The Haven to open new office, aims to expand services

The Haven's South Church Street location has been sold, but the organization's executive director, Mark Bound, said necessary services aren't going anywhere - in fact, they're planning to expand.



The Haven purchased a new office on East Main Street that is currently being renovated, and the group is leasing the Church Street location until the new offices are ready to move into. Housing was found for residents who were staying at the old location before its sale in April, and the group has a unique solution to house those in need for a far lower cost than in past years.

"We've entered into an agreement with one of the hotel chains, one of the extended stay hotel chains here," Bound said. "So, for the next year, we will be paying for that stay. We've got a block of rooms that have been agreed to be blocked off for us so that we can continue. We're still continuing to explore other partners to be able to do that with, and the goal is that starting on July 1st, we'll begin a capital campaign to build a new shelter facility within the county limits that would be far more cost effective to run."

The Haven is one of the few facilities in the greater Spartanburg area that provides shelter to homeless families; most shelters house men and women separately.

While the physical space of the organization is decreasing, Bound emphasized that the changes are not a downsizing, but a reorganizing.

Spartanburg Community College Foundation to endow five new funds at the Spartanburg County Foundation

The Spartanburg Community College Foundation recently announced that five new endowment agreements have been established at The Spartanburg County Foundation totaling \$85,000. "This is an incredible time to be at the SCC Foundation. New scholarships are being established, endowments created and we are making our donated dollars work to directly benefit SCC students," shares Bea Walters Smith, executive director of the SCC Foundation and Advancement.

"We are pleased that the Spartanburg Community College Foundation has entrusted the Foundation with these funds," states Troy Hanna, president and CEO of The Spartanburg County Foundation. "We value our meaningful partnerships with local educational institutions and are honored to assist in providing these fiduciary services and in meeting these critical needs for students in Spartanburg County and beyond."

Two of the endowed agreements are scholarships - the Jimmy Painter Horticulture Scholarship and the Caroline Ragsdale Reutter Memorial Scholarship for Culinary Arts. The Jimmy Painter Horticulture Scholarship Fund was created in honor of Jimmy Painter for his distinguished 37-year teaching career at SCC and for service as the College's first

horticulture department chair. This scholarship allows students who live outside Spartanburg County pursuing a degree in horticulture to pay in-county tuition. On average, six and 10 students a year are awarded this scholarship. "This scholarship fund plays an important role in the success of our students and our program," explains Jason Bagwell, horticulture department chair.

The Caroline Ragsdale Reutter Memorial Scholarship was just endowed thanks to the success of a recent fundraising event, a Cakewalk in Budapest, attended by the late Reutter's family and many friends. This scholarship will provide financial support to a student pursuing a degree in culinary arts.

Both scholarships will be awarded on an annual basis to SCC students who meet set criteria. Scholarship applications are available online from the SCC Foundation January 1-June 30 for current and incoming students via the following link: www.sccsc.edu/scc-scholarships

The three remaining endowed agreements are specialized funds that assist specific requests from students. This includes the SCC Arboretum Fund, the Sherry Vaughn Student Book Request Fund and the SCC Student Emergency Fund.

The SCC Arboretum Fund was established with dollars generated from the horticulture department's annual special events including the spring and fall plant sales and Arboretum Adventures. These funds will be used to assist in beautification projects on the SCC Central Campus. The Sherry Vaughn Student Book Fund and the SCC Student Emergency Fund reached the endowment level by dollars raised from the College's annual Economic Visionaries event, which is held in March. Each of these funds provide support for current students who may need further assistance in addition to financial aid. Ron Jackson, vice president of SCC's Student Affairs adds, "The availability of the Student Emergency Fund and the Sherry Vaughn Book Fund represent opportunities to help students minimize, and in some cases, overcome barriers that have discouraged or prevented them from achieving their academic goals in the past. We are excited and appreciate the work of the Foundation to make these opportunities available for our students."

Now, what was it I wanted to remember to tell you?

As we grow older most of us forget more often than we once did. Although memory loss is a natural part of the aging process, experts say it usually isn't problematic for most people until after age 70.

This doesn't mean that you might not be forgetful, even though 70 still may be a ways off. We all have memory lapses, regardless of our age. Even as teenagers we forgot things (cleaning our rooms! that English assignment!), but as we get older we notice more the frustrations that forgetting can bring.

Fortunately, if you find your memory really does seem weaker and more troublesome, there are steps you can take to combat the problem.

A health check is your starting point. Talk with your physician about all drugs you are taking (over the counter and prescription), and have your cholesterol and blood pressure checked. These things, as well as some diseases, have been linked to memory problems.

Researchers report smoking and heavy alcohol use can also affect memory. Harvard Medical School studies found that smokers perform much worse than non-smokers in memory and thinking skills tests.

Staying physically and mentally active can also combat memory loss. When you exercise regularly you're increasing blood flow for better brain health and function. Studies have found that 30 minutes of aerobic exercise, like walking or jogging five times a week, may even reverse some memory issues.

There's also some evidence that an active brain performs better. A full social life, interacting with family and friends, is one way. Anything that challenges your brain, from puzzles to playing games to reading and writing, also appears to stimulate brain cells and their connections.

A healthy diet, rich in fruits and vegetables, but low in saturated fat and cholesterol, may also benefit brain health. And yes, fish really may be brain food, especially when it's fish rich in omega-3 fatty acids like salmon and tuna.

Occasional forgetfulness isn't a reason to worry. Simply writing down things you want to remember can reduce memory frustration, but do pay attention if your memory issues are more severe.

If you forget things much more frequently, have difficulty learning new tasks, repeat phrases or stories in the same conversation, or forget how to do things you've done many times before, there may be a more serious problem. Talk with your doctor or professional counselor for an evaluation.

Greenville Health Authority Board of Trustees approves grant

Furman University Institute for the Advancement of Community Health (IACH) has received a \$592,486 grant for a project that addresses care for Greenville's senior adult population through the Healthy Greenville initiative.

The grant is part of \$5.3 million approved by the Greenville Health Authority (GHA) Board of Trustees to improve health-related care, health education and health research for the citizens of Greenville County.

Furman's three-year grant covers the work of a coalition that tackles health-harming legal barriers in the senior adult community. The coalition, led by Furman's IACH, includes Greenville Health System and South Caro-

lina Legal Services.

Said Eli Hestermann, executive director of IACH, "With the support of the Greenville Health Authority, we are able to expand our successful Medical-Legal Partnership model that currently serves children and their families to now include the senior population.

"We are excited about these additional opportunities to improve the health of some of our most vulnerable citizens while expanding hands-on learning opportunities for Furman students at the intersection of medicine and law," added Hestermann.

In addition to Furman's IACH, others receiving grants for the Healthy Greenville initiative include Greenville Free Medical Clinic; Clemson University Department of Public Health Sciences;

Pendleton Place; The Phoenix Center; and Communities in Schools.

Including previously approved grants from fiscal year 2017, the total amount of grant funding invested in Healthy Greenville by GHA is approximately \$17.8 million.

"These [Healthy Greenville] programs will make Greenville County a healthier community and significantly improve the quality of life for families county-wide," said Mike Ellison, chair of the GHA grant committee, which reviewed more than 49

proposed grants for this year's cycle.
