### Roebuck student earns place on Furman University's Dean's List

Greenville - Jacob Henjes of Roebuck has earned a place on Furman University's dean's list for the 2020 spring semester. Furman's dean's list is composed of full-time undergraduate students who earn a grade point average of 3.4 or higher on a four-point system. Henjes' parents are Shana Henjes and Doug Henjes.

Furman is a private, undergraduate liberal arts and sciences university of 2,800 students in Greenville, South Carolina. The university is noted for its rigorous academic program and strong faculty, and its 750-acre campus is widely recognized as one of the most beautiful in the nation.

### Three Spartanburg County students complete Accelerate, GSSM's virtual engineering program

Hartsville — Brandon Anthony Carter, Thomas Garrett Pemberton, and Andrew Watson of Spartanburg County received their certificates of completion for Accelerate, the South Carolina Governor's School for Science & Mathematics (GSSM) virtual engineering program, on Wednesday, June 3, 2020.

Brandon Anthony Carter of James F. Byrnes High School will attend Clemson University.

Thomas Garrett Pemberton of James F. Byrnes High School will attend Clemson University.

Andrew Watson of James F. Byrnes High School will attend Clemson University.

The award and recognition ceremony was designed to celebrate their achievements and successful completion of this one-of-a-kind, three-year engineering program.

Originally launched with private support, Accelerate is currently funded through the South Carolina General Assembly and corporate partnerships. The program emphasizes mastery of the foundational tools of engineering, such as physics, calculus, and chemistry, but also places significant emphasis on real-world, team-based projects, creativity, and communication.

In total, 23 students from around the state received their certificates, representing eleven South Carolina high schools.

### Spartans women's golf tandem of Paksanont/Hutto finish runner-up at 43rd Carolinas Women's Four-Ball Championship

Newton, N.C. — The USC Upstate women's golf tandem of Pan Paksanont (Nonthaburi, Thailand) and Brooke Hutto (Aiken, Class of 2019) finished in a tie for second place (-10) at the 43rd Carolinas Women's Four-Ball Championship recently.

An opening round 66 placed the duo in a tie for second yesterday afternoon. Paksanont had the highlight of the day, picking up a birdie on hole four and following it up with an Eagle on the fifth hole. The pair got off to a slow start shooting even on the front nine. Hutto then carded four consecutive birdies on the back nine to catapult the tandem back into a tie for second place.

Hutto capped her senior season at USC Upstate (2019) by appearing in 11 events and playing in 28 total rounds. Hutto had a 77.75 stroke average, putting her third on the team. Her lowest round came in the BUBBA Burger Jacksonville Classic on October 1st and 2nd where she shot a team low 72.

This past season, Paksanont led the team and had the second best winning percentage in school history at .876. The senior's 73.83 stroke average is tied for the second lowest in program history and she capped her season with a low round of 70. The Thailand native recorded a trio of top-10 finishes and a pair of top-five finishes this season.

The pairing of Emma Charles (Hartsville) and Victoria Hall (Moore) shot up the leader board as they shot a six-under par round to tie with Hutto/Paksanont. The duo of Jensen Castle (West Columbia) and Rachel Kuehn (Asheville, N.C.) won the event with back-to-back rounds of 64 for a final score of 128 (-16).

## OneSpartanburg awards \$10K to SAM 'Smart Start' program

"Our analysis has shown that over 19% of our students across Spartanburg County that have said they're going to college are not actually enrolling. We need to change that," said Meghan Smith, Director of College and Career Readiness for the Spartanburg Academic Movement.

To remedy that, the Spartanburg Academic Movement is introducing Smart Start, a program designed to help students bridge the gap between their intention to start college and their actual enrollment. OneSpartanburg recently contributed

\$10,000 to pilot the program, furthering their partnership with SAM to develop homegrown talent from cradle to career.

