On February 26, 1987 President Ronald Reagan officially declared Proclamation 5613 making March National Disabilities Awareness Month. The proclamation called for people to provide understanding, encouragement and opportunities to help persons with disabilities to lead productive and fulfilling lives. Coincidentally that same year, the Charles Lea Center Foundation was established to support the Center and its mission to improve the quality of life for those with disabilities and special needs.

St. Patrick's Day the easy way

My first love is culinary history. Researching, reading and writing about the history of food and recipes is what fuels my passion to share what I've learned in my cookbooks and the articles that I write for newspapers, blogs and magazines.

When I was asked to write a column about St. Patrick's Day, I discovered the fascinating history of Irish potatoes. The people of Ireland embraced the potato around 1780. The crop rapidly became the primary source of food for most of the population.

Potatoes are nourishing and filling, and contain most of the vitamins needed in our daily diet. The crop also is a popular food source around the world because it only requires an acre of land and will grow under almost any conditions.

An Irish potato is covered with an off-white or creamcolored skin. The flesh is creamy white. Black flecks or marks often mottle the flesh of the potato, but have no impact on the flavor. An Irish potato is waxy, which makes it hold its shape when boiled, a common cooking technique in Ireland. The potatoes also are delicious when fried, roasted or broiled. However, the potato's waxy texture makes it gluey and dense when mashed, so select another variety like a Russet or Yukon gold for this purpose.

In the mid-1800s, a disease caused by a fungus infested potato crops throughout Europe, causing a devastating famine in Ireland. This time period is called the Great Famine or Gorta Mor, meaning "the great hunger." Mass emigration coupled with widespread deaths from starvation caused the Irish population to drop by 20% to 25%. Many Irish families immigrated to America to escape the hardships in Ireland and to start a new life. By 1850, the Irish made up a quarter of the population in Boston, New York City, Philadelphia and Baltimore.

After years of suffering in Ireland, in 1883, the French botanist Alexandre Millardet discovered an effective fungicide to combat the potato blight. Today, potatoes are the world's fourth largest food crop, following rice, wheat and maize. BMarko will create a modular manufacturing facility from scratch in a large warehouse in Greenville, located at 3309 Laurens Road, utilizing prefabricated jigs made in its Dacula, Georgia headquarters and then shipped to Greenville to install. With the jigs installed, BMarko will create a pipeline of modules extremely close to the final apartment community site, greatly reducing transportation costs while ensuring the speed and quality that come with traditional modular construc-

Among the submodules to be assembled and finished for installation at the Greenville site and later installed at the final apartment location will be kitchens, hallways and powder rooms, bathrooms, closets, and walls. The concurrent manufacturing process of all parts allows for the fastest production lead times in the modular industry, reducing cost and ensuring consistent quality. Mudding, painting, and insulation are completed at the manufacturing facility, shipped to the project site and prepared for final production and customer

delivery.

Once completed at the Greenville facility, the 325 modules for the 190 apartment homes, which will be in 1-, 2-, 3-, and 4-bedroom options and average approximately 1,000 square feet each, will be shipped to their final destination, installed onsite and finished for residential occupancy. The site for the initial 190-apartment site is located at 561 Wofford Street Spartanburg.

BMarko, which has partnered with such organizations as Marriott, Coca Cola, Georgia Tech, the City of Atlanta, and Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency among others, has developed unique expertise in wood modular construc-

tion (as in the Greenville facility), for apartments, senior housing, and student housing. The company has also developed deep experience in shipping container modification facilities and steel modular construction facilities serving industrial, healthcare, food service and other industry verticals. BMarko's projects have completed installed in more than 20 states across the country, with heavy focus in the Southeastern

"BMarko believes that wood modular building is ideal for multi-family structures up to five levels high, including townhouses, condominiums, duplexes and even housing for remote and traveling workers," said Tommy Rakes, President of BMarko Structures Wood Modular Division. "In communities like Upstate South Carolina where a shortage of affordable housing is a significant issue, towns and cities are turning to modular construction to resolve the problem. The modular process saves time and money, ensures high quality standards, and prevents congested areas from becoming disruptive construction zones for months

100 years young and generations to come: AAA's School Safety Patrol program celebrates centennial

Charlotte, N.C. - AAA is proud to celebrate its School Safety Patrol program's centennial anniversary. For 100 years, Patrollers around the world have provided school-aged children an extra sense of safety and security when going to and from school. The program and its more than 440 Lifesaving Award recipients have contributed to the steady decline of U.S. student pedestrian (ages 5-14) deaths – a 24% decrease since 2010.

"AAA's School Safety Patrol program is the world's largest schoolbased safety program. We could not be prouder of the thousands of young men and women annually who dedicate their time before and after school each day to ensure the safety of their classmates," said AAA President and CEO, and former patroller, Marshall Doney. "This community program teaches safety and leadership skills to ensure our youngest generations are making smart

decisions. I can attest first hand. The important pedestrian and traffic safety measures I learned as a patroller had a profound and lasting impact on my career."

Created to make schoolchildren safer while walking to school, the program has matured with the times while remaining steadfast to its mission to provide a safer environment and leadership opportunities for millions of schoolchildren. The training that patrollers receive instills safety sense beyond street crossings, including bus and car drop-offs, monitoring hallway congestion, and teaching patrollers invaluable leadership skills. The famous patroller belt has seen change, too, going from white to neon orange to today's fluorescent green called 'Lectric Lime.

"Patrollers direct children, not traffic. Their focus is on helping students be safe where traffic

is concerned," said AAA Traffic Safety Advocacy and Community Impact Manager Rhonda Shah. "Their actions save lives. Patrollers serve as role models in schools across the country."

Notable patrollers include Jimmy Carter and Bill Clinton, astronauts, governors, members of Congress, Supreme Court justices, Olympic medalists, and authors, like Diary of a Wimpy Kid Jeff Kinney. Many now serve as educators, executives, and community leaders. Some, like Karen Guilbeault, enter law enforcement. Guilbeault rose to become the first female

captain in the Cranston, R.I., police department and their first to graduate from FBI's National Academy in Virginia.

"Rain or shine, safety patrollers get to school early and stay late, devoting their time to safety," said Tiffany Wright, spokesperson for AAA -The Auto Club Group in the Carolinas. "We have over 12,000 patrollers who serve the Carolinas and we are proud of these young leaders."

The 2020–21 school year, different as it may be, boasts 679,000 patrollers in 35,000 schools in the United States. The legacy doesn't stop here, howev-

VA Extends Loan Forbearance Period

Some of you are going to breathe a sigh of relief at this news: The Depart nent of Veterans Affairs moratorium n evictions and foreclosures was du to end March 31, but it's been extend ed to June 30.

The extension is designed to keep ou in your home while you sort ou he damaging financial effects of the COVID pandemic.

If you need forbearance (permissio to miss payments or send a reduce amount), your lender is expected to grant you that for up to six months During this time there are to be no late fees or penalties, but interest will accrue. The deadline to ask for forpearance is June 30, 2021.

If you can't make up your missed payments all at once when you have income again, call the mortgage com-pany. If you're not comfortable doing that, call the VA loan people directly at 877-827-3702

Your missed payments can't just be pushed to the end of the loan period, but it is possible the loan could be modified. The VA allows loans to be xtended under certain situations. Your credit score won't take a nega


tive hit during forbearance (not making payments), but only if you were current at the time you requested it If you were already late on payment when you asked for help, then yes they'll continue to report you as delin uent during the whole period. That why it's important to stay ahead of the problem by asking for help before things spin out of control.

You have three ways to keep you home: forbearance, a repayment plan or a loan modification.
