Bright students light path for struggling youth

Teens with Mentor Program
"What am I capable of? What is my direction in life?"

It's a mentor's job to help a young person answer questions like these. Such guidance is invaluable as adolescents strive to find their individual niches in an ever more complicated world. Warren Evans, VCOM—Carolinas Class of 2020, has a vision of helping them find answers.

"What a mentor does is help others see their potential," Evans says. "Once you see your potential, then you can develop a vision. But you have to first see that potential." Mentoring has become something of a personal mission for Evans, who currently serves as Student Body President for the Class of 2020. His own mentors guided him on his path to medical school, an extraordinary journey outside the bounds of convention.

the bounds of convention.

"Anybody with a past that is 'non-traditional' is going to have a hard time getting into medical school," he says. "It took me two years of applying. I had great mentors, who were practicing physicians. They guided me every step of the way. We did practice inter-

views, everything."
Evans, 32, certainly has a past that qualifies as 'non-traditional.' One of seven children in a family from the small town of Pine Hills, Florida, his educational and work background does not fit the mold for a typical med student.

"The schools were really bad," he says of Pine Hills. "There's a lot of gang activity in the area, a lot of drug problems and things like that, so my mom decided she would rather home school us and keep us out of the schools. She was homeschooling all seven of us at one time."

Things took a turn for the worse for the family when Evans' mother turned ill and his father lost his job. Education, for Warren Evans,

had to take a back seat for a while.

"I really had no formal high school education," he says. "I went to a tech college so I could take basic math skills and get the G.E.D. I didn't have any interest in medicine whatsoever, and education was something that didn't matter to me because I was in survival mode."

With his family in such dire straits, Evans sought employment in lieu of education. He knew he loved helping people, which led him to pursue a career as a fire fighter. Working for the Apopka, Florida Fire Department pre-

sented new opportunities. "I loved the job, and they offered for me to go to paramedic school," Evans says. "That was intimidating because at that point, I could read OK, but I couldn't do much math at all. I was 20 years old and I didn't have the educational skills of a high schooler. So I started taking remedial classes. They wouldn't let me take college math. I couldn't add or subtract negative numbers. I couldn't write very well, my grammar was pretty poor. I was very deficient in those areas."

But, with the help of good mentoring, Evans found the potential for more. "This is why the mentoring is so important to me," he says. "The mentors that I had in my life made all the difference. I wouldn't be where I'm at today if I didn't have them."

Among those mentors were Lt. R.L. Colina and Chief Steven Page of the Apopka FD. "The fire department said 'If you want, we'll send you to medic school.' They had us go do rotations in the hospital and I saw doctors practicing, and a lightbulb turned on for me. I talked to my mentors about it. They said 'you can do this.' I said 'I can't add and subtract numbers!' They made me know my potential."

turned ill and In keeping with VCOM's mission to serve the under-Warren Evans, served, Evans hopes to inspire the same self-knowledge and confidence in Spartanburg District 7's high school students, especially those with greater obstacles to success.

"This is why I wanted to start the mentor program, because those mentors were so key to helping me every step of the way, even getting into med school," he says. "My main goal for the kids is to help them realize what they are capable of. A lot of students that we work with live in poverty, and the last thing on their minds is college. It's helping them realize their capabilities."

With Dr. Sonia Leverette of the Spartanburg County School Administration, Evans has started just such a program, to an overwhelmingly enthusiastic response.

"I need to inspire as many people as I can to be interested in this," Evans says. "With every meeting I attend in which I have something I'm proposing, I start with 'why,' not 'how' or 'what' or the logistics of how we're going to get it done. That's important, but you start with 'why.' I told them a little of my background, I told them what we're going to offer these kids and instead of what I expected – five or six people – we're

almost at 70. It's amazing."
Among those volunteer mentors are Carrie Downing-Larick, VCOM-Carolinas Class of 2020, and Aubrey Jones and Johnny Efstathiades, both Class of 2021, who will take over when Evans and Downing-Larick leave for rotations.

The Mentor Program's mission to lead young people to realize their full potential is the result of two things: the needs of this community and the vision of Warren Evans, reflecting VCOM's dedication to focusing on the underserved. With his commitment as well as that of other VCOM students in collaboration with Spartanburg High School District 7, the city's future looks a little brighter.

Taking control of those end of the school year tests

From elementary through high schools, our children are faced with tests meant to measure just how well the school year has gone. Schools need to know how much of the knowledge that was being handed out all year has managed to sink in.

While most students may dread those end of year tests, most schools today recognize good testing as a means of improving their teaching. Once upon a time, schools and teachers might have used the "smile and file" approach with test results, handing out test results with a smile, then simply filing away and forgetting them.

Educators today, however, use the test results as a measure of how well current education methods are actually working, and as a means to make changes for more effective teaching in the future.

Testing may be a necessary and required end of year activity, but for too many students it produces lots of stress and anxiety. However, with a bit of planning, tests can be much easier to handle.

A starting point is for students to have a clear understanding of what tests they're facing and when they're going to occur. Regular school year pop quizzes may be unexpected, but something as important as a final exam is never a surprise.

When the test schedule is set, it's time to plan. Which tests are going to present the biggest challenges? Those are the ones that deserve some extra studying time. This doesn't mean pulling all-nighters and cramming, but instead starting days or even weeks ahead of time to re-read notes, review end of chapter summaries, to perhaps study with a friend, and even ask a teacher for extra help if some parts of the material are difficult or confusing. Teachers want to help. That's why they often hand out study guides. Use them!

Students also need to prepare physically and mentally for testing. This means eating right and avoiding sugary, junk foods. A healthy breakfast, avoiding highly caffeinated drinks, and getting a good night's sleep before test day are all strategies to success.

