Columbia – The South Carolina Chamber of Commerce, Best Companies Group, and SC Biz have announced the 2016 Best Places To Work in South Carolina. Now in its 11th year, 60 companies have been selected to receive the Best Places To Work award for 2016 at the August 4th event. At the August 4th event, companies will also find out their ranking (1-36 for small/medium and 1-24 for large employer). Out of the 60 companies named, 37 are State Chamber Members. Denny's was announced as one of the winners in the large employer division (over 250 employees).

Croft State Park goes mobile

The Spartanburg Convention & Visitors Bureau (SCVB) has partnered with Croft State Park to produce www.HikeCroft.com, a new mobile website showcasing the third-largest park in the South Carolina state park system, with more than 7,000 acres and 50 miles of trails.

The mobile-oriented website is designed to help users explore Croft State Park, with overviews of the major trails and a history of the park. The site was developed by MoreView Media, a Spartanburg-based boutique marketing firm that also produced Croft's new printed tri-fold maps. These maps are color-coded to highlight the park's nine mountain biking trails, six trails for horseback riding, and multi-use trails.

As an interactive map on your GPS-enabled device, the mobile site can show users where they are on the trail. All trails are identified by usage (hiking/mountain biking/equestrian), with distances notated, and color-coded to correspond to the printed map.

Formerly named Camp Croft, the park was a World War II Army infantry training camp that once housed 250,000 soldiers. As a result, there are over two dozen points of interest along the trails: remaining military foxholes, a cemetery from the early 1800's, and information on the Revolutionary War 'Battle of Kelsey Creek,' fought on what is now park property. These spots are featured on the site, along with photos and historical notes. In addition to its extensive trail system, Croft State Park offers camping, fishing and boating, picnic shelters, geocaching, and a shooting range. Croft is also known regionally for its equestrian facilities, and regularly hosts shows in its arena.

City Council approves streetscaping improvements for Magnolia Street

Another downtown streetscaping project got the nod from City Council at their meeting on Monday, voting unanimously to approve a \$148,380 contract with Capital Construction of the Carolinas for improvements along Magnolia Street, between Dunbar and W Saint John streets. The Magnolia Street project is the third of the City's \$2.3 million streetscaping plan, passed by Council in 2014.

Designed to improve storefront visibility, create additional public space, and significantly improve the street's pedestrian experience. Plans call for replacing and widening the sidewalk, as well as constructing four "sidewalk patios," around 24 ft. wide and 42 ft. long, meant to serve as outdoor dining space. The project also includes changes to the street's landscaping, removing the existing trees located in the sidewalk, and replacing them with trees planted primarily around the patio spaces. No on-street parking will be lost as a result of the project. Malambri, a native of Rock Hill, received his M.Div. from Duke University in 2001 and is a recognized leader in the United Methodist Church in South Carolina.

At Wofford, Malambri was selected as the Presidential International Scholar and was initiated into Phi Beta Kappa. He graduated magna cum laude.

After becoming a full elder in 2004, Malambri served Central United Methodist Church in Florence as an associate pastor before moving to Spartanburg's St. James United Methodist Church in 2009. In 2012, the moved back to Central UMC in Florence as senior pastor.

Meadors, a native of South Carolina, is one of the most recognized leaders in the construction industry in the state, particularly in the areas of historic preservation and authenticity. He founded Meadors Inc. in 1985 to focus on the conservation and restoration of historic structures. The company is composed of six workshops or areas of expertise - architecture, construction, conservation and preservation planning, design services, cabinetry and millwork, and estate management and maintenance.

Meadors, who came to Wofford on a full football scholarship and was a First Team All-American his senior year, comes from a long line of Wofford alumni. His father, Bishop M.L. "I think from a construction standpoint, our ties are just as nice as what other high-end brands can produce. Plus, we make them from start to finish. They're 'our' ties," says

That same summer Randall took a service trip that would change his business forever. He traveled to Guatemala, where he worked with the organization Mission Guatemala, which seeks to provide medical care and community aid. It was at this point that Randall realized his business should be about more than making bow ties.

"Wearing a bow tie can give you confidence and make you look good — but I am more focused on the broader implications of what my business can do," says Randall. "My business needed motivation, and I found that motivation in Guatemala."

Today, Randall donates a portion of Tied & True's proceeds to Mission Guatemala, and he returns each summer to volunteer and to present Mission Chandler Creek Elementary School in Greer. Every Monday a group of 14 boys meets before school to learn life lessons, build character and practice social skills. Randall spoke with the boys and helped supply each with a bow tie. He believes that wearing the bow ties to their Work in Progress meetings will give them with a sense of confidence and will inspire them to "be excellent" throughout their school day.

When he arrived at Wofford, Randall was quick to get involved in The Space in the Mungo Center, the college's professional development and entrepreneurial program. He knew the value of his ties, but he needed support to grow his idea into a fullfledged business. During his first year, Randall developed a brand and marketing strategy through The Space. He adjusted his retail prices and formed a limited liability company. Within the next year he

into four patties about 1/2inch thick. In small bowl, mix corn, remaining can of green chiles, remaining 1/2teaspoon cumin and remaining 1/4 teaspoon salt.

• Place beef patty on center of each sheet of foil. Scoop about 1/3 cup of corn mixture on top of each patty.

• Bring up two sides of foil so edges meet. Seal edges, making tight 1/2inch fold; fold again, allowing space for heat circulation and expansion. Fold other sides to seal.

• Place packs on grill over medium heat. Cover grill; cook eight minutes. Rotate packs 1/2 turn; cook seven to nine minutes longer or until patties are no longer pink in center and meat thermometer inserted in center of patties reads 160 degrees. Remove packs from grill. Cut large X across top of each pack. Carefully fold back foil. Top each patty with 2 tablespoons cheese; garnish with cilantro and a lime wedge.

This is also an ideal time to schedule an appointment with an optometrist if kids are complaining of any near or farsightedness. Whether it's the blackboard, a book or a projected image in the classroom, wearing needed glasses on day one will make the tran-