The Smart Start program is beginning this week by connecting 23 community members who have volunteered to serve as mentors with more than 100 graduated Spartanburg High School seniors who have been invited to participate in the program. Mentors and students will communicate through secure text lines. Students who complete the program and enroll in college will earn \$250 in credits to their col-

lege's bookstore to offset expenses for books, supplies or technology.

"We at Spartanburg High School are so appreciative of this opportunity for our recent graduates. Our most sincere thanks to OneSpartanburg for the generous donation and Spartanburg Academic Movement for the partnership to help ensure these targeted students follow through with all the steps to enroll in college," said Piper Holmes, Assistant Director of Guidance at Spartanburg High School.

## A cool salad for hot days

Dear Readers: I'll be taking a break from writing my column to focus on helping those in need during the coronavirus crisis. Meantime, I'd like to share with you some of my favorite summertime recipes from years past. Hopefully, they'll inspire you to cook up something "Diva-Licious."

Calypso is probably best known as a type of Caribbean folk song. It's inspired by a combination of musical styles and languages common to Trinidad. Calypso music is rhythmically smooth, and the words are often colorful and sharply critical in a witty way.

This recipe for Calypso Black Bean and Corn Salad draws inspiration from the Caribbean, the easy spirit of the islands and the music heard there. The salad takes only a few minutes to assemble, and it can be served either cold or at room temperature. Best of all, most of the ingredients can be found in the pantry or the freezer.

This festive salad instantly became one of my all-time favorites when I was challenged by chef Bobby Flay on his Food Network show "Throwdown With Bobby Flay." I decided to serve the Calypso Black Bean and Corn Salad as a side dish with my fiery Jerk Chicken.

The wonderful thing about this combination of black beans, corn and spices is that it perfectly complements the smokiness of barbecued meats. It's unique and colorful, and it tastes better the longer it sits in the pepper-infused citrus marinade. The judges loved my dishes, and I was declared the winner of the challenge.

While it was wonderful to claim a culinary victory over chef Flay, the real winners were the guests at the barbecue. They got to eat some of the best dishes in Texas! Try this delicious salad, and you'll feel like a winner, too!

### CALYPSO CORN AND BLACK BEAN SALAD

- 1 (10-ounce) package frozen corn kernels, thawed
- 2 (15-ounce) cans black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 large red bell pepper, seeded and diced
- 1 small fresh jalapeño chili, seeded and minced
- 1/2 cup firmly packed chopped fresh cilantro
- 1/4 cup freshly squeezed lime juice
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Combine the corn, beans, bell pepper, jalapeño, cilantro, lime juice, oil, sugar, salt and pepper in a large bowl. Taste and adjust seasonings. Cover and chill one hour or overnight to combine flavors. Serves 4 to 6. \*\*\*

## AAA forecasts Americans will take 700 million trips this summer

Charlotte, N.C. –This summer, AAA forecasts Americans will take 700 million trips based on economic indicators and state re-openings. That number is down nearly 15% compared to last July through September and is the first decline in summer travel since 2009.

“Though cautiously and more spontaneous, AAA booking trends show that Americans are in fact still making travel plans for this summer,” said Tiffany Wright, AAA spokesperson – The Auto Club Group in the Carolinas. “When they do start to get out and explore, travelers will hit the roads to take on 683 million road trips.”

Car trips reign supreme accounting for 97% of the favored mode of transportation. Air travel will be off by about 74%, while rail, cruise ship and bus travel will slide by 86%. Were it not for the pandemic, AAA would be projecting 857 million trips during the third quarter, a 3.6% increase over last year. By this analysis, the pandemic wiped out nearly 150 million person-trips this summer.

AAA travel experts have begun to see positive trends in travel, noting that hotel and rental car bookings have been gradually increasing since April. Air travel has been slower to rebound. The share of travelers making plans 48 hours to 7 days before departure – a sign that people are arranging last-minute trips – is significantly higher than normal.

