Converse student awarded

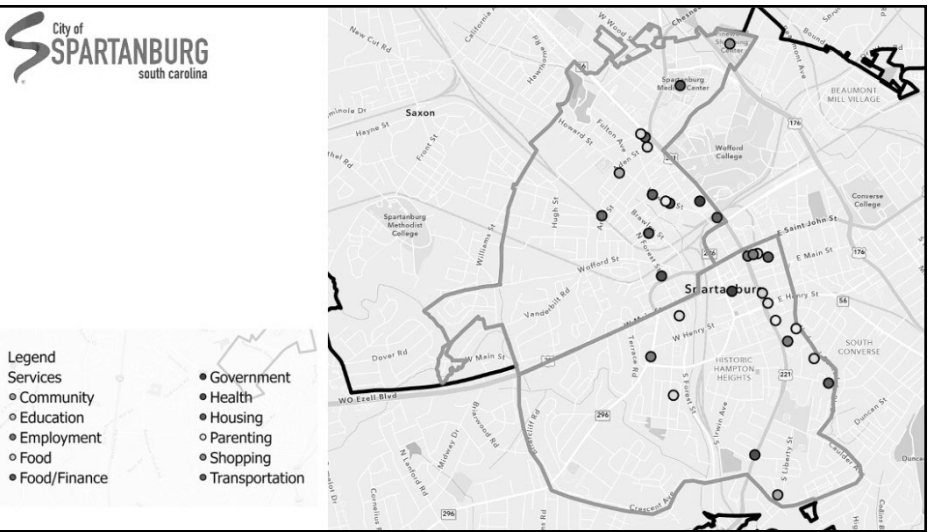
Jo Anne J. Trow Undergraduate Scholarship

City Council approves vehicle purchases for microtransit pilot program

At their meeting on Monday, October 29, Spartanburg City Council unanimously approved the purchase of new vehicles for a microtransit pilot program launching for the city's northside and southside areas in 2025. In total, the three ADA compliant Ford Transit Chassis Mobilitytrans Conversion Vans to be used in the program will cost \$344,803 and will be paid for using state mass transit funds.

Unlike a traditional fixed-route bus system, which operates on a fixed schedule and along a predetermined route, microtransit works similarly to popular rideshare options like Uber and Lyft. Riders use an app to request a ride to their desired location,

and a vehicle is then sent to their current location for pickup. Riders are then dropped off at their locations directly, without following a predetermined fixed route or the need to change buses at a transfer station.

In his presentation to Council, Assistant City Manager Kevin Limehouse pointed out the potential efficiency benefit for users of the new pilot program over the City's existing fixed-route bus system, noting that a trip from CC Woodson Community Center to the Food Lion in Pinewood Shopping Center currently takes around 45 minutes, with numerous stops and a mile walk to reach the destination. Utilizing microtransit, a rider could make the same trip in 10-20 minutes, and the rider would be picked up and dropped off

at their specific departure and arrival destinations with no need to walk to a predetermined public transit stop.

The microtransit pilot program will be limited in scope, available for pickup and drop-off destinations in the city's northside and southside areas only, providing a new option for some of the areas in Spartanburg that most rely on public transit. Rides will cost \$2 per rider, payable by credit or debit card only, and will be available 6 a.m. – 6 p.m., seven days per week. The pilot is expected to last one year, with an evaluation period at six months, and will cost an estimated \$334,442. Funding for the program will come from federal transit funds the City received during the COVID-19 pandemic.

John L. Humphries to retire as president and general manager of WYFF-TV

John L. Humphries, a veteran of 18 years at Hearst Television and more than four decades in broadcast TV, will retire later this year from his current post of president and general manager of WYFF-TV, Hearst's NBC affiliate in the Greenville-Spartanburg-Anderson, South Carolina and Asheville, North Carolina, television market. His successor will be announced at a later date.

Prior to taking the reins at WYFF 4 in 2016, Humphries served for four years as president and general manager of WGAL-TV, Hearst Television's NBC affiliate serving the Lancaster-Harrisburg-Lebanon-York, Pennsylvania, television market. His 2016 appointment as president and general manager marked a return to WYFF 4 for Humphries, where he served for six years as general sales manager prior to moving to WGAL.

WYFF 4 flourished under Humphries' direction. In 2018, Broadcasting & Cable named him General Manager of the Year for mid-size television markets as the station earned a Southeast Regional Emmy for Outstanding Newscast and, in 2022, it received a prestigious national Edward R. Murrow Award. Numerous state and regional accolades have included three consecutive Associated Press of South Carolina's Outstanding News Operation in 2017, 2018, and 2019 and the South Carolina Association of Broadcasters Station of the Year recognition in 2021.

Humphries brought Hearst Television's award-winning *Chronicle* newsmagazine format to WGAL; in 2015, it garnered the station a Mid-Atlantic Emmy for its *Chronicle* series "Walking the Pipeline."

