Spartanburg County, Spartan Race partner for Carolinas Ultra, Beast, and Sprint Race Weekend

Spartanburg is once again partnering with Spartan Race for the Carolinas Ultra, Beast and Spring Weekend on Nov. 23 and 24.

"As the host community for a third-straight year of Spartan Races, Spartanburg looks forward to welcoming thousands of ultra-athletes to our great selection of authentic dining and entertainment venues, modern hotels and spectacular outdoor recreation opportunities," said Chris Jennings, executive vice president of the Spartanburg Convention and Visitors Bureau.

This year the races will be hosted at the Tryon International Equestrian Center, just over the North Carolina border on Nov. 23 - 24. The race had previously been hosted on land at Milliken & Company's global headquarters, near the USC Upstate campus, however that land is no longer available.

The courses at the Tryon International Equestrian Center will be suited for beginners and elites alike. SCC President Henry C. Giles, Jr. receives S.C. Order of the Palmetto

For the past 56 years, Spartanburg Community College has been a driving force in Upstate economic and workforce development initiatives and in educating thousands of students of all ages and walks of life. SCC President Henry C. Giles, Jr., has been an integral part of that history, and today celebrates 50 years at the college. Although no longer in the classroom, Giles continues to make a difference in the lives of students, just as he did when first hired as a math instructor in 1969.

Giles' many contributions were recognized today at a celebration at the college's Downtown Campus where he was awarded the SC Order of the Palmetto on behalf of Governor Henry McMaster and received honors from the Spartanburg County Commission for Technical and Community Education. The SCC Foundation announced a new, privately funded scholarship established in Giles' honor.

SCC faculty and staff as well Giles' family gathered at the annual "all college meeting," which kicks off the new academic year and is an opportunity for reflection on past accomplishments and future successes. Giles shared a state-of-the-college address as did Dr. Tim Hardee, president of the SC Technical College System. Hardee shared the system's efforts to remain affordable, accessible and relevant to the approximately 175,000+ South Carolinians who are educated and trained through credit and continuing education programs at the 16 colleges across the state. In a surprise presentation

by Mike Forrester, SCC's vice president of economic development, on behalf of Gov. McMaster, Giles was awarded the Order of the Palmetto. "It is my pleasure to award you the Order of the Palmetto, South Carolina's highest civilian honor, in recognition of your exceptional dedication to the people of our state," wrote Gov. McMaster in a letter to Giles. "From your outstanding leadership of Spartanburg Community College to your extensive involvement in civic affairs, you have demonstrated an uncommon commitment to the highest standards in all you do. Your passion for educational and workforce development opportunities in the Upstate has helped strengthen our economy, resulting rewarding employment and brighter futures for individuals and families. You have made a positive impact throughout our state that will last for generations to come. We are fortunate to have you in South Carolina, and I thank you for all you have done to make the Palmetto State a special place to live, work, and learn."

Letters of support for the prestigious award also came from Spartanburg County Council, the Spartanburg County Legislative Delegation and Dr. Hardee.

I have known Henry and worked with Henry on many projects during my tenure on County Council in Spartanburg. Henry's entire career has been dedicated to helping people of all ages enjoy a better life through his work in education. Henry is dedicated, hardworking, humble, and embodies the true meaning of the Order of the Palmetto.

Dr. Hardee recognized Giles' leadership as reaching beyond the Spartanburg region to include all of SC. "Mr. Giles has been instrumental in developing a partnership between the Heritage Golf Foundation and the SC Technical College System. His leadership on the statewide partnership agreement led to a commitment of over \$400,000 from the Heritage Golf Foundation for the purpose of training mechatronics faculty members at all 16 technical college in SC."

Linda Hannon, chair of the SCC Foundation Board of Directors, presented Giles with a \$59,550 check, establishing the "President Henry C. Giles Jr., Scholarship," in honor of Giles' service to the college and his devotion to students. Private contributions from past Foundation board members and Commissioners funded the schol-

arship.

