When the brothers of Spartanburg's graduate chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity Inc. wanted someone to be the face of a new event, one name rose to the top of their list: Albert Gray Sr. '71, Wofford College's only member of the chapter.

The inaugural Albert W. Gray Oratorical Contest was held December 2 in the Franklin W. Olin Building. Ken Peterson, president of local chapter, the approached Dr. Dwain Pruitt '95, Wofford's chief equity officer and vice president for community initiatives, about holding the contest at Wofford and naming it for Gray. "It was a great way for us to honor Albert Gray and for him to pass on his knowledge and experience to students," says Peterson, senior director of human resources and chief diversity officer

with ScanSource in Greenville. "He played a pivotal role. It wasn't just about having his name."

Gray, who grew up in Spartanburg, became Wofford's first Black student in 1964. His college career was interrupted when he left to serve in the U.S. Army in the Vietnam War, but he returned to earn a bachelor's degree in sociology. He went on to earn an MBA from Clark Atlanta University and had a successful career in business. Gray is a former member of the Wofford College Board of Trustees.

Brittney Doornbos, DO, was born at Spartanburg Medical Center - Mary Black Campus back when it was still Mary Black Memorial Hospital. She grew up in Spartanburg, did her schooling here and is now practicing family medicine right in the same facility where she was born.

The full circle moment has Dr. Doornbos excited to see new patients and care for families in a place she has always called home.

"I'm really excited about it," Dr. Doornbos said. "I already know about the population base and some of the doctors, so I feel like I'm already more familiar with the area. I'm excited to give back to the community and just be here with my family."

Dr. Doornbos is now accepting new patients of any age with Medical Group of the Carolinas -Family Medical Center, which is at the Spartanburg Medical Center - Mary Black Campus.



Treating the 'whole patient'

Dr. Doornbos went to Oakbrook High School, a private Christian school in Spartanburg, before going to University of South Carolina Upstate for pre-med and then attended medical school at Edward Via College of Osteopathic Medicine (VCOM).

She appreciates treating the "whole patient" and looking at the various contributing factors to one's health or illness vs. treating acute symptoms.

"It's definitely about the whole picture rather than acute illnesses and colds and rashes," she said.

Family medicine has allowed her to practice a wide scope of medicine for a broad spectrum of patients from babies to elderly patients.

"I get to have a hand in all types of things, and I'm not plant species removal sessions each year. ## Make these 10 doctor-recommended health resolutions in the New Year

(StatePoint) The New Year is the perfect time to hit the reset button on your health and wellness. Not sure where to start? Doctors say you can make the biggest impact with small, incremental tweaks to your routine.

"It is quite common after the holidays to think about all you've eaten or your reduced physical activity and get discouraged," says Jesse M. Want to get started today? Here are the 10 resolutions the AMA recommends top your list this year:

1. Get moving. Exercise is essential for your physical and mental health. The American Heart Association recommends that adults get at least 150 minutes a week of moderateintensity activity, or 75 minutes a week of vigorous-intensity activity. Just can't get to the gym? No problem: start off by going for a family walk, taking the stairs at work or parking a little farther away from the mall entrance when you're making those post-holiday gift returns.

2. Tweak your diet to include more water and less sugar-sweetened bev-



erages. Replace processed foods -- especially those with added sodium and sugar -- with nutritious, whole foods. Stock your fridge and pantry with fruits, vegetables, whole grains, nuts and seeds, low-fat dairy products, and lean meats and poultry.

3. A number of respiratory viruses circulating this winter can be serious and even life-threatening. Get up to date on your vaccines to protect yourself and your family. These include the annual flu shot. Vaccines are also available to protect older adults from severe RSV. New tools to protect infants during RSV season include maternal vaccination and monoclonal antibody immunization. If you have questions, speak with your physician and review trusted resources, including getvaccineanswers.org.

4. Get screened. Estimates based on statistical models show that since April 2020, millions of screenings for breast, colorectal and prostate cancer may have been missed due to pandemic-related care disruptions. Check in with your physician. If you're due for preventive care, tests or screenings, make an appointment. These measures are designed to keep you healthy and help your doctor spot certain conditions before they become more serious.

5. High blood pressure, often referred to as hypertension, can increase your risk of heart attack or stroke, and it affects millions of Americans. Visit ManageYourBP.org to understand what your blood pressure numbers mean and what you can do to get your blood pressure under control.

6. One in 3 American adults has prediabetes, a condition that can lead to type 2 diabetes if left unmanaged. However, healthy eating and exercise can help delay or even prevent the onset of type 2 diabetes. Learn your risk by taking a simple 2minute self-screening test a t

DoIHavePrediabetes.org. This resource also features helpful lifestyle tips that can help you reverse prediabetes.

7. If consuming alcohol, drink only in moderation. The U.S. Dietary Guidelines for Americans defines that as up to one drink per day for women and two drinks per day for men, and only by adults of legal drinking age.

8. Your health care provider can offer

resources and guidance for quitting tobacco and nicotine. Declare your home and car smoke-free to eliminate secondhand smoke exposure.

9. Follow your doctor's instructions when taking prescription drugs - especially opioids. Always store and dispose of medications safely to prevent misuse. Whenever prescribed antibiotics, take them exactly as directed. Not taking the full course can lead to antibiotic resistance, a serious public health problem, and will not make you feel better if you have a virus, such as a cold or flu.

10. Good mental health is part of good overall health. Manage your stress, get sufficient sleep, exercise and seek help from a mental health professional when you need it.

Many families have experienced problems with properties that have been passed down without a will or estate plan. These properties are referred to as heirs' property. If the deed for a property is in the name of the deceased relative and a will does not exist, it results in a "fractured" or "tangled" title shared among all multiple family members or "heirs." This makes it difficult for heirs to maintain and manage the property in several ways, like securing a loan or selling the property. Additionally, heirs' property owners are often cut off from accessing governmental repair and rebuilding programs and property tax relief programs.

A key driver of heirs' property is a lack of formal estate planning. Unfor-tunately this issue disproportionately impacts Black and Latino Americans. According to a 2023 national survey from Caring.com, only 29% of Black and 23% of Hispanic respondents had a will or other estate planning document, compared to 39% of white respondents.

Assets can easily be lost if steps aren't taken to protect them," says Stacy Spann, head of Housing Access and Affordability Philanthropy at Wells Fargo.
