Spartanburg County tourism leader completes decade of service, announces resignation

After ten years spearheading Spartanburg's tourism development initiatives, Spartanburg Convention & Visitors Bureau Executive Vice President Chris Jennings will step down November 15 to move closer to family.

Jennings joined the Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce team in November 2009, where he implemented Spartanburg's first tourism action plan focused on culture, history, arts and recreation. Today, the Spartanburg CVB serves as the destination marketing organization for Spartanburg City and County, with a strong focus on sports tourism and group travel. A nationwide search for Jennings' successor will begin in November.

"Spartanburg's tourism industry has flourished under Jennings' leadership," said Allen Smith, President & CEO of the Spartanburg Chamber. "Today, Spartanburg is seeing some of the fastest hotel stock growth in South Carolina, attracting national sports conferences such as the USA Softball Junior Olympic tournament, and recently launched a Destination Marketing Fund that creates new revenue to promote Spartanburg."

Data showed that at the end of the 2018-2019 fiscal year, hotel room supply and demand grew, while Spartanburg City and County hospitality tax receipts reached record levels, the fifth-consecutive year of growth. Over those five years, Spartanburg's tourism industry has grown by about 9.4 percent per year, according to Clemson University data. In 2018 alone, tourists spent \$278 million across Spartanburg County.

"Travelers are coming to Spartanburg more often, and when they do, they're staying longer and spending more. Spartanburg's portfolio of restaurants and hotels keeps growing in both quality and quantity, and that allows us to show off our community to those visitors," said Andy Cajka, chair of the CVB Advisory Board. "Tourism as an industry has never been stronger across Spartanburg County than it is now, and much of the credit for that goes to Chris and his team."

Jennings plans to continue his fruitful career in tourism in the Northeast where much of his family resides, including his wife and children.

City Council approves second reading of property transfer to construct Norris Ridge Apartments replacement

On Monday, October 28th, Spartanburg City Council gave final approval to the first phase of a plan that will eventually lead to the replacement and demolition of Norris Ridge Apartments, a privately owned standard section 8 apartment complex in the Highland neighborhood that has long been a site targeted for redevelopment by the City and residents of Highland.

Under the approved agreement, the City will transfer 10 properties—totaling around 25 acres—along Wofford St. in the Mid-town Heights area to Mississippi-based firm EquityPlus, LLC for construction of a mixed-income development that will serve as a replacement for the 190 units that will be lost with the eventual demolition of Norris Ridge Apartments. EquityPlus, LLC has an agreement in place with the current owner of Norris Ridge to purchase the property and has agreed to redevelop the site in accordance with the Highland Transformation Plan, currently underway in the neighborhood.

The developer plans to construct the Mid-town Heights project in three phases, with the first creating the 190 affordable units needed to house families that will be displaced by the demolition of Norris Ridge Apartments, which will take place after the new units are completed. Construction on the Mid-town Heights development is expected to begin next year.

Eating for better mental health

There is a growing body of research showing that the dietary choices we make each day affect not only our physical bodies (yes, that beer belly didn't just happen by itself) but can also play an important role in our mental health.

Most parents have probably observed what foods high in sugar sometimes do to their children. And while studies have failed to find a definitive link between sugar and hyperactivity, most moms will tell you that their son or daughter seems more excited and active after eating a sugary snack.

The reason for that higher activity level may not be as much physiological as psychological. Eating foods we like makes us feel better and most of us are genetically programmed to like sweet-tasting foods. This goes back to our ancient ancestors who learned that when veggies and fruits were sweet tasting they were ripe and safe to eat. Feeding kids treats that are high in sugar makes them feel good and happy, and usually also often more active.

Importantly, recent studies have found links between food choices and mental health for both children and adults. One large-scale study found that following a diet high in processed and sugary foods appeared to increase the risk for depression. When participants followed a Mediterranean-style diet high in fruits, vegetables, and high fiber, low fat foods, there was a 25% to 35% reduction in the risk of depression.

Nutritionists advise paying attention to how various foods affect you specifically. If certain traditional meals leave you bloated and unhappy, you've probably made some poor dietary choices. Experts suggest making small dietary changes toward an overall diet that is now widely recognized as being healthier.

If you aren't already eating at least five servings of fruits and vegetables each day, try adding one or two servings of these healthy foods to your daily diet. It can be especially effective and even easy if you start by replacing one or two high fat or heavily processed foods. Fruits, vegetables, whole grains, nuts and legumes are just some of the foods that can leave you feeling and being physically healthier, while also contributing to good mental health.

There's no magic diet that can insure good mental health, but a healthy diet is a good start to improving physical health while also contributing to better mental and emotional health.

Could you pay your mortgage on one income? Here's what to know

(StatePoint) For many people, getting married and buying a house is still part of the American Dream. That's reflected in the numbers. The homeownership rate among married couples in the U.S. is 80 percent, according to recent data reported by Statista. But what if something were to happen to you or your spouse? Would the person left behind still be able to afford the mortgage?

In today's world of dual-income families, the answer could easily be "no," which would make a sad situation even worse. Not only could a family lose their home, but a disruptive move could also mean that children would have to change schools and leave friends behind.

One way to protect against this scenario is with a life insurance policy, which can be used to pay off a mortgage so that the surviving spouse and family members can enjoy the home they love and have stability at a critical time in their lives.