Before being named the sixth president of SCC, Giles served as interim president as well as vice president and executive vice president of business affairs for 18 years. He was responsible for the financial management of the College during the majority of his SCC tenure. Giles was instrumental in facilitating the purchase of the Evans Building in downtown Spartanburg, now the SCC Downtown Campus, as well as the creation and expansion of the SCC Spark Center, an invaluable economic development tool for Spartanburg County. He also held college positions as program manager, vice president for development and vice president for academic affairs. Giles brought a tenacious fiscal responsibility to all endeavors, which resulted in the College receiving favorable audits and maintaining balanced budgets over the years, thereby positioning the College today to serve more than 6,000 students across five campuses throughout the three-county service area. A native of Cowpens, Giles

earned a Bachelor's of Arts degree in mathematics at Wofford College and a master of arts in teaching degree in mathematics at Converse College. Mr. Giles continued his educational pursuit by completing graduate work in higher education administration from Nova University in Florida and in management from the University of South Caro-lina. He was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Education from the University of South Carolina Upstate and an Honorary Doctorate in Humanities from Wofford College. He has served as chair of the State Board for Technical and Comprehensive Education's Chief Business Officers Peer. Giles is also active in the local community, having served in leadership positions on boards and committees with the Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce, East Spartanburg Rotary Club, Spartanburg School District 7

School mornings don't have to be chaos

So what does the typical school morning look like in your house? Quiet conversation over a leisurely breakfast, everyone dressed and ready to depart on time, all their books, papers and lunch neatly packed and ready to go? No? Not quite? More like a minor riot with lots of stress? If so, it's time for a change.

There's no magic way to guarantee that the bedlam that marks those getting ready for school times in too many homes will totally disappear, but there are steps to take to help minimize the school-morning frustration, stress and anger.

You can start by not blaming the kids for all the problems. Make it clear that you're not happy with how you're acting (you know, that yelling and lecturing virtually every day). Tell them you want to change and you need their help in making it happen.

An important step is give the kids more responsibility. A kitchen timer, for example, is a great way to help young children finish that breakfast with time left to get dressed for school. For older kids, let them use an alarm clock, maybe on their phone, and have them agree to a "no-snooze-alarm" rule.

For both younger and older children there have to be consequences, discussed and agreed to ahead of time, if they don't stick to the time rules. They give up a favorite something if they slide back into the old ways. And you also need to set a consequence for yourself if you flip back into yelling and nagging to get them moving.

You can also make changes to move things along faster. No morning TV for starters and that cell phone can wait until after breakfast and getting dressed before it becomes the center of their lives.

Being more organized will also help. Have a designated place for backpacks and school books, and make sure they're in place before bedtime. School clothes get laid out the night before. Have a special in-box for school papers that need to be signed. If your child forgets to put the papers there after school, consequences should kick in.

There's no perfect cure to school morning craziness, but making the kids shoulder more of the responsibility, and giving them a system to help make things more organized, can not only make that morning rush more civilized, but can also provide skills that will help them throughout life.





Student from Greenville works with zoo animals in South Africa

Kate Stuart, a Furman University junior and Greenville resident, spent two weeks this summer in South Africa studying wildlife at Lory Park Zoo in Johannesburg, and through the experience, came closer to shaping her eventual vocation in the field of conservation.

She was part of a small group of volunteers selected to participate in a zoo medicine program through Loop Abroad, a study away organization that also operates in Thailand, Ecuador and Australia.

Working alongside conservationists and veterinarians at the accredited Lory Park Zoo, volunteers studied a variety of African animals, from lions and tigers to primates such as lemurs and gibbons, to understand how the animals' diets, enclosures and enrichments are designed to keep them physically and mentally healthy.

Stuart, a sociology major at Furman, originally planned to pursue a career in veterinary medicine, but through hands-on experiences in South Africa, her focus has shifted to conservation.

"I fell in love with the exotic flora and fauna of South Africa when I first went in 2017 following high school graduation," she said. "Since then, I've gone back two more times, and each year my passion for conservation deepens." Stuart's first trips to

South Africa took her to Limpopo province and Feracare Wildlife Centre, a facility mainly involved in the conservation of cheetahs, but which also houses

wildebeests, giraffes, sables, antelopes, appeared in the news for dent lion named Chaos. ostriches and smaller species.

It was at Feracare that Stuart's fondness for big cats developed, and when she heard about the zoo medicine program through Loop Abroad, she jumped at the chance.

"Because this specific program was held at a zoo, I was able to encounter even more species than I had been exposed to before. My time spent there gave me such a respect for accredited zoos and animal sanctuaries," said Stuart. "There certainlv are bad facilities out there that are not concerned for the well-being of the animals, but places like Lory Park and Feracare are the reason why so many species still survive."

