

# Spartanburg County farmer named finalist in Farm Bureau Young Farmers and Ranchers Excellence Contest

Myrtle Beach — Case Chumley of Spartanburg County has been named one of four state finalists in the 2017 South Carolina Farm Bureau Young Farmers & Ranchers Excellence in Agriculture Contest during the organizations 73rd Annual Meeting held recently in Myrtle Beach. The contest winner will be announced in February at the 2017 SCFB Young Farmer & Rancher Conference in Charleston.

Chumley will be competing for the opportunity to win \$500, a Polaris ATV, and an expense paid trip to the 2018 American Farm Bureau Annual Convention in Nashville, TN. The other finalists for the award are Nikki Seibert Kelley of Charleston County, Zachary Snipes of Charleston County and Dan Swenson of Newberry County.

The Excellence in Agriculture Award recognizes young farmers and ranchers who do not derive the majority of their income from an owned agricultural operation, but who actively contribute to agriculture and Farm Bureau. Award prizes are complements of Southern Farm Bureau Casualty Insurance Company, Southern Farm Bureau Life Insurance Company, South Carolina Farm Bureau Federation and Polaris.

# City Fire Department earns exclusive top rating

The fire-protection services of the City of Spartanburg, as rated by an insurance industry advisory company, has improved to Class 1 from a Class 2, the city announced in December. The classification by Insurance Services Office, Inc. (ISO), known as the Public Protection Classification (PPC) program, assesses the fire-protection efforts in a particular community.

ISO collects information on municipal fire-protection efforts in communities throughout the United States. In each of those communities, ISO analyzes the relevant data using its Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS). The company then assigns a Public Protection Classification from 1 to 10. Class 1 generally represents superior property fire protection, and Class 10 indicates that the area's fire-suppression program doesn't meet ISO's minimum criteria.

The ISO 1 rating is validation of the superior services City residents receive. Only 204 of nearly 47,700 — 0.4 percent — fire protection service agencies in the nation have earned the ISO 1 rating.

The ISO derives ratings by considering the training, equipment, and response times of the fire department (50 percent of the score), the community's emergency communications system (10 percent), and the community's water supply (40 percent). The ISO 1 rating is a reflection not just of the City's Fire Department, but also Spartanburg County 911.

By classifying communities' ability to suppress fires, ISO helps the communities evaluate their public fire-protection services. The program provides an objective, countrywide standard that helps fire departments in planning and budgeting for facilities, equipment, and training. And by securing lower fire insurance premiums for communities with better public protection, the PPC program provides incentives and rewards for communities that choose to improve their firefighting services.

# Building a portfolio of experience

Two Wofford College students are advancing their careers in the arts with help from the Johnson Collection (TJC) in downtown Spartanburg. Jordan Wiseman is a marketing intern. Reagan Petty is improving her curatorial skills.

At the beginning of each academic year, TJC offers top seniors at Wofford the opportunity to apply for a competitive, comprehensive internship experience. This year, however, the collection made an exception and offered two internships to members of the Wofford Class of 2017.

"My Wofford art history Dr. Karen professor, Goodchild, knows that I aspire to work in arts marketing, and she reached out to the Johnson Collection on my behalf," says Wiseman, an art history major from Parkersburg, W.Va. "Following a Skype interview during my spring semester in Rome, the Johnson Collection graciously offered to take me on as their first-ever public relations intern."

Wiseman particularly loved her work promoting events and increasing interest through social media, but she says she also has enjoyed discovering how to conduct market research, track analytics and write marketing copy. She plans to enter a master's program

in arts administration or museum studies after she graduates in preparation to begin her career in either the marketing or development department of an art museum.

"Ultimately, I aspire to become the executive director of a renowned art museum," Wiseman says.

During her internship, Petty, an art history major from Franklin, Tenn., has researched art, written object labels and worked on the content and layout of exhibitions. Her internship allowed her the opportunity to help with the display of several shows, including Leo Twiggs' provocative and moving "Requiem for Mother Emanuel" exhibi-

"In the future, I would love

to curate at a contemporary art museum," she says. "I am also interested in studying race and politics in contemporary American art, and would like to remain involved in academia to continue teach and researching these subjects." The Art on Tap event held in November provided an ideal opportunity for Wiseman and Petty to show off their skills. In its fourth year, Art on Tap is a collaborative effort of TJC and RJ Rockers Brewing Co. celebrating Southern art and good beer. This year's theme was "Southern Roots: Selections of Self-Taught Art."

Wiseman's news release about the event said it was filled with "imaginative, bold and thought-provoking works that challenge the traditional ideas of artistic training and celebrate the varied backgrounds of the artists."

Petty co-curated the show along with TJC curator Dr. Erin Corrales-Diaz, a visiting professor at Wofford, another connection between the college and the collection and further evidence of the commitment to education and the arts shared by Susu and George Dean Johnson Jr.

"There is such an impressive holding of self-taught art in the Johnson Collection," Petty says. "It has been fascinating to immerse myself in the study of this exciting branch of Southern art."

After their experiences, both Wiseman and Petty feel prepared for careers in the field.

"It has been an exciting, challenging and rewarding experience, and I am fortunate to benefit from the Johnson Collection's deep commitment to education and internships," Wiseman says.

The Johnson Collection began in 2002 when George Dean Johnson Jr., Wofford Class of 1964, and his wife, Susu, began collecting paintings by Carolina artists. Today, the collection encompasses more than 1,000 objects with provenances that span the centuries and chronicle the cultural evolution of the American South.

### No, don't give up on those New Year's resolutions quite yet

Admit it. You've already forgotten those New Year's resolutions you made just a few weeks ago and most likely you didn't succeed in accomplishing most of them (any of them?). But it isn't too late to give them a second chance and it is worth doing.

