2,000 will go toward removing invasive plants that have taken over lots and walkways in the neighborhood.

The Spartanburg Area Conservancy (SPACE) will receive \$500 will go toward a bench located along the newly-renovated Cottonwood Trail boardwalk.

The Spartanburg Community College Foundation will receive \$2,000 to enhance the college's entrance at the intersection of New Cut Road and Community College Drive with native plant species and new lighting around its signage.

The Williamsburg East Neighborhood Association will receive \$1,207 to plant native plants, apply top soil and mulch around the neighborhood's entrance sign.

Eating right can help fight breast cancer

A pink ribbon is the symbol worn in October for National Breast Cancer Awareness Month. A breast cancer is a malignant tumor that starts from cells of the breast. A malignant tumor is a group of cancer cells that may grow into (invade) surrounding tissues or spread (metastasize) to distant areas of the body.

Tragically, more than 200,000 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer and more than 40,000 will die from it this year in America. Although breast cancer occurs mainly in women, men can get it too. Many people do not realize that men have breast tissue and that they can develop breast cancer. About 1,970 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed among men. About 390 men will die from breast cancer. New medical research strongly suggests that you can eat and live proactively to prevent breast cancer before it strikes.

Current anti-breast-cancer medical efforts are aimed at critical early detection with mammograms. Early detection allows doctors to treat the cancer while it is still small and confined to the breast.

According to an independent study, the top-10 food items to fight breast cancer include easy-to-enjoy carrots, apples and green tea. Carrots and other foods rich in beta-carotene may lower your relative breast cancer risk, and lower the risk of invasive cancer. A natural substance in raw carrots called "falcarinol" can slow the growth of cancer cells. Falcarinol is inactivated by heat or cooking, so it is critical to eat raw carrots, too.

A few apples a day may truly keep the breast-cancer surgeon away. Specifically, studies show that natural substances found in apples decrease the number of tumors, the size of tumors and tumor growth rates in animal models. The more apple extracts the animals were fed, the greater the reduction in cancer.

Green tea consumption may reduce your relative breast cancer risk by more than 50%. Green tea is rich in potent "polyphenol" antioxidants that protect your DNA from damage and shortening, reduce inflammation, reduce estrogen and reduce breast tissue density. The recommended amount to consume is two to four cups per day, or take a green-tea supplement.

Around the Upstate

Watson-Brown Foundation to fund new Southern Studies Fellowships in Arts and Letters

Chapman Cultural Center and the Hub City Writers Project have jointly received a \$150,000 grant from the Watson-Brown Foundation for a new, three-year initiative, the Southern Studies Fellowship in Arts and Letters.

This first-of-its-kind program will bring one early-career artist and one early-career writer to Spartanburg for a nine-month residency of research, creativity, teaching, and travel, culminating in a collaborative project informed by the region. The program, which begins in 2021, will be marketed nationally to artists and writers who are interested in immersing themselves in the culture of the American South.

"By bringing dynamic creative people together with dynamic arts organizations and scholars through the region, we will set in motion new explorations of the modern South that will reverberate beyond our community," said Jennifer Evins, Chapman Cultural Center President and CEO.

"This grant is designed to create a life-changing experience for the fellows, to provide engaging intellectual opportunities for local students and citizens, and to create a model program for community cul-

tural study through art and literature," said Anne Waters, executive director of the Hub City Writers Project.

Over the three-year period of the grant, each Southern Studies Fellow will be provided with a furnished apartment with paid utilities in downtown Spartanburg and a monthly stipend. Applications for the program will be available online in early 2021, and the first fellows will come to Spartanburg September 2021 to May 2022. It is open to residents of the United States. The initiative replaces

existing residency programs by Chapman and Hub City.

In addition to focusing on their own creative projects, the Southern Studies Fellows will have opportunities and requirements for educational community service in Spartanburg County; these will include regular college and high school classroom visits/lectures, readings, open studios, workshops, and projects affiliated with the host organizations. The fellows will be expected to contribute up to 20 hours per week in the following areas: community service,

artist-writer collaboration, and out-of-town travel for project research.

A key component of this unique fellowship is the opportunity to interact with leading scholars, artists, and writers throughout the South. Each fellow will have opportunities to travel in the Southern region to conduct research at cultural and educational institutions, which will inform their work and will be critical in the development of their ideas for a collaborative project that expands the understanding of the modern South.

The Watson-Brown Foundation invests in higher education through grants and its scholarship program, which annually awards nearly \$5 million in merit- and need-based college scholarships to students from an eighteen-county region of Georgia and South Carolina. Based in Thomson, GA, the foundation also operates a grant program that encourages responsible scholarship on the South and supports historic preservation. Additionally, it owns and operates three historic house museums in Georgia.

With roots that stretch back more than 50 years, the Chapman Cultural Center's mission is to provide cultural leadership for Greater Spartanburg by developing, strengthening, and promoting the scope, excellence and educational role of the arts, humanities, and sciences, and to further their significance in the life of our community. It serves as the official South Carolina Arts Commission-designated arts agency of Spartanburg County. Chapman provides general operating support for nine cornerstone cultural institutions, including the Hub City Writers Project, through its United Arts Fund and provides project grants to local artists and organizations.

The Hub City Writers Project, founded in 1995, serves its mission to cultivate readers and nurture writers through its independent press, community bookshop, and diverse literary programming. Its flagship program, Hub City Press, is one of only three Southern book publishers funded by the National Endowment for the Arts. It is focused on finding and spotlighting new and extraordinary voices from the American South.

Despite the COVID pandemic, Greenville County has much to be thankful for

GADC Board member Butch Kirven.

