A taste of tradition

Growing up in a Wofford family served as the foundation. A trip to the Kentucky Bourbon Trail provided the inspiration. A long car ride settled the idea in place.

Now 1854 Reserve bourbon whiskey (Old Main edition) is bottled and ready, and Garrett Steck Jr. '24 says he has many in the Wofford community to thank.

"As a Wofford student, I had so much support. So many people were willing to listen to and aid another Terrier. I feel so fortunate," says the biology major from Greenville, S.C. Steck is now studying business management at the Fuqua School of Business at Duke University. He plans to combine that with his biology degree to pursue a career in biotech. "I reached out to Calhoun Kennedy '89 to share the idea, and he immediately connected me with Dixon

Dedman '03."

Dedman, a whiskey blender, taster, speaker and consultant, grew up on the Kentucky Bourbon Trail and ran his family's James Beard award-winning Beaumont Inn. He resurrected his family's Kentucky Owl bourbon after it was destroyed during prohibition and most recently established the 2XO bourbon brand. Dedman was intrigued by the project and agreed to collaborate with Steck to create a bourbon to celebrate Wofford.

"Dixon's experience was invaluable. He's been there. He knows everything about the bourbon business," says Steck, who met Dedman in early October to watch the bottling of the first batch of 1854 Reserve (Old Main edition). "As I watched the bourbon move from the barrel to the bottle, I realized that the planning and hard work were worth it."

According to Steck, Wofford connections have

crisscrossed every step of the process. Wofford graduates connected Steck to others and mentored him through the business side of the process. A Wofford trustee is among the investors. Steck says his participation in Wofford's Launch program helped build a framework for the venture. Garrett Steck '92, Steck's father and an attorney, handled legal matters. The graphic designer, label designer, distributor and retail stores all have ties to Wofford as well.

Steck will offer an early taste of 1854 Reserve on campus during Homecoming.

When the bottles hit select South Carolina stores in late fall, a portion of the proceeds will benefit Wofford College. The label features an image of Main Building from the late 1800s as well as an old tax stamp from the archives. Consistent with the hand-bottling, Steck hand-numbered each of the 800 bottles in the first batch.

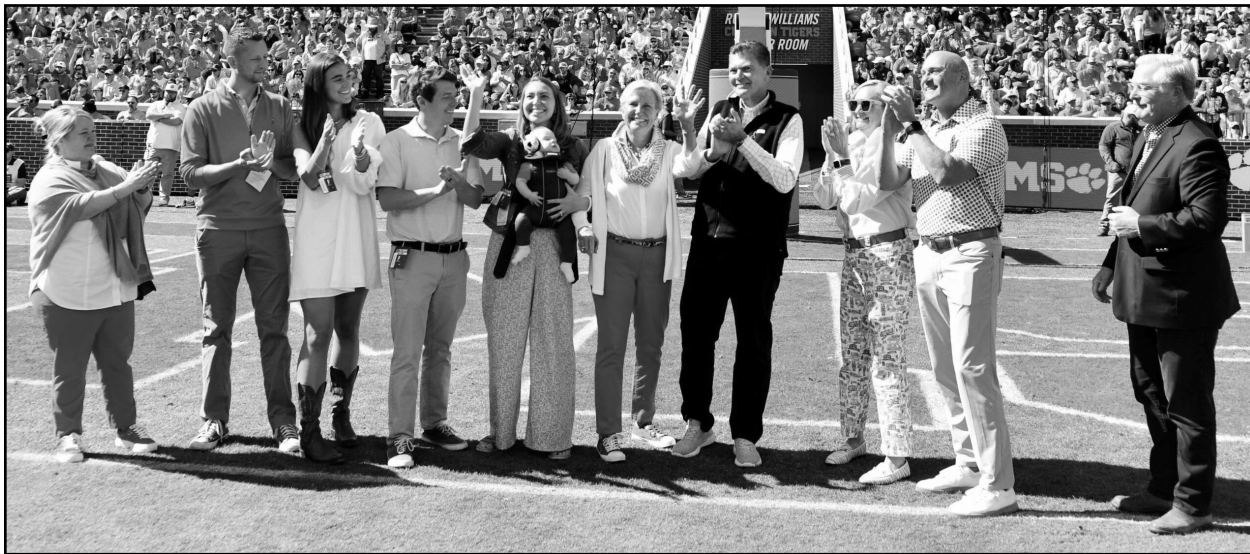
Snow family donates \$25 million transformational gift to support the study of capitalism

With a transformational gift of \$25 million to Clemson University, Dave and Lynette Snow have positioned the newly named Snow Institute for the Study of Capitalism to become the model program in America focused on the moral principles of capitalism. Their lead gift enables the Institute to chart a 10-year vision for expansion of current programming and the creation of new projects.

Since 2005, the Clemson Institute for the Study of Capitalism and its flagship Lyceum Scholars Program, established in 2014, have been working to explore the moral foundations of a free society and the vital role played by capitalism in advancing a free, just and virtuous society. Clemson is the only public university in the country that supports a program directly addressing and promoting the nation's founding principles through both education and research.