There are generally two types of life insurance: permanent life insurance and term life insurance. Both provide financial resources to help take care of loved ones, but there are some important differences to consider.

USDA invests \$9.75 million in rural broadband for South Carolina families

Orangeburg – On October 22nd, U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue announced the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has invested \$9,750,000 in high-speed broadband infrastructure that will create or improve rural e-Connectivity for 3,911 rural households in South Carolina. This is one of many funding announcements in the first round of USDA's ReConnect Pilot Program investments.

"Our core mission at USDA is to increase rural prosperity through boosting economic opportunity in rural America," Secretary Perdue said. "We know that rural communities need robust, modern infrastructure to thrive, and that includes having access to broadband e-Connectivity. Under the leadership of President Trump, USDA is proud to partner with rural communities to deploy this critical infrastructure, because we know when rural America thrives, all of America thrives."

South Carolina Gov. Henry McMaster added, "We are grateful for the leadership President Trump and Secretary Perdue have shown in focusing on increasing broadband connectivity in rural areas. From enhanced health care access to modernizing our educational and workforce resources, these funds will be instrumental in ensuring that Orangeburg County, and all of South Carolina, will remain competitive in the global economy."

South Carolina Commissioner of Agriculture Hugh Weathers said, "High-speed internet in rural areas helps farmers connect to new markets and promote their businesses – and what's good for farmers is good for their communities. This initiative will boost Orangeburg County and the rest of the state."

Orangeburg, County, S.C., will use ReConnect Program grant funding to deploy a fiber to the home (FTTH) broadband network capable of simultaneous transmission rates of 100 megabits per second (Mbps) or greater. The funded service areas

include 3,911 households, 21 farms, 17 rural businesses, 13 educational facilities, nine critical community facilities and a health care center. The project will facilitate more access to services and information for local residents, and it will improve the overall quality of life for people in the community.

In March 2018, Congress provided \$600 million to USDA to expand broadband infrastructure and services in rural America. On Dec. 13, 2018, Secretary Perdue announced the rules of the program, called "ReConnect," including how the loans and grants will be awarded to help build broadband infrastructure in rural America. USDA received 146 applications between May 31, 2019, and July 12, 2019, requesting \$1.4 billion in funding across all three ReConnect Program funding products: 100 percent loan, 100 percent grant, and loan-grant combinations. USDA is reviewing applications and announcing approved projects on a rolling basis. Additional investments in all three categories will be made in the coming weeks.

These grants, loans and combination funds enable the federal government to partner with the private sector and rural communities to build modern broadband infrastructure in areas with insufficient internet service. Insufficient service is defined as connection speeds of less than 10 Mbps download and 1 Mbps upload.

In April 2017, President Donald J. Trump established the Interagency Task Force on Agriculture and Rural Prosperity to identify legislative, regulatory, and policy changes that could promote agriculture and prosperity in rural communities. In January 2018, Secretary Perdue presented the Task Force's findings to President Trump. These findings included 31 recommendations to align the federal government with state, local and tribal governments to take advantage of opportunities that exist in rural America. Increasing investments in rural infrastructure is a key recom-

Parents as guilty as kids when it comes to too much screen time

(StatePoint) Parents spend nearly the same amount of time with devices as they do with their kids, according to new research from The Genius of Play, a nonprofit initiative dedicated to raising awareness of play's vital role in child development.

The results of the OnePoll survey of 2,000 parents of school-aged children ages 5-18 suggest that families should be finding more screen-free ways to spend time together. Half of the survey's respondents have been asked by their child to put their phone away, and 79 percent believe that their relationship with their children would benefit if everyone spent less time on devices.

"Screens and tech can make up some of your playtime, but parents should be mindful of creating balance," says Ken Seiter, EVP, marketing communications at The Toy Association, the organization that spearheads The Genius of Play. "A wide variety of toys and games will help create rich childhood memories, lead to optimal physical, cognitive and social-emotional development, and nurture critical skills like creativity and out-of-the-box thinking."

Parents are aware that excessive screen time is a problem. Seventy-four percent worry that their child spends too much time staring at a screen and the majority limit their kids' screen time to about two hours per day. However, when it comes to their own use of devices, setting a limit is easier said than done. Survey results revealed:

- Sixty-two percent of parents admitted to spending too much time on their cell phone while with their kids.
- Sixty-nine percent feel "addicted" to their phone.
- Parents spend almost as much one-on-one time with devices as with their kids. They are spending an average of two hours and 17 minutes of personal time on their phone per day, compared to two hours and 41 minutes of quality, screen-free time with their children.

The survey also found that while parents worry about the amount of screen time kids are getting, technology is now an integral parenting tool.

The majority (83 percent) agree that screens and technology are necessary when raising a child in this day and age.

• Parents use screen time



to keep their child occupied (58 percent), as a reward (53 percent) and to

help their child calm down when they're upset (52 percent). In addition, taking

screen time away is used as a consequence (63 percent).

"Parents often complain that it's hard to get kids to put down devices, but they can set a positive example by swapping some of their own screen time for other types of play," says Seiter.


Experts at The Genius of Play recommend setting aside dedicated periods of the day for arts and crafts, word games, role play, board games, sports, puzzles, charades and other screen-free activities to maximize quality time for families, which will benefit both kids and adults.
