Denny's announced as one of the 2016 Best Places To Work award winners

Columbia – The South Carolina Chamber of Commerce, Best Companies Group, and SC Biz have announced the 2016 Best Places To Work in South Carolina. Now in its 11th year, 60 companies have been selected to receive the Best Places To Work award for 2016 at the August 4th event. At the August 4th event, companies will also find out their ranking (1-36 for small/medium and 1-24 for large employer). Out of the 60 companies named, 37 are State Chamber Members. Denny's was announced as one of the winners in the large employer division (over 250 employees).

Croft State Park goes mobile

The Spartanburg Convention & Visitors Bureau (SCVB) has partnered with Croft State Park to produce www.HikeCroft.com, a new mobile website showcasing the third-largest park in the South Carolina state park system, with more than 7,000 acres and 50 miles of trails.

The mobile-oriented website is designed to help users explore Croft State Park, with overviews of the major trails and a history of the park. The site was developed by MoreView Media, a Spartanburg-based boutique marketing firm that also produced Croft's new printed tri-fold maps. These maps are color-coded to highlight the park's nine mountain biking trails, six trails for horseback riding, and multi-use trails.

As an interactive map on your GPS-enabled device, the mobile site can show users where they are on the trail. All trails are identified by usage (hiking/mountain biking/equestrian), with distances notated, and color-coded to correspond to the printed map.

Formerly named Camp Croft, the park was a World War II Army infantry training camp that once housed 250,000 soldiers. As a result, there are over two dozen points of interest along the trails: remaining military foxholes, a cemetery from the early 1800's, and information on the Revolutionary War 'Battle of Kelsey Creek,' fought on what is now park property. These spots are featured on the site, along with photos and historical notes.

In addition to its extensive trail system, Croft State Park offers camping, fishing and boating, picnic shelters, geocaching, and a shooting range. Croft is also known regionally for its equestrian facilities, and regularly hosts shows in its arena.

City Council approves streetscaping improvements for Magnolia Street

Another downtown streetscaping project got the nod from City Council at their meeting on Monday, voting unanimously to approve a \$148,380 contract with Capital Construction of the Carolinas for improvements along Magnolia Street, between Dunbar and W Saint John streets. The Magnolia Street project is the third of the City's \$2.3 million streetscaping plan, passed by Council in 2014.

Designed to improve storefront visibility, create additional public space, and significantly improve the street's pedestrian experience. Plans call for replacing and widening the sidewalk, as well as constructing four "sidewalk patios," around 24 ft. wide and 42 ft. long, meant to serve as outdoor dining space. The project also includes changes to the street's landscaping, removing the existing trees located in the sidewalk, and replacing them with trees planted primarily around the patio spaces. No on-street parking will be lost as a result of the project.

Three elected to Wofford Board

Two Wofford College alumni and the CEO of a Maryland-based national real estate development corporation have been elected to the Wofford College Board of Trustees.

Elected Wednesday, June 8th, at the Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church of South Carolina held in Florence, were the Rev. William F. Malambri III, class of 1998, pastor at Central United Methodist Church in Florence; James C. Meadors, class of 1981, president of Meadors Inc. in Charleston; and Jodie W. McLean, CEO of EDENS, one of the nation's leading private owners, operators and developers of retail real estate, originating in Columbia, with offices along the East Coast and in Texas.

The three replace the Rev. B. Mike Alexander, class of 1973; Dr. James E. Bostic Jr.; and J. Harold Chandler, class of 1971, whose terms have expired.

Re-elected to four-year terms were: Justin Converse, class of 1996; Jimmy Gibbs; Laura Hoy; Leon Patterson, class of 1963; and Ed Reeves.

Earlier this year, at its May meeting, the board of trustees elected these officers for the 2016-17 year: R. Michael James, class of 1973, chair; James M. Johnson, class of 1971, vice chair; and Costa M. Pleicones, class of 1965, secretary.

Malambri, a native of Rock Hill, received his M.Div. from Duke University in 2001 and is a recognized leader in the United Methodist Church in South Carolina.

At Wofford, Malambri was selected as the Presidential International Scholar and was initiated into Phi Beta Kappa. He graduated magna cum laude.

After becoming a full elder in 2004, Malambri served Central United Methodist Church in Florence as an associate pastor before moving to Spartanburg's St. James United Methodist Church in 2009. In 2012, he moved back to Central UMC in Florence as senior pastor.

Malambri serves on the South Carolina United Methodist Conference's Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry and its Board of Ordained Ministry. He is a former trustee of Spartanburg Methodist College. He is a member of Rotary International, Helping Florence Flourish Committee and Florence Faith-Based Partnership.