The Lory Park Zoo is one of only six zoos in Africa accredited by the Pan-African Association of Zoos and Aquaria. Lory Park Zoo leads conservation efforts, such as research in black-footed cats and education pro-

impalas, kudus, blue grams in local schools, and providing radiation skin zebras, the zoo has recently cancer treatment for a resi-

"This is our tenth summer of providing engaging field courses around the globe, and we continue to be so impressed by our students and their eagerness to learn about the world around them and have a lasting, positive impact," Loop said Abroad Managing Director Jane Stine.

"By partnering with locally-run, leading conservation organizations, we help our students learn from the experts and understand the connection of conservation and culture, and we're always so proud to see what they go on to do after their study abroad experience."

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

Do not lose hope: 5th annual Walk/Remembrance event September 7th

Polk County's 5th annual Walk/Remembrance event -- in recognition of mental health and suicide prevention -- will be Saturday, Sept. 7, 5:30 - 8 p.m. at Tryon's Harmon Field. This growing and well attended public event includes a casual stroll opportunity to carry a candle in support of someone's suffering and struggling with mental health issues. First names are provided to emcee to call out. The dove release is at 6:30 p.m. Doves are freed by a collaborative effort of children honoring those who have lost their battles. potentials lost, and survivors left behind to recon-

Last year, more than 500 people attended and came from several states as far away as the Midwest. It will usher in National Suicide Prevention Awareness Week, Sept. 8-14, and World Suicide Prevention Day, Sept. 10.

This event was initially organized through joint efforts of Mary Wells Prioleau and Tamara Black who joined forces with a sense of urgency and grief. Prioleau reached out to Black in February 2015, following the suicide Black's brother, Mr. Jaheir Mr. Ford and Prioleau's daughter, Miss Caroline deRosset Wesley, were friends at Polk County High School. Miss Wesley had also died from suicide, October 2014. Miss Wesley had funds in her bank account that Prioleau wanted to spend in a manner honoring her. Prioleau and Black concluded that a wise investment would be an annual community focused event.

"Do Not Lose Hope" as the theme is particularly significant as Miss Wesley wrote these words moments before hanging herself. More than 1,000 Do Not Lose Hope T-shirts have now been given away, along with car decals and temporary tattoos with the same message.

The first year drew a crowd of approximately 100. Last year the event brought 500. Each year the event has grown tremen-

dously with incredible community support and sponsorship. Last year, as result of Polk Fit, Fresh and Friendly (PF3) deciding to be a non-profit host, Polk County Community Foundation secured 100 percent funding and is

again this year. The third year, resource vendors were added to educate and raise awareness of all factors involved. A discernible distinction between Miss Wesley and Mr. Ford is that Miss Wesley had a diagnosed mental illness whereas Mr. Ford appears to have experienced a mental health crisis. Prioleau said. "Understanding the difference between mental health issues and mental illness is critical in providing proper support to all affected, ending the stigmas and saving lives.

"The most amazing aspect of this event is the diversity among participants and attendees affirming that mental health issues know no boundaries," Prioleau said. "Race, religion, culture, gender, age, socio-economics: are all represented."

"Our goal is reaching the masses, ending stigma and making our best effort to ensure healthy, safe communities for our loved ones, neighbors and ourselves," she said. "This is not a 'them' issue. It's 'us' -- all of us."

This year, the event is solely funded by the Polk County Community Foundation. It is being organized by Polk Fit, Fresh and Friendly (PF3), a coalition of local agencies that promote health and wellness in Polk County. Prioleau is an at-large board member of PF3, serving as an appointee to the Polk County Mental Health Commission. "I really must thank the Foundation and PF3 for stepping up to make this happen," she

"The Polk County Community Foundation is constantly asking about the needs and wants of our community," the Foundation's President and CEO

Elizabeth Nager said.

"When one of our committees met with all of the counselors at Polk County Schools, we learned more about urgent needs in the area of mental health. As a result of that meeting, the Foundation provides fundfor additional resources identified by the school counselors to support their work and looks for other ways to fund mental health solutions in our community. Donors have contributed to the Unrestricted Fund at the Foundation to support the evolving needs and wants of our community such as the Walk/Remembrance event at Harmon Field. We appreciate all the volunteer hours and PF3's efforts to organize this needed event."