Before joining Hearst Television in 2006 at WYFF 4, Humphries was director of sales for WBTV in Charlotte, NC and held the same position at WSPA-TV/WASV-TV in the Greenville-Spartanburg market. He began his career at Charlotte's WSOC-TV, initially as a production specialist and later as a sports reporter and anchor, before moving to sales positions there. He holds a bachelor's degree in Speech from Appalachian State University, in Boone, NC, for which he has served on the Alumni Council, and is a graduate of Hearst's executive development program, the Hearst Management Institute.

Triumph announces new 10,000 seat multi-use stadium at BridgeWay Station

Mauldin - The Greenville Triumph Soccer Club and Greenville Liberty Soccer Club along with the City of Mauldin proudly announced plans on October 30 for a 10,000-seat multi-use sports and entertainment stadium as part of a development agreement with Hughes Investments at BridgeWay Station.

As the permanent home for Greenville Triumph and Liberty, the stadium will serve as a hub for professional and youth sports while also hosting field sports such as lacrosse, rugby and football and a venue for concerts, festivals, and various community events. Estimated to cost between \$80 million and \$100 million, the stadium is expected to break ground in early 2025. With a planned opening in 2026, the new multi-use sports and entertainment stadium will be poised to celebrate the excitement of the FIFA World Cup coming to North America that summer when soccer fans across the region gear up for one of the world's most anticipated sporting events.

This project marks a significant step forward in positioning Mauldin and the greater Greenville area as a premier destination for sports tourism and community gatherings in South

Carolina.

Current project partners include Greenville Pro Soccer, the ownership group of the Triumph and Liberty; the state of South Carolina; and the City of Mauldin.

"This stadium represents the next chapter for our clubs," said Joe Erwin, Chairman of Greenville Triumph SC and Greenville Liberty SC. "We've always envisioned a home that would not only serve as a place for soccer matches but as a gathering point for the entire community to enjoy an array of field sports, concerts and community events."

Based in Greenville, South Carolina, the Green-

ville Triumph SC fields a men's professional soccer club completing its sixth season in USL League One. The Greenville Liberty, a women's professional team, played its inaugural season in the USL W League in 2022 and recently completed its third season.

To advance its mission to support youth soccer, the Greenville Triumph SC partnered with Special Olympics South Carolina to and launched a Unified Soccer Team this year featuring a blend of players with intellectual disabilities and peer partners. In addition, the Greenville Triumph Soccer Club brings together youth soc-

cer players from clubs and organizations across the region to form U20 boys and girls all-star teams representing Upstate South Carolina, Triumph and Liberty in the USL Academy League.

"The support of our fans has been incredible throughout this journey, and we are thrilled to give them a venue of which they can be proud," Erwin said.

The announcement was made at an event on the plaza of BridgeWay Station where Mauldin Mayor Terry Merritt called it a historic day for the city of Mauldin.

"Our city has experi-

enced tremendous growth over the last several years, and this stadium is another example of how we're investing in the future," Merritt said. "It's more than just a stadium—it's a community asset that will bring people together for a variety of events, from sports to concerts and beyond. We are excited to see this project come to life and can't wait to share it with the community."

The stadium also will provide significant economic and social benefits to the region. Located at the center of BridgeWay Station, a vibrant mixed-use development, the stadium is situated on Interstate 385 at the southern gateway into Green-

ville and sits at the epicenter of the soccer teams' Upstate fan base.

"The vision for this stadium extends well beyond Mauldin," said state Rep. Bruce Bannister, Chairman of the SC House Ways and Means Committee. "This project will be a catalyst for economic growth and tourism not only in the Upstate but throughout South Carolina. It represents a successful public-private partnership that will enhance the quality of life for our residents, create jobs, and drive investment in our state."

Phil Hughes, President of Hughes Investments, said the stadium will be a key feature of BridgeWay Station, a development that offers residential, commercial, and entertainment options.

"This stadium aligns perfectly with our goal of creating a vibrant and engaging environment that offers something for everyone," Hughes said. "The stadium will contribute significantly to the vibrancy of our community."

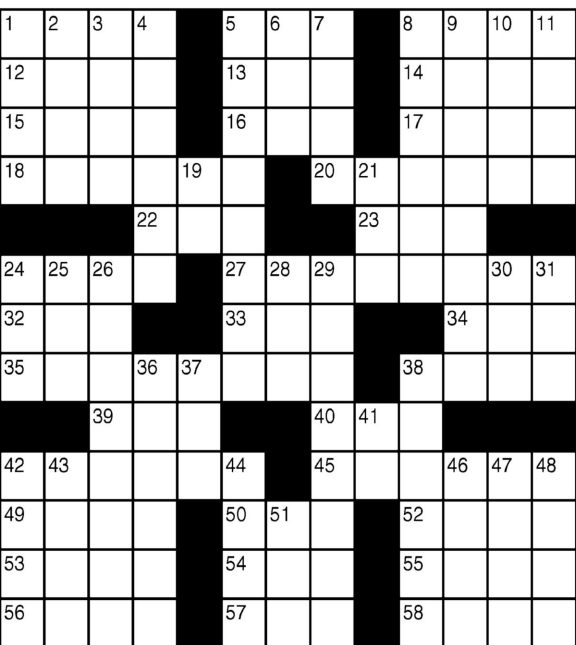