Malambri and his wife, Sally, also a graduate of Wofford, have been continuous supporters of the college. They have two children, Mac, age 11, and Annagray, age 8.

Meadors, a native of South Carolina, is one of the most recognized leaders in the construction industry in the state, particularly in the areas of historic preservation and authenticity. He founded Meadors Inc. in 1985 to focus on the conservation and restoration of historic structures. The company is composed of six workshops or areas of expertise – architecture, construction, conservation and preservation planning, design services, cabinetry and millwork, and estate management and maintenance.

Meadors, who came to Wofford on a full football scholarship and was a First Team All-American his senior year, comes from a long line of Wofford alumni. His father, Bishop M.L. Meadors, class of 1955, is a former Wofford trustee, and two brothers graduated from Wofford. His three children also attended Wofford – daughter Weatherly Meadors, class of 2009; and sons James Campbell Meadors Jr., class of 2012, and John Deering Meadors, class of 2015. He has served on the Alumni Association Board, and he and his wife, Anne, have served on the Parents Advisory Council. They have generously supported numerous projects and programs at the college.

He served in the U.S. Army Reserves while at Wofford, and later served on active duty as part of the Army Corps of Engineers.

Meadors has served as chair for the Charleston

Green Committee and is chair of the Board of Appeals for the city of Charleston, which he has done for the past 18 years. He is a member of the John Wesley United Methodist Church in Charleston. He also served as a trustee of Columbia College for 12 years.

McLean, a native of Chicago, Ill., is a business leader formerly from South Carolina and widely known in business circles in the state and the region.

She received her bachelor's degree from the University of South Carolina and studied at the USC Honors College.

McLean has been a leader at EDENS for more than 20 years, serving as chief investment officer, president and now CEO. She has been responsible for the development, redevelopment, acquisition and disposition of more than \$10 billion in retail assets.

She is a current Wofford parent, with a stepdaughter in the class of 2018 and a son in the class of 2019. She recently relocated to the Washington, D.C., area from Columbia, where she served on the board of the Hammond School. She is on the George Washington University School of Business / Center for Real Estate and Urban Analysis Board of Advisors, the South Carolina Honors College Partnership Board and the boards of other institutions and charitable organizations. She is a member of the Liberty Fellowship class of 2009 and was chosen as the 2007 South Carolina Honors College Distinguished Alumna.

Every parent has heard complaints about summer boredom. Our kids may initially welcome that summer freedom, but all that empty time can sometimes become a burden.

That's where parents can help by approaching summer activities for their kids in a positive way. Some parents, for example, worry too much about their children's futures. They view summer as a time to better prepare their kids for college or that future career, even though the child may still be years away from actual college attendance.

While computer or math camps, or hospital or business internships, can be good experiences for a child with a passion to head in that direction, they often are a joyless burden when it's just mom or dad who has decided this will be a great way for their child to spend the summer. Too often kids are pushed into these camps and experiences because anxious parents are trying to fast forward their child's intellectual and educational development, or attempting to lead them toward a career path that is of the parents' choosing.

The recommendation from most experts is to remember that summer activities can be many things, but they also should be just plain fun at least some of the time. Activities that foster physical, social, cultural and artistic development are certainly positive goals summer planning should try to achieve. You want your child to gain experiences that will give them a greater understanding of themselves and the world they live in.

But in order for that to happen, it's important to focus on what the child's interests and passions are. If a child is into sports, then a sports-related camp that will improve skills and build confidence can be a great idea. The same applies for a child with an interest in art, or math, or some other specialized area. But trying to force the child with a passion for art into several weeks of basketball camp, just because mom and dad thinks he or she needs to be more well rounded, is a recipe for an unhappy child.

It's not necessary to plan and program every minute of your child's summer. A little boredom is fine and better than over-programming to keep your child constantly busy. But trying to help your child engage in activities that he or she really cares about and enjoys can make summer a positive, fun experience for the entire family.

Easy grilling ideas for the summer season

(StatePoint) Summer was made for entertaining -- from casual dinner parties to impromptu get-togethers. And what's better than centering the entertainment on the grill? Beyond the standard burgers and hot dogs, there are an array of appetizers, main courses and even desserts that are all grill-friendly and easy to make.

"Summer cooking is all about great, fresh flavors and keeping things simple and unfussy," says Erin Madsen, executive editor of BettyCrocker.com, an entertaining resource that offers recipes, how-tos, and test-kitchen tips.

This summer, the experts at Betty Crocker are

focused on quick dinners on the grill that require very little cleanup. You can cut down on mess, they say, with foil pack recipes that use an indirect-heating method to cook the food.