"PF3 considers mental health to be a major health concern for Polk County," the agency's Executive Director Haley Suskauer said. "It is our hope is that bringing the resources of the community together, we can continue to shine a light on this problem. We share in Mary's passion to openly understand mental health, mental illness, and suicide: and to end fear. judgement, and discrimination. This annual coming-together shows we are not alone. More importantly, it shows that people who have these issues are not alone either. We are

here to help." Using the 2018 Polk County Community Health Assessment identifies mental health as the #1 priority, Prioleau said. The statistics show 284 people served by an area mental health program; 13.7 percent of Polk adults self reported having greater than seven days of poor mental health in the past month, with 5.2 percent of those not having received care. Polk County had 18 deaths related to unintentional poisoning between 2009 and 2013. In Polk County, 8.1 percent of the adults indicated they are dissatisfied with life.

The Walk/Remembrance will start at 5:30 p.m. at Harmon Field, and attendees will be greeted with free food being cooked by

high school athletes, free

T-shirts, and various community agencies that will have information tables. Also, children's games will be on-going, Polk County School Superintendent Aaron Greene will be the event's emcee for the fifth year, providing a special selection of inspirational music will play as people walk around the track in remembrance of a lost loved-one. Attendees can give the first name of a suicide victim to Greene. who will announce the names to the public. Photographs of victims can also be posted and shared on a special wall. Attendees may speak publicly and share in their experience. At 6:30 p.m., live doves will be released, as they are a symbol of hope.

"I believe strongly in raising awareness and promoting discussion on the mental health issues that confront so many of our young people and commu-

nity members of all ages," Greene said. Walk/Remembrance allows us to honor loved ones who lost their battles and to lean on each other as we search for answers and solutions. Perhaps just as important, it helps create productive dialogue around the issue and removes the stigma that prevents many people from bringing these issues to light. Sadly it affects all of us. I have lost students. family members, and friends in the community. Many people deal with depression and anxiety daily as the hope for a better existence. So doesn't it make sense for us to get together and remind everyone we can that we are here for them and not to lose hope. I have great respect for Mary Prioleau, Tamara Black, and all the folks who work so hard to make this event special. I feel fortunate to be a small

"It is very moving and inspiring event on many different levels," Prioleau said. "I've seen people in wheelchairs make a lap around the track. They carry candles and comfort each other. We hear the names being called out; see pictures; we hear music that has special meaning. There's a lot of sharing. 14. Mr. Jackson failed to pay the taxes assessed against the Property by Spartanburg County for 2004, and the property was levied by distress and sold to the Spartanburg County Forfeited Land Commission in satisfaction of the delinquent taxes on November 7, 2005.



Tips for parents to help teens make the most of doctor's visits

(StatePoint) The transition from childhood to adolescence is a complex time for kids, but it's also a complex time for you, and you may find yourself unsure how to give your children more independence and when to stay involved. But when it comes to doctor's visits, medical experts emphasize the importance of empowering teens to talk to their doctors one-on-one.

"During routine doctor visits, it's important for adolescents to feel comfortable discussing their health care needs with their physicians," says Dr. Maria Trent, chair of the American Academy of Pediatrics Section on Adolescent Health. "Often, it is only during confidential, one-on-one conversations that teens are able to

When teens and young adults aren't sure if what they tell their doctors is confidential, they are less willing to discuss sensitive topics or may skip care altogether, suggests research published in the Journal of Adolescent Health. This is especially true for adolescents who report engaging in risky behaviors or report experiencing psychological distress, meaning those who need care the most may not be seeking it from their doctors.

You, your teens and their doctors should work together to ensure that confidential, one-on-one care is a part of every visit.

In an effort to increase the number of adolescents and



young adults receiving preventive services, and to help you support your teen's journey towards independence and responsibility, here are some tips developed by the Adolescent Health Consortium, a collaborative effort between the American Academy of Pediatrics, American Academy of Family Physicians, the Society for Adolescent

the American Congress of Obstetricians and Gynecologists:

• Understand the benefits one-on-one between adolescents and doctors and make it a priority. Confidential care is good for teens' health. If one-on-one time isn't offered or encouraged during the visit, consider volunteering to leave the room.

one-on-one time with their doctors by explaining its purpose and benefits, and encouraging them to come to the visit with a list of questions to have answered. Let teens know that it's their bodies, their health, and their life, and that they should feel empowered to get the information they need. Explain how patient confidentiality works, so teens feel comfortable addressing any health concerns they have.

• Prepare your teen for


· Talk to teens about healthy relationships, positive choices, social media, as well as potentially sensitive topics, such as substance use and sexually transmitted infection pre-

and sexual orientation and more. Regular communication at home can lead to greater trust and a bigger chance that teens will open up about health concerns.