Serious New Year's resolutions are never easy to bring to fruition. The key to success is to approach the changes you'd like to make in ways that will help you succeed.

Start by being realistic. Expecting giant lifestyle changes to happen quickly or easily is asking for failure. Our bad habits usually developed in small increments over a long period of time. So, changing them will also take time and probably will happen in small steps, too. You're not going to lose those 35 pounds next week, but you might lose 4 or 5 pounds next month.

In some ways, changing habits or behaviors is similar to undertaking a home remodeling project. You need to start by accepting three basic realities:

- three basic realities:
   It's going to take longer than you hoped.
- It's going to be more difficult than you expected.
- It may even take more than one try to reach your goal

Accepting these concepts can give you a realistic foundation from which to plan and take actions that will bring success.

A first step is to forget rigid time deadlines and instead set achievable minigoals that will eventually lead to your final goal. You probably can't stop smoking tomorrow, but you can make an appointment to talk to your doctor or check out the local hospital's smoking cessation program.

For weight loss, it's easy to feel depressed and like a failure when you don't drop that five pounds in week one, or when you slip up and eat that big dessert. So instead, set smaller goals that are easier to achieve. Maybe it's just skipping that morning donut this week. Next week, perhaps it's taking a daily walk after dinner. Most important is not giving up. Yes, you will make mistakes. Yes, you might even fail one or more times. Studies report loosing weight often takes multiple tries and quitting smoking as many as eight attempts.

It's important to accept that you're human and fallible, but also quite capable of giving it another go. Try again and you just might have one less resolution to make next New Year's.





# Drivers paying highest New Year's gas prices since 2014

Charlotte, N.C. – The New Year began with increased gas prices reaching the national average of \$2.34 per gallon. The national average has moved higher for 34 of the past 35 days, largely due to market reactions to last fall's OPEC deal. Pump prices increased by five cents on the first week on the year, by 18 cents per gallon on the month, and are up by 34 cents on the year.

North Carolina's average price of gas was \$2.26, which was 34 cents higher than last year's average. South Carolina's average was \$2.10, and although it is currently the cheapest average in the country it was 36 cents higher than this time last year.

The South remains home to some of the nation's least expensive markets for retail gasoline, as of the first day of 2017: South Carolina (\$2.10), Alabama (\$2.13), Tennessee (\$2.13), Mississippi (\$2.14), Texas (\$2.14), Arkansas (\$2.15) and Louisiana (\$2.15). The

region saw some temporary inventory declines last week due to exports and a power outage at CITGO's Corpus Christi, Texas, refinery that resulted in flaring and excess emissions, according to OPIS.

Moving into 2017, retail prices will continue to hinge on the ability of cartel countries to successfully implement production cuts, but retail averages are likely to increase leading up to the summer driving season as seasonal refinery maintenance gets underway this spring.

Both crude oil bench-

marks closed out the year posting the largest annual gains since 2009, with Brent gaining 52 percent and West Texas Inter-mediate gaining 45 percent to close the year. These gains can largely be attributed to the OPEC agreement, a deal brokered by OPEC and non-OPEC countries to cut crude oil production by 1.8 million barrels per day in an effort to rebalance the global supply.

Additionally, as 2016 came to a close, U.S. gasoline production reached a record high of 10.537 million bbl for the last week in December. Typically, domestic demand falls in January so higher gasoline production may lead to a stock build in the coming weeks and could have a bearish market impact on gasoline. In 2017, traders will continue to monitor whether participating countries adhere to the OPEC agreement and the rate at which U.S. gasoline production increases. At the close of formal trading session on December 30 on the NYMEX, WTI closed out the year down five cents to settle at \$53.72 per barrel.

Tips to prepare your vehicle and home for severe winter weather

Severe winter weather—including snow, ice, and freezing rain- is a hallmark of winter. AAA Carolinas offers the following tips for driving in winter weather and preparing your home for potentially icy conditions:

DRIVING ON ICE:

Avoid unnecessary travel

No one can drive well on ice. Listen to authorities' recommendations and delay travel until road conditions improve.

Accelerate, decelerate and turn slowly – Everything takes longer in icy conditions, so be sure to leave enough space between you and the vehicle in front of you – a following distance of 8-10 seconds.

Don't stop if you can avoid it – There's a big difference in the amount of inertia it takes to start mov-

ing from a full stop versus how much it takes to get moving while still rolling.

Don't power up hills – Applying extra gas on icy roads just starts your wheels spinning. Try to get a little inertia going before you reach the hill and let that inertia carry you to the top. Avoid stopping while going up a hill.

Don't use cruise control—You may need to quickly reduce your speed by lifting off the accelerator, which cannot be easily accomplished on slick roads when cruise control is engaged.

To get out of a skid – Lightly take your foot off the brake or gas and try to regain traction. Always look and steer where you want to go.

Keep an emergency kit in your vehicle – Include an ice scraper, kitty litter or sand for traction, jumper cables, cell phone with a car charger, blankets, gloves, hats, food, water and any needed medications. Be sure to bundle up with a winter coat, boots,

gloves and a hat in case you get stranded.

If you become snowbound — Stay with your vehicle. It provides temporary shelter and makes it easier for rescuers to locate you.

Stay on major routes – If you must drive, stick to thoroughfares that have been plowed or treated and stay in the most recently cleared lane.

Use extra caution on bridges and overpasses — They freeze because they are exposed to air on all of their surfaces.

Fill up on windshield washer fluid — Salt brine and sand from treated roadways will build up on your windshield, so be sure to have enough washer fluid to keep it clear. Opt for windshield washer fluid with a low freezing point to help keep ice and snow from sticking to your windshield.

Avoid distractions – Power off or store your cell phone, turn down the music and focus on driving.