For instance, this flavorful recipe for Green Chile Cheddar Burgers, brings together classic cheeseburgers, a zip of green chiles and craveable corn salsa.

Ingredients:

- 1 lb extra-lean (at least 90 percent) ground beef
- 2 cans (4.5 oz each) Old El Paso chopped green chiles
- 2 teaspoons chili powder
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground



cumin

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese
- 1 1/2 cups frozen whole kernel sweet corn, thawed
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh cilantro
- 4 lime wedges

Directions:

- Heat gas or charcoal grill. Cut 4 (18x12-inch) sheets of heavy duty foil. Spray with cooking spray.
- In medium bowl, mix beef, 1 can green chiles, chili powder, 1 teaspoon of the cumin, 3/4 teaspoon of the salt and 1 cup of the cheese until blended. Form

into four patties about 1/2-inch thick. In small bowl, mix corn, remaining can of green chiles, remaining 1/2 teaspoon cumin and remaining 1/4 teaspoon salt.

• Place beef patty on center of each sheet of foil. Scoop about 1/3 cup of corn mixture on top of each patty.

• Bring up two sides of foil so edges meet. Seal edges, making tight 1/2-inch fold; fold again, allowing space for heat circulation and expansion. Fold other sides to seal.

• Place packs on grill over medium heat. Cover grill; cook eight minutes. Rotate packs 1/2 turn; cook seven to nine minutes

longer or until patties are no longer pink in center and meat thermometer inserted in center of patties reads 160 degrees. Remove packs from grill. Cut large X across top of each pack. Carefully fold back foil. Top each patty with 2 tablespoons cheese; garnish with cilantro and a lime wedge.

Participating governments and host institutions, corporations, and foundations around the world also provide direct and indirect support to the Program, which operates in over 160 countries worldwide.

This year marks the 70th anniversary of the Fulbright Program's establishment in 1946 under legislation introduced by U.S. Senator J. William Fulbright of Arkansas. Since then, the Program has given more than 360,000 students, scholars, teachers, artists, and scientists the opportunity to study, teach and conduct research, exchange ideas,

and contribute to finding solutions to shared international concerns.

Fulbrighters address critical global challenges -- from sustainable energy and climate change to public health and food security -- in all areas, while building relationships, knowledge, and leadership in support of the long-term interests of the United States and the world. Fulbright alumni have achieved distinction in many fields, including 54 who have been awarded the Nobel Prize, 82 who have received Pulitzer Prizes, and 33 who have served as a head of state or government.

Wofford lands 29 on Spring Academic All-SoCon

Three hundred and eighty-nine student-athletes accounted for 473 spots on the Spring 2016 Academic All-Southern Conference Team, the league office announced Monday. Wofford represented the conference with 29 student-athletes, which accounted for 35 total spots. Each of the SoCon's 10 full-time institutions had at least 21 honorees, representing the sports of men's and women's basketball, men's and women's indoor track and field, wrestling, men's and women's golf, men's lacrosse, men's and women's outdoor track and field, men's and women's tennis,

baseball and softball. Associate members for men's lacrosse and wrestling were also eligible for the award, accounting for 41 of the selections. To be eligible for the academic all-conference team, student-athletes must carry at least a 3.3 cumulative grade point average at the conclusion of the spring semester – a change from the previous criteria that was based on the GPA entering the semester of competition – and were required to compete in at least one-half of their teams' competitions. In addition, the student-athletes must have successfully completed at least three

semesters at their institutions, making true freshmen and first-year transfers ineligible for inclusion. With the GPA component now based off of the student-athletes' averages at the end of the semester of competition, the Winter Academic All-SoCon team was eliminated, resulting in several track and field student-athletes appearing in the spring list twice, once each for the indoor and outdoor seasons. ETSU's Mallore Schurr, who plays women's basketball and softball, also earned double inclusion. Sixteen of the conference's student-athletes combined

for 22 of the perfect 4.0 cumulative GPAs.

Infants should ride rear-facing until at least two years of age, or until they have reached the maximum height

and weight limits of rear-facing car seats, according to The American Academy of Pediatrics. Choose a car seat designed with both safety and comfort in mind, such as the Graco Extend2Fit 3-in-1 Car Seat, which provides five inches of extra legroom and six recline positions. It can be used in rear-facing mode up to 50 pounds and forward facing in a 5-point harness up to 65 pounds, and its harness and headrest are adjustable as your child grows. Additional car seat information

Traveling with children will always be somewhat stressful, and requires a sense of humor; but if you involve them in decisions and think about ways to keep kids comfortable longer on the trip, you will be able to have greater peace of mind and a lot more fun while on the open road.
