morning do you remember your dreams in vivid detail? Or do you rarely, if ever, recall a dream? Whichever the case, researchers tell us that we

all do dream, every night. In fact, they've found even primates and unborn human fetuses dream. There have been many misconceptions about dreams. In ancient times, dreams were thought to be gifts from the gods. More recently, some believed

you could die if you dreamt of falling off a cliff and didn't wake before hitting the ground. Or that dreaming was the cause of sleepwalking. That's all false, but the

reality is that scientists still don't know exactly why we dream. One theory is that dreams allow us to act out activities or desires that would not be acceptable in the real world. Whatever the reason for our dreams, there is no question they open a door to our subconscious.

Being able to remember and understand our dreams can often help us to better understand the hidden workings of our mind and possibly enable us to better understand ourselves. But how can you help yourself remember your dreams?

One way is to keep a notebook beside your bed and to record your dreams as soon as you wake up. Or you might dictate a summary of the dreams to your smart phone. Just do it soon after waking because memories of dreams fade fast. It also helps to tell yourself, as you're falling asleep, that you're going to try and remember your dreams.

Remembering dreams is one thing, but figuring out what they might mean can be harder. One place to start is looking for things in your dreams, such as settings, people, animals, colors, that often can represent a part of your personality.



Recreational water illness: The souvenir you don't want from the pool or lake

SAN FRANCISCO -Every year, a growing number of people are becoming ill from playing in a community pool or natural body of water. They're called recreational water illnesses or RWIs, and there are increased reports of outbreaks - doubling from 16 in 2015 to 32 last year, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

While experts say some of the increase may be due to awareness of the issue others admit that water quality is a big factor. With state and federal agencies often without enough resources to monitor water quality, the task often falls to other organizations such as community nonprofits.

Sejal Choksi is the San Francisco Baykeeper.

"We do often find pollution and pollution sources that are going under the radar for the local agencies," she states. "That is a role that they're filing when the government

agencies, both local and federal aren't able to get out and take a look at the water and make sure it's

Cryptosporidium - often called Crypto - is one of the toughest bacterias to kill since chemicals such

as chlorine aren't enough to kill it. It's often caused by leaking sewage.

The Environmental Protection Agency has identified more than \$660 billion in needed infrastructure improvements to water, wastewater and storm water infrastructure. Michele Hlavsa is chief

of the CDC's Healthy Swimming Program and says there are a few easy steps to protect yourself and your family this sum-

"To help protect your

family and friends from crypto and other diarrheacausing germs, don't swim or let kids swim if sick with diarrhea," she says. "To protect yourself from getting sick, don't swallow the water you swim in."

Choksi says it's up to you to be aware of the latest monitoring data from agencies and waterkeepers. She adds that you should avoid taking a dip in a natural body of water if there's been recent heavy rainfall since pollutants can wash off the land into the body of water.

"It's usually OK to get into the water," she notes. "Definitely stay out if it's raining or if there's been a big rain event recently. And you can also stay up to date on water quality at many of the beaches."

Many bodies of water have their own waterkeeper or riverkeeper. More information can be found on organizations in your area at waterkeeper.org.

With this and other online services, the Secretary of State's Office technically is always open for business.

Furthermore, this system greatly improves the speed at which customers can file and receive copies of the more than 75,000 business documents handled by the Secretary of State's Office every year. Customers no longer need to wait to receive their filed documents in the mail or drive to Columbia to submit a business filing. This accelerated process saves businesses time and money to do more important things such as hiring employees and promoting their products, rather than filing paperwork with government agencies.

Not only does the Online Business Filings System save businesses money, but it saves taxpayers money as well. This system was developed through a partnership with South Carolina Interactive, also known as SC.gov, at no cost to taxpayers. In an age in which online databases can cost in the millions of dollars. I was pleased to work with SC.gov to improve the filing process for businesses and save our taxpayers money at the same time.

As your Secretary of State, I have worked hard to bring the functions of the office into the digital age while maintaining the highest caliber of customer service. The Online Business Filings System is just the next step in meeting these goals. Since the system launched in January, customers have filed over 60% of

their business documents online rather than through the mail or in person. This rapid adoption rate and the positive feedback our office has received shows that the Online Business Filing System is an overwhelming success. Moreover, South Carolina is on the forefront nationally of providing online business filing services. We are a small state, but we are far ahead of other states when it comes to providing these services.

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

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SCDOT embarks on a 10-year plan to rebuild South Carolina's highway system


SCDOT has mapped out a decade-long plan designed to rebuild decayed roads and replace structurally deficient bridges all across the state. The foundation of this mission began on Saturday, July 1. The Roads Bill passed by the General Assembly became law on that day.

The state's gas tax, currently one of the lowest in the nation, will increase for the first time since 1987. The increase effective July 1st will be 2 cents and will increase by another 2 cents each year for a total of 12 cents at the end of a six year

In addition, the vehicle sales tax was raised on July 1st along with other vehicle related fees.

A new program that is being launched as part of the plan is the Rural Road Safety Program. South Carolina has the highest rural road fatality rate in the nation. In preparation for this program, SCDOT traffic engineers have identified the rural roads that are the most dangerous.

Secretary of Transporta-tion Christy Hall said this program is aimed at the worst-of-the worst roads. "The research done by our engineers has revealed that 30% of our highway deaths occur on only 5% of our highways and these roads are in our rural areas. We plan to invest \$50 million of the new funds into this program each year to save as many lives as possible," she said.



These targeted roads will see a variety of improvements as needed in each location. Among the improvements are the addition of rumble strips, guard rail, widening shoulders and building shoulders where there are none.

Deputy Secretary for Engineering Leland Colvin said the additional funding will allow the agency to continue and expand on-going programs. "Our current bridge replacement program began in earnest in 2013. The new funding enables us to set a higher target of replacing 465 bridges over the next ten years. Many of structures are loadrestricted and cannot be used by school buses and larger trucks," said Colvin.

that will benefit from additional funding is the Interstate Widening Program. SCDOT is currently working to improve 140 miles of interstate highways. As the revenue grows, SCDOT will reach a point in the 10-year plan where even more interstate widening can be added to the program. But for now, the agency is taking a "Fix it First" approach.

SCDOT considers the hallmark of the 10-year plan to be the rebuilding and resurfacing of the roads in the state. Deputy Secretary for Finance Brian Keys said a threedecade shortfall in resources has led to crumbling roads all over the state. "The poor pavement conditions and countless potholes are spread throughout the system on our interstates, the major routes that connect our cities and towns and our secondary roads. These conditions did not occur overnight, nor will rebuilding the highway system be accomplished overnight. But the additional funding allows SCDOT to turn the corner and start the repairs," said Keys.

Secretary Hall's message to the public is patience. "Our roads fell into neglect over a 30-year period. We believe the 10-year plan can make great strides in rebuilding our system. The new funding will trickle into the Maintenance Trust Fund at first. But as funding increases in small increments over the next six years, South Carolin-ians and our visitors can expect to see more road and bridge construction all over the state with each passing year," said Hall.

SCDOT will make periodic reports on the progress of the 10-year plan as revenue accumulates and plans that SCDOT engineers have been preparing for rebuilding projects move forward to construction.