With new concept art for the \$1 billion project's look and feel recently released, the 37-acre site will include a five-story office tower, a multilevel parking deck, an event plaza, a veteran's memorial wall and a drop-off area designed to be a "park-like setting." Set to be completed in 8-

10 years, planning is underway for moving utili-

ties underground, including water, sewer, gas lines

and communications.

Guests are invited to examine the difference between art and design and consider when art can also be design and vice versa.

"In our current era, communication design is more

ubiquitous than ever," says State Museum Art Curator Amy Chalmers. "We live in an unprecedented moment where we see hundreds, if not thousands, of images a day. We understand 'graphic design' as a primarily digital, commercial concept. This exhibit seeks to give it more historical context."

The scope of the exhibition spans the past century, and traces important changes in culture and technology. Featured in the show are Jasper Johns' prints, Shepard Fairey's political posters, commercial art and advertisements

from the 1950s and 60s, and work by artists such as Sallie Frost Knerr, Anna Heyward Taylor, and Leo Twiggs. The thriving industry of contemporary graphic design will also be represented, with posters and other projects by prominent creatives currently working across the state.

"My hope is that visitors will question the distinction between what we consider 'art for art's sake' and 'commercial art,'" says Chalmers. "This exhibit looks at art that uses graphic conventions, as well as commercial work

with strong artistic value." Guests will also learn about the origins of what we now call 'graphic design' by exploring the development of different methods of printing and printmaking, typography, illustration, and advertising throughout the last century. The exhibition demonstrates that many artists have blurred the boundaries and challenged the definition of 'fine art.' by employing graphic conventions. This includes the use of reproductive printing and text combined with images, symbols, simple shapes and flat colors. The

exhibition also invites guests to discover how to better read images in order to analyze how color and composition are utilized to convey specific messages, ideas and feelings.

The Graphic Eye: South Carolina and the Intersection of Art and Design is free with museum membership or general admission. General admission to the South Carolina State Museum is \$8.95 for adults; \$7.95 for Seniors; \$6.95 for children; infants 2 and under are free.

As the state's largest and most comprehensive museum, the South

Carolina State Museum offers a unique, entertaining and educational experience to visitors throughout its 225,000 square foot facility located in the heart of downtown Columbia's Congaree Vista. The State Museum is housed in one of its largest artifacts, an 1894 former textile mill listed on the National Registrar of Historic Places. In addition to beautiful meeting spaces throughout the facility, guests can explore outer space in one of the largest planetariums in the Southeast.

VA Scams in Florida

What's going on in Florida? It appears more criminals are operating there than in other areas of the country.

One criminal near Tampa worked at the Department of Veterans Affairs as a transportation assistant who awarded contracts to vendors to give rides to VA clinic patients. Vendors had to pay kickbacks to him to be awarded contracts.

Eventually the criminal started up two transportation companies of his own, registering them in the names of his wife and daughter to hide his involvement. Invoices were submitted, and they were paid to the tune of \$305,000 over the course of 17 months.

When the whole scheme started coming down around their heads, they all lied and then got tangled up in those lies. Wife and daughter claimed they ran the two companies, yet the criminal was the one who registered the vehicles and arranged for insurance. Later, the criminal said his wife and daughter had seized control of the companies without his knowledge and were blackmailing him into giving them transportation contracts and assignments. All three pleaded guilty.

Also on Florida's west coast, a criminal operated a telemarketing scam where employees sold medical testing to patients and then turned those into prescriptions that looked like exams had been done via telemedicine. Signatures on the fake prescriptions were obtained from doctors in exchange for bribes. The prescriptions, submitted to the VA, netted the criminal over \$3 million, and he's been sentenced to four years in the federal penitentiary.

Then, on the east coast of Florida, a former VA employee was nabbed for threatening to kill another employee and that employee's family. Not too bright, leaving threatening messages on somebody's cellphone... more than once. This fool could get a year in the federal pen and a \$100,000 fine.

So, is it the sun that does it in Florida?

THE HISTORY CHANNEL

- On Oct. 24, 1775, a British naval fleet of six ships sails up the James River to destroy the town of Norfolk, Virginia. Expecting the Patriots and local militia to come charging and to engage in open combat, the British were surprised to come under fire from expert riflemen, who began striking down British troops at a distance.
- On Oct. 19, 1781, hopelessly trapped at Yorktown, Virginia, British Gen. Lord Cornwallis surrenders, effectively bringing an end to the American Revolution. He surrendered 7,087 officers and men, 900 seamen, 144 cannons, 15 galleys, a frigate and 30 transport ships. Pleading illness, he did not attend the surrender ceremony.
- On Oct. 23, 1921, in France, American Sgt. Edward Younger selects from four caskets the body of the first "Unknown Soldier" to be honored among the approximately 77,000 U.S. servicemen killed during World War I.
- On Oct. 22, 1934, Charles "Pretty Boy" Floyd is shot by FBI agents in Ohio. Floyd, who had been hunted for four years, used his last breath to deny his involvement in the infamous Kansas City Massacre, in which four officers were shot to death at a train station.
- On Oct. 20, 1947, the notorious Red Scare kicks into high gear in Washington, as a Congressional committee begins investigating Communist influence in Hollywood. Some witnesses — including studio honcho Walt Disney — gave the committee names of colleagues they suspected of being communists.
- On Oct. 25, 1973, President Richard Nixon vetoes the War Powers Resolution, which would limit presidential power to commit armed forces abroad without Congressional approval. Congress passed the law over Nixon's veto.
- On Oct. 21, 1988, "Mystic Pizza," a romantic comedy starring Julia Roberts, Annabeth Gish and Lili Taylor as three young women who work at a pizza parlor in Mystic, Connecticut, opens in theaters. Matt Damon made his big-screen debut in the film.