When a student enters a test well rested and having eaten well, it's easier to feel relaxed and less anxious. If the test material has been studied calmly and carefully, then all that's needed is a couple of deep breaths in order to calmly focus. The result will be less stress and better scores.



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AnMed closes two outpatient pharmacies

Furman receives \$340,000 grant to support undergraduate research

Greenville National Science Foundation (NSF) has awarded a \$340,000 grant to Furman University through the Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU) program.

The REU site award supports the training of 10 students for 10 weeks during the summers of 2019-

In the program, funded by NSF's Division of Chemistry in the Mathematical and Physical Sciences Furman Chemistry Professor and principal investigator Karen L. Buchmueller and colleagues host an REU site that involves three visiting teams, each consisting of a faculty mentor and two to three students who come to Furman University each conduct summer to

research. The program also includes two Furman teams, each consisting of a faculty mentor and one student. The summer program begins with a research boot camp, providing mini-courses in laboratory safety, scientific ethics, career advising and hands-on experience with departmental instrumenta-

This is the 10th grant the Furman Department of Chemistry has received through the NSF's REU program, but the department has received substantial competitive funding from NSF in support of undergraduate research for decades.

"We have been privileged with exceptional departmental vision in those funding efforts for over 40 years, which helped to establish Furman's reputation as a national leader in highimpact engaged learning activities. I applaud Dr. Buchmueller's extraordinary efforts in leading our REU efforts since 2015 and look forward to the impacts of this program in providing transformative experiences for future Furman students and visiting scientific teams."

The REU research program culminates in an oral symposium and an outreach program at Greenville's Center, which leads a summer camp for under

to facilitate the development of future scientists, through direct engagement with real scientific problems in the lab and the formation of meaningful relationships with faculty and students participating in the program.

Said Buchmueller, "The goal is to cultivate future scientists, both directly within the program and through sustainable research programs at partner institutions."

Furman provides a unique summer REU program that incorporates visiting teams of students and faculty from small colleges, Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), and technical colleges. As an REU site, Furman provides research and educational opportunities that act as stepping stones in the development of the undergraduate student as a scientist.



Method:

Evening Before:

• In a food storage bag,

combine thyme, rosemary, garlic, onion, oil, vinegar, orange juice and mustard. Mix well.

• Add the leg of lamb; seal the bag and turn to coat. Massage the meat through the bag for a few minutes to help the marinade set in. Put the storage bag into a large roasting pan to marinate for 24 hours in the refrigerator.

Day Of:

- Preheat oven to 350
- Remove the lamb from the marinade and place in shallow roasting pan. Season with the salt, pepper and squeeze of lemon.
- · Roast, uncovered, basting with the remaining marinade several times while roasting, using all the marinade
- Roast for 50 to 70 minutes or until an instant read meat thermometer registers 140 degrees F for medium rare, or 150 degrees F for medium. For food safety, cook to a minimum of 140 degrees F.
- Remove from oven, cover with foil and let stand for 15 minutes before serving.

Distracted driving kills: AAA urges drivers to stay focused on the road

Charlotte, N.C. - Each day, 10 people are killed in distracted driving crashes contributing to the 37,000 people killed in crashes on U.S. roadways during 2016, according to the National Highway Traffic Administration Safety (NHTSA). To stay safe on the road during National Distracted Driving Awareness month in April and all year long, AAA is calling for drivers to keep their eyes and attention on the road and hands on the wheel.

In North Carolina there were 32 fatalities due to distracted driving in 2017, according to the NCDOT and in South Carolina there were 60, according to the SCDPS. AAA Carolinas believes these numbers are actually a lot higher as many drivers do not readily admit to distracted driving, such as texting, at the time of the crash.

"No distraction- whether texting or eating- is ever worth the loss of life on the roadway," said AAA Carolinas Foundation Traffic Safety President Tiffany Wright. "These senseless deaths can easily be prevented if drivers simply choose to focus on the core task of driving when behind the wheel."

Contrary to what some drivers may think, handsfree, handheld and in-vehicle technologies are not distraction-free, even if a driver's eyes are on the road and their hands are on the wheel. The latest AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety research found that:

- * Drivers who text when behind the wheel more than double their odds of being involved in a crash;
- * Drivers who talk on a cell phone (either handsfree or handheld) when behind the wheel may elevate their odds of being involved in a crash;
- * Drivers who use in-vehicle technologies, like voice-based and touch screen features, can be distracted for more than 40 seconds when completing tasks like programming navigation or sending a text message.
- * Removing eyes from the road for just two seconds doubles the risk for a

crash, according to previous research.

Driving is a complex task that requires a driver's full attention. AAA cautions drivers to put down their phones and don't use hands-free, handheld or invehicle technologies while driving. AAA offers these tips to stay safe while on the road:

- * Put down your phone and other electronic gadg-
- * Never use text-messag-

ing, email functions, video games or the internet with a wireless device, including those built into the

* Designate a passenger to answer in-coming calls, send or respond to text messages and to assist with navigation when the vehicle is in motion. Only use these technologies for legitimate emergencies or urgent, driving related pur-

AAA is a strong voice in

state, local and federal government efforts to advocate for a comprehensive approach to the problem of distracted driving, through laws or regulations, funding education and research and investing in enforcement and safer roads.

"The safety of our roads has always and will continue to be a priority for AAA and its members," said Tiffany Wright.

The current penalties for

violators of distracted driving are:

* In North Carolina, text messaging and emailing while driving are prohibited for all drivers. Violators face a \$100 fine.

* In South Carolina, texting while driving is prohibited. Most municipalities have enacted texting bans that result in fines from \$25-\$100.