### Road Trips and Top TripTik Destinations

With travel restrictions lifting but social distancing still recommended, it's no surprise that 97% of summer trips are road trips. That's up from an average of 87% over the last five years. Road trips allow travelers to make their own schedule and customize stops based on comfort level and interests. For families, especially those with small children, it is an easy and less expensive way to travel. And an added benefit right now - gas prices remain

low.

This summer, road trippers should plan their travel in advance using AAA TripTik – a tradition that has guided generations of road trippers with paper and digital maps. Plus, it now includes COVID-19 Travel Restriction updates.

When it comes to TripTik destination searches, prominent cities that typically draw large crowds are not as popular. ### Road Trips and Traffic across the Country

INRIX, in collaboration with AAA, analyzed the top 20 metropolitan areas and all states to inform travelers of the chances they will run into traffic

when they travel. While the top 20 metro areas will remain below typical traffic congestion, a number of states could expect to see traffic congestion rise to normal levels – but still be below usual summer traffic patterns.

According to INRIX, the chances that North Carolinians are likely to run into “normal” traffic congestion while traveling is below 50% - whereas South Carolinians are more likely than not to run into “normal” traffic congestion while traveling.

### Summer Gas Prices at 17-year Lows

Carolinians can expect to find the lowest summertime gas prices since 2003. Demand is still down nearly 25% compared to last year and while North Carolina's state average is just above \$2 per gallon at \$2.04, South Carolina's state average is still lower at \$1.92 per gallon.

When at the pump, AAA recommends wearing disposable gloves or using a plastic sandwich bag to avoid touching the pump handle. When back in your car, be sure to clean your hands with sanitizer or wipes.

### Hotel Sanitation Tips

Prior to your hotel stay, AAA recommends calling ahead to ensure your hotel is still open and asking about any restrictions or changes to the check-in process. It's likely that the hotel has reduced the number of times guests have face-to-face interactions with other guests and hotel staff. When you check into your room, remember to wipe down surfaces with disinfecting wipes. Pay special attention to surfaces such as light switches, door knobs, faucets and remote controls.

### Other Modes of Transportation

Other modes of transportation – cruises, buses and rail – have seen the most dramatic drop in travel volume. Most cruise lines have suspended all departures until at least August 1, with only limited offerings after that. AAA, however, has noted growing demand for departures in 2021.

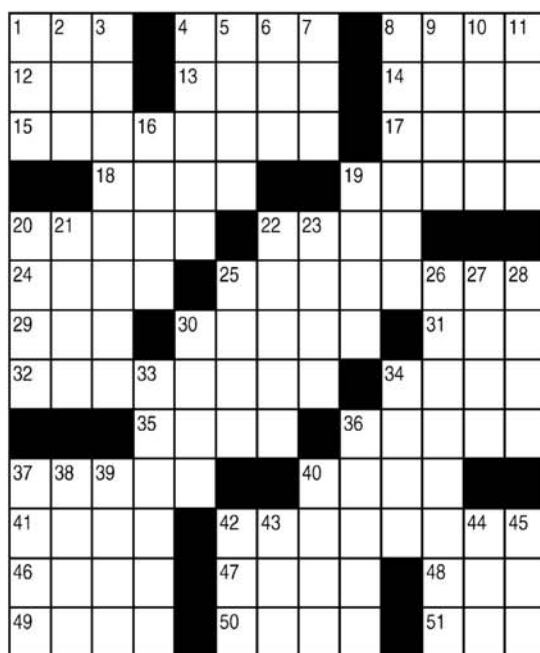

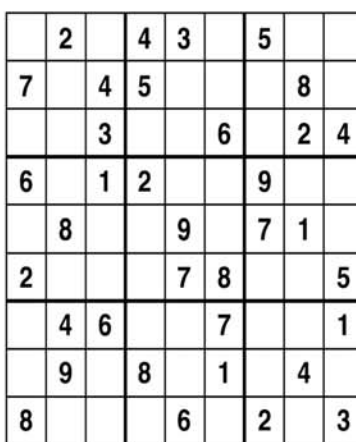
