### GSP Airport resumes parking shuttle service

As another sign that passenger activity is recovering, GSP has re-established parking shuttle service from its Economy Parking Lot P2. The service was discontinued in April 2020 due to the significant reduction in passenger activity resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic.

An airport shuttle bus runs continuously from 4:15 a.m. until one hour past the last arriving flight each day. Travelers can catch the shuttle at marked shelters located in Economy Lot P2 and at a dedicated pick-up spot on the terminal curb near baggage claim.

As an added convenience, travelers can now pre-book parking at GSP. This allows travelers to guarantee a space in their preferred garage or parking lot. They can also enter or exit by showing a code from their cell phone or printed parking reservation receipt.



USC Upstate announced plans to create an esports club activity during the Spring 2022 semester, and a varsity esports program that will debut during the Fall 2022 semester.

## USC Upstate launches esports program

The University of South Carolina Upstate recently announced the launch of its esports program that will attract future Spartans and enrich the student experience by creating a thriving gaming community on campus. USC Upstate intends to create a varsity program that will debut during the Fall 2022 semester, but esports will be introduced as a club activity in Spring 2022.

The program will be housed in a 1,600-square-foot gaming center within the university's Health Education Complex. The center will feature 45 gaming stations, each equipped with a state-of-the-art computer by Alienware featuring an 11th generation Intel Core i9 processor 2.5 gigahertz with a 1 terabyte hard drive and 32 gigabytes of RAM memory, and an Nvidia GeForce RTX 3090 graphics card.

"Few co-curricular options in American higher education are expanding like esports," said Dr. Brit Katz, interim vice chancellor for student affairs at

USC Upstate. "As greater numbers of universities work to create meaningful experiences for students through egaming, USC Upstate also aspires to compete with our consoles, keyboards and headsets."

"Research confirms that esports players will enroll in an institution that is hundreds of miles away from home if elements like a terrific gaming station, excited peers, meaningful competition and affiliation exist," Katz added.

USC Upstate leaders and officials from other Big South member institutions are actively pursuing the development of competitions that could result in an informal conference championship.

The varsity program will initially compete in three games: "League of Legends," "Valorant" and "Rocket League." A range of other games will be available to club players and the university plans to continue to grow those options over time.

Nick Ames, assistant

director of Intramural Sports, Club Sports and Summer Camps at USC Upstate, said student polling showed overwhelming support for the inception of an esports program. Ames will direct the program, which will be operated under Campus Recreation.

"After listening to requests from our current and prospective students, we are excited to bring esports to Upstate," said Donette Stewart, vice chancellor of enrollment services and director of admissions at USC Upstate. "Our new gaming center will feature the best Alienware computers on the market so we are looking for competitive students to join us. We will offer students a chance to play the games they enjoy while they earn a top notch degree that will prepare them for rewarding careers."

## Mary Black Foundation awards \$15,898 to SCC's Early Childhood Education program

Recently, Spartanburg Community College announced that the college's Early Childhood Education program was the recipient of a \$15,898 grant from the Mary Black Foundation to help the program be better equipped to train students to enter the workforce as daycare teachers, teacher's assistants, and directors of childcare programs.

"Investments such as this from the community we serve is a testament to the impact Spartanburg Community College has on the area," said Dr. Michael Mikota, president of SCC. "I want to thank the Mary Black Foundation for investing in the continued success of our students and I can't wait to see the ways in which this will benefit those participating in our Early Childhood Education program and the children they will one day influence."

Funding for this project supports the Early Care

and Education Certificate and Associate Degree programs by establishing a simulation lab, investing in traveling kits that students can take to practicums at local daycares, and investing in faculty professional development.

With the help of this funding, SCC will establish an Early Care Education Simulation Lab at SCC's Downtown Campus to provide students with the opportunity to practice what they are learning in the classroom in a simulated early childhood environment. The Simulation Lab will include educational toys and books, furniture utilized in early childhood classrooms, and equipment needed to create personalized learning activities for preschool-age children.

Finally, funding will allow SCC's faculty members to attend training to become certified Pediatric CPR/First Aid trainers so that they can train students

in life-saving techniques.

These strategic enhancements to the program will help to close the gap on educational disparities by ensuring that graduates are trained in best practices for early childhood education and enter Spartanburg's early childhood workforce equipped to provide high quality education to young children throughout the Upstate.

"The Early Care and Education Department at SCC is incredibly grateful to the Mary Black Foundation for their generosity in giving," said Connie Spink, department chair for SCC's Early Care and Education Programs. "The support provided by the Mary Black Foundation will improve the education and experiences of students who will teach our area's youngest learners, therefore ultimately providing our community with higher quality early childhood educators."

## Pottery vase

Artists often create works in many different mediums - ceramics, painting, sculpture, jewelry and even metalwork. After World War I, many artists traveled to different countries and schools to learn new "looks" and techniques. England, France, Germany and Scandinavia were leading art centers.

Vally Wieselhier (1895-1945) was famous in Germany by the 1920s but almost unknown in the United States. She was born in Austria and studied under Michael Powolny from 1914 to 1920. She was a leading ceramic artist and designer making figurines, female heads, vases and more.

In 1929, she moved to the U.S. and worked in New York making large ceramic statues and also designed dinnerware for the Sebring factory in Ohio; ironstone dinnerware designs for Mayer Pottery in Trenton, New Jersey; and worked at Cowan Pottery in Ohio, where she introduced the Wiener Werkstatte style. She also designed glassware, jewelry, textiles, papier-mache mannequins, furniture and even metal elevator doors. With all her success and fame, few pieces are seen in U.S. auctions. Neal Auction Company sold an 8-inch-high Wiener Werkstatte vase made in 1925 signed with both "WW" (Wiener Werkstatte) and "VW" (Vally Wieselhier) for \$1,037.

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**Q:** My aunt gave me a perfume lamp 50 years ago. It's a figural dog sitting up and begging. It has perforations on the head, a place for the perfume in the back of the head and large glass eyes where the light can show through. Can you tell me something about perfume lamps?

**A:** Maurice Berger, a French pharmacist, invented the perfume lamp in 1897 when he added perfume to lamp oil or other liquid fuel. Electric perfume lamps that used a lightbulb to heat the perfume were made by the early 1900s. The fragrance is emitted through small holes in the lamp.

Perfume lamps have been made in many different figural shapes and were made by manufacturers in several different countries. The lamp with a lightbulb, but without the perfume inside, is often used as a nightlight. Today a battery-operated or plug-in product, diffuser or spray can be used to provide a pleasant scent to a room.