"Through their transformational gift, Dave and Lynette Snow are continuing to fulfill the mission and vision of our founder, Thomas Green Clemson, who envisioned our University as a path to economic prosperity," said

President Jim Clements. "The Snow Institute for the Study of Capitalism is a commitment to our Tigers and will significantly impact lives across the state of South Carolina and the nation. We are a better University because of the dedication and support from the Snow family."

The Snows' support will allow the Institute, housed within the Wilbur O. and Ann Powers College of Business, to double the Lyceum Scholars Program from 40 to 80 scholars. The Lyceum Program has become one of the most sought-after and competitive academic programs in the country. Their gift will also double the scholarship for current and future scholars, further providing the opportunity to recruit top students. The Snow family is the first and lead gift in an effort to raise \$100 million toward the study of capitalism.

In addition to accelerating the impact of the Lyceum Scholars Program, the gift will support doubling the Lyceum Fellows program and launch two new critical programs:

- *The American Founding Project* — America's first and only academic program dedicated to the

understanding of the history, principles and institutions of the American founding.

- *The Capitalism Unleashed Project* — A program dedicated to the moral underpinnings of capitalism within the world.

Dave and Lynette Snow are former Clemson parents who were named honorary alumni in 2022. They first visited Clemson with their daughter Ashley '15 as she toured the University. Since Ashley's first day on campus, Dave and Lynette have been "All In" for Clemson. In 2014, Dave and Lynette gave a \$2.4 million gift to support the Snow Family Outdoor Fitness and Wellness Complex. In 2016, the Snows began a challenge to match up to \$1 million in funds raised to complete the complex. This match led to an additional \$2 million in gifts.

Dave and Lynette have committed their time to Clemson over the years. The Snows chaired the Vice President of Student Affairs Executive Council, and they currently serve on the Committee on Philanthropy. Dave also serves on the Clemson Capitalism Institute Board and President Clements' Advisory

Board.

The Snow Institute for the Study of Capitalism is dedicated to exploring the

moral foundations of capitalism. In pursuit of this mission, the Institute collaborates with students, the

academic community and the general public to raise awareness of capitalism's core principles and institutions.

The Lyceum Program, founded in 2014, serves as the flagship initiative and remains the only University program focused on the study of liberty, capitalism, the American founding and moral character.

Exploring Capitalism, a project of the Institute, aims to help visitors delve into the moral, political and legal foundations of capitalism, with a particular emphasis on the socio-political foundations of a free society.

Diabetes and your feet, what you need to know

(StatePoint) Foot ulcers develop in about 15% of the 25 million Americans living with diabetes and are a top cause of hospitalization. These ulcers can lead to serious complications, such as infection and amputation. According to foot and ankle surgeons, there are steps you can take to prevent complications and keep your feet healthy, as well as breakthrough treatments that are saving limbs, restoring mobility and improving lives.

“The majority of lower-extremity amputations are preceded by a reoccurring foot sore or an ulcer that won’t heal,” says John S. Steinberg, DPM, FACFAS, a board-certified foot and ankle surgeon and a Fellow Member and Past President of the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons (ACFAS). “Patients do best when they take charge of their foot health with the help of a foot and ankle surgeon.”

The surgeon members of ACFAS are sharing some important insights into preventing foot ulcers associated with diabetes and treating them if they do occur.

Make these precautions part of your foot care routine:

- Inspect feet daily using a flashlight and mirror to see the bottoms of your feet.
- Moisturize dry, cracking feet to prevent sores. Use

powder to control moisture that can result in blisters.

- To prevent injury, wear protective, well-fitting shoes and socks at all times, even in the house. Change socks daily and more often if your feet get wet or sweaty. Avoid socks with holes or seams. Sometimes diabetic shoes are prescribed to avoid pressure and rubbing on the feet.

- Get regular foot exams from a foot and ankle surgeon, which can reduce amputation risk by 45-85%. The surgeon can also screen feet for loss of protective sensation.

- Manage your diabetes. Out-of-control blood sugar levels can lead to nerve cell damage, making it harder to detect foot problems.

Look for telltale signs that an ulcer may be developing:

- Swelling. The foot or ankle may look puffy or engorged and larger than the other.
- Temperature. Cold feet might mean a circulatory issue, whereas hot feet might mean infection.
- Color changes. Redness and even other colors might appear before an ulcer forms.
- Calluses. If a callus changes colors or develops dark, “dried blood” colored spots, it may be time to have a foot and ankle surgeon offer a proper diagnosis.

Ask your foot and ankle

surgeon about innovative treatments:

If you do experience a non-healing ulcer, talk to your foot and ankle surgeon right away about innovative technologies that stimulate healing.

Groundbreaking approaches include stem cell therapy, the use of bio-engineered skin substitutes to accelerate growth of

healthy skin, and negative pressure wound therapy (NPWT) to promote healing and enable healthy, new tissue to grow. Today, foot and ankle surgeons rarely do a skin graft without NPWT. Skin grafting for foot ulcers has also advanced. Surgeons now use advanced reconstructive surgery and grafting techniques to promote wound

healing and decrease wound recurrence.

The success rate of these advanced therapies is high, providing substantial improvement over treatments of the not-too-distant past, when doctors would clean and bandage the wound and hope for the best.

“Thanks to the many advances in diabetic foot

care, patients today are having simpler surgeries, avoiding amputations, and getting back to everyday life sooner than ever before,” says Dr. Steinberg.
